



"WE ARE GOING TO BUILD A PARISH HOUSE . . "

In May 1946, when many of us read these words on a mimeograph letter sent out by the Rector of this Parish, many of us knew it had to be a "Journey in Faith." Then there were only 44 members of Trinity Parish. We had only \$1,500.00 in a building fund. Yet we all knew that a Parish House was necessary if this Parish was to grow and take its rightful place in the community as a center of Christian life and work.

In April 1946, the Vestry of Trinity Parish authorized the Rector to appoint a building committee. At a congregational meeting on May 15, 1946, the Parish gave to this committee the power to solicit funds for this project and begin securing plans for the building. This committee, whose members pictures appear elsewhere in this program, have been the guiding force to prove to us all that a 'journey in faith' is not without its reward.

In 1946 over \$12,000.00 was raised on this project. In 1947 \$8,000.00 more was added to this amount. Since January 1st the final amount, including a gift of \$1,000.00 from the American Church Building Fund has been secured. Tonight therefore this building is being dedicated free of debt and all incumbrances.


This building without furnishings, represents an investment of \$22,000.00. Of this amount \$10,500.00 has come from non-Episcopal sources, most of it from the citizens and Business Houses of Lumberton. The Diocese and General Church have given \$2,500.00 and the Parish, which now numbers 101 baptized members has raised \$8,000.00. The actual construction has been done by the Southeastern Construction Co., Lumberton Branch, of which Mr. J. L. Jones is Superintendent. This building was started on October 27, 1947 and is tonight being turned over to the Vestry by the Building Committee to become a part of the real property of Trinity Parish.

It is the hope of the Building Committee and the Vestry that this building will become not only a center of Parish Life, but a center too of Community Life. It has truly been built, to increase the Christian life of this Parish and Community.

"THIRTY-THREE YEARS"

This Parish House, which we dedicate tonight, has become a reality only because thirty-three years ago, on March 28, 1915, Trinity Episcopal Church was consecrated. It was on June 12, 1912, that the Rt. Rev. Robert Strange, 2nd Bishop of East Carolina, met with nine men and women, six of whom were Episcopalians, to organize in Lumberton an Episcopal Church. At that meeting the Bishop appointed the first officers of the Church, to be known hereafter as Trinity Church. These men, Messrs. E. L. Holloway, R. H. Crichton, and J. Q. Beckwith, along with Archdeacon Thomas P. Noe and the Rev. J. L. Moody, the first Priest-in-charge of this Mission were directly responsible for the building of the Church in which we worship tonight.

While it has taken this Parish two years to complete the Parish House, it took that original group three years to build the Church. In those three years they raised what then was the enormous sum of \$2,992.59. Of this amount they spent \$1,230.40 for the purchase of this lot and \$1,669.63 for the erection of the Church building. The citizens of Lumberton were just as generous in those years as they have been now toward the Parish House for they gave \$549.27 for the building of this Church. Trinity Church was consecrated by the Rt. Rev. Thomas C. Darst, being the first church that Bishop Darst had the privilege of consecrating after he became Bishop of this Diocese.

From those humble beginnings, the life of this Parish has followed closely the progressive spirit to be found in the City of Lumberton. In 1938 it was admitted into the Diocesan Convention as a self-supporting Parish. In 1946 it was able to call its first full time Rector. Tonight we must give thanks that the past has brought us so much, which the present and future can use.

In building this Parish House, the Vestry and Congregation have not been unmindful of the needs of the Church. When this building program is completed within the next few weeks over \$2000.00 will have been spent on the Church itself. Is there any wonder that we pause tonight to give thanks for the Church which has made all our effort possible. Trinity Parish has only begun to serve this congregation and this community.
