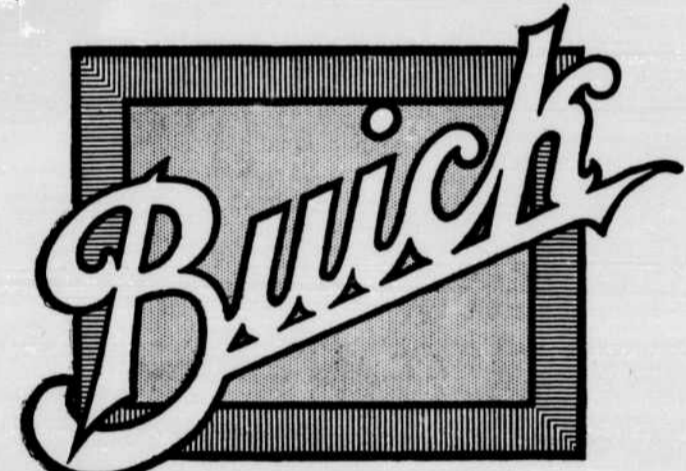

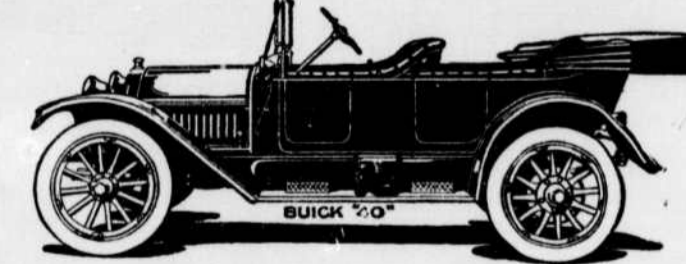

TRIAL IN HEADLESS WOMAN MYSTERY
Providence, R. I., Nov. 9.—The case of Henry Deslovers, who is charged with the murder of the woman whose headless body was found in the Blackstone river last June, will come up for trial in the superior court here Monday. The victim of the murder is supposed to have been Angelo Delmarie, but the failure to find the missing head has prevented positive identification. The Delmarie woman disappeared shortly before the discovery of the body and witnesses testified that she had last been seen walking towards the river with Deslovers, with whom she lived. Both the man and woman were Franco-Belgians and were employed in the mills at Woonsocket, R. I.

JACK JOHNSON IS LOCKED UP IN CELL
White Prisoners Would Not Have Him
CASH BAIL NOT ACCEPTED

Black Pugilist Is Held As Result Of Federal Jury Investigation. Broke The "White Slave" Law
CHICAGO, Nov. 9.—Jack Johnson's first night in the Cook county jail netted him six hours sleep.

When he awoke six hours afterward, he declared that he had passed a restless night. He was eager for a sight of the newspapers and bought a copy of every one available.

Disorder among the white prisoners in the county jail when they learned that Johnson had not been locked up in the negro section of cells, became so great the turnkey took Johnson to the jail hospital until a cell could be cleaned out in the negro section.

Johnson was much annoyed by the epithets shouted at him by other prisoners and by the necessity of being locked up with members of his race.

Attorney for Johnson failed today to issue out a writ of habeas corpus before United States District Judge George Carpenter and the negro remained in the county jail.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Nov. 9.—An administrator's report of the estate of J. K. Zimmerman, a cattleman of Waco, Texas, who died in Excelsior Springs, Mo., October 6, filed in the probate court here today values the estate at \$1,140,245.

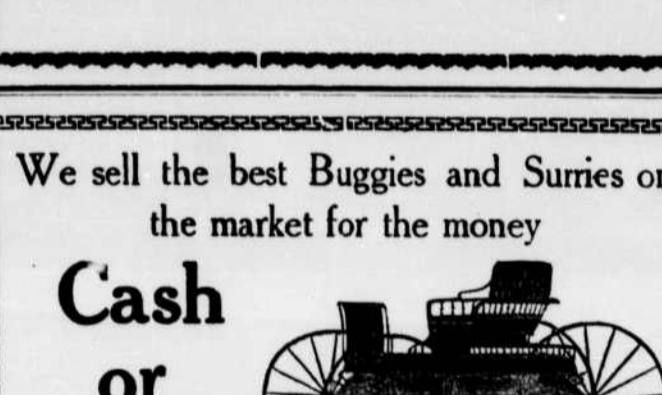
