MONEY IN HORSES AND MULES.

A Suggestion to the Farmers of the Southern States.

Why don't the farmers of the South raise their own horses and mules, instead of paying \$30,000, 000 or more annually to other States for them? The department of Agriculture sets forth in a circular issued to-day some reasons why every Southern farmer should breed his own farm animals.

The idea is not only that the South should supply its own demand for animals, but that Southern farmers should feed as far as possible the enormous amount of cotton seed meal and cake which is now shipped out, and keep up fertility with barnyard manure.
