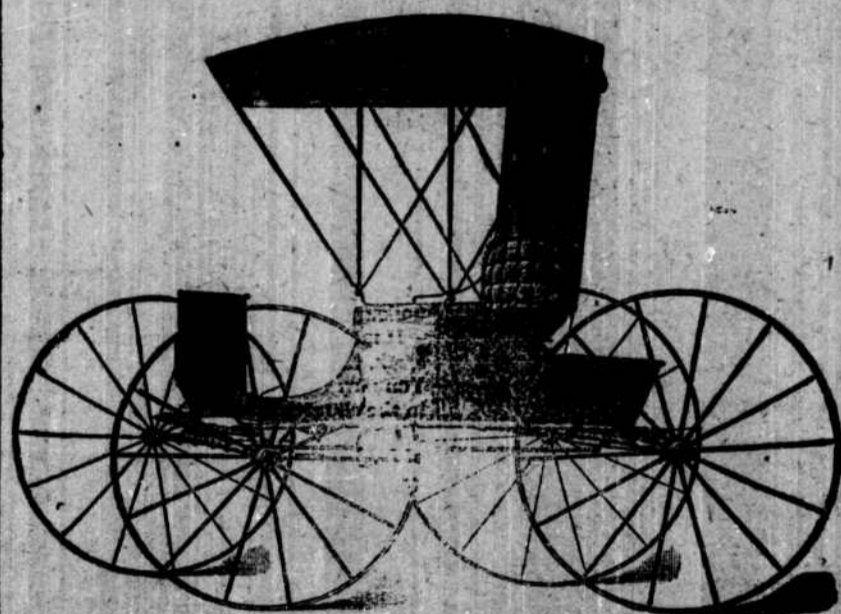

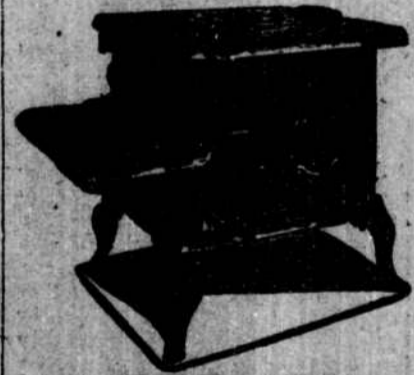

STATE NEWS.

Happenings Here and There as Gathered From our Exchanges.

Only two of the wounded from the great wreck remain with us—Mrs. Moore and Mr. Sink, both of whom are improving gradually and may be able to leave next week.

Durham Star: A gentleman from the edge of Granville, in town Saturday, informs us that several barns of tobacco were lost by fire last week. A Mr. Coley, at Green's station, and J. L. Parrish, at Lyon's, were among the ones who sustained losses. Our informant could not tell the extent of these fires in amounts lost.

Washington Gazette: There is a cask in the store of S. R. Fowle & Son, which is used to retail molasses from. It has been in use constantly for forty years to the knowledge of the present senior member of the firm, and how long prior to that time he does not know. Mr. Fowle estimates there has been \$90,000 worth of molasses retailed from the cask.

Raleigh Chronicle: Yesterday Governor Holt paid \$400, which was offered in 1882 by Gov. Jarvis as a reward for the capture of Thomas and Wm. Whitson, who were guilty of murder committed in Mitchell county. They were captured, one in Kentucky and the other in Virginia, by Penland and Hymans, to whom the reward was paid. A life-size portrait of Professor Chas. D. McVey, president State Normal and Industrial School, has just been placed on the walls in the Teachers' Assembly building at Morehead.

Statesville Landmark: Mr. R. E. Johnson, one of the wounded of the wreck, left here, Wednesday evening of last week, as noted in the last Landmark, for his home in Randolph county. As he passed through Asheboro Thursday evening he found Mr. W. A. Elliott, of Hickory, who escaped uninjured from the wreck, getting married there, and stopped to attend the marriage. After it was over the groom told Mr. Johnson, in strict confidence, that he was "scarier" during the ordeal he had just passed through than he was when he found out that the train was going down.

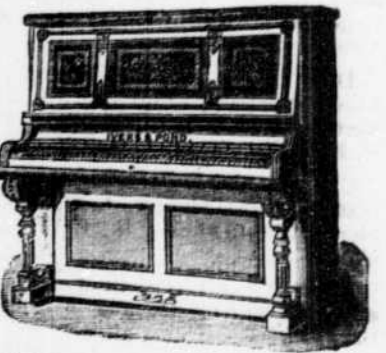
