The Government is sending canoes to the Philippines. Seriously, we object to this. It is all right to shoot the Philippines, of course, but to poison them by letting them capture the canoes, that is a little too Spanish to suit us.

The Goldsboro correspondent of the Raleigh Post reports a white hen. He says the hen has a brood of young chickens, one among the number being black. The mother has refused to hover or scratch for the black number of her family, and will not permit it to enjoy the company of the balance of the brood.

While under the influence of whiskey, Montcalm Small was shot by Robert Sutherland and it is thought the wound will be fatal. This occurred at Morganton. Both men were under the influence of whiskey, and it is said both of them had always been the closest of friends. This is but one of the examples of what whiskey will do for men.

The Democratic candidates are making powerful speeches in the trust part of the State and are being heard by a great crowd. The arguments Aycock is making for the amendment is so logical and convincing as to be simply unanswerable. In reply to a charge made by a Republican at one appointment that the Democrats would disfranchise white men, Aycock captivated the crowd by proving that the Republican party was the only party that had ever disfranchised whitemen. He showed that in 1868 it had prevented white men from voting, but allowed negroes in a three days election to vote on the question of whether they should live. Thereafter white men lived in Pitt county who were prevented from voting just as Mr. Aycock said.

The REFLECTOR is feeling very much elated. For years and years we have been talking hotel and cotton factory for Greenville, and after much patient waiting, and more wondering why the people were not awakened to their interest, the prospect is that both are to be realities in the near future. Thursday we were permitted to announce that Mr. B. F. WASHINGTON LETTER

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 27, 1900. There is little doubt of the liability of Mr. McKinley and Secretary Root to impeachment for their open violation of law in paying two salaries to favored army officers in Cuba, and they would be likely to get it if Congress had a democratic majority.

Admiral Dewey will not make a statement of his attitude toward important public questions, unless he changes his mind, but will ask the Kansas City convention to endorse his record. That shows how the Senators and Representatives from that State have united in an effort to keep his job for him, despite the fact that the Washington schools are far behind others of the same grade in other parts of the country.

The Treasury Department has decided that Porto Rico is not a foreign country and that drawback of duties cannot be allowed on articles sent there. In the same decision, it holds that drawback will be allowed on exports to Cuba and the Philippines. This is certainly bewildering. What is the difference in status between Porto Rico and the Philippines? Both were acquired under the identical treaty provisions.

The white supremacy sentiment seems to be growing, not only among folks but also among fowls and animals. A few days ago a published about the Wayne county hen that refused to recognize a black chick in her brood. And now the Oxford Ledger tells of a Greenville county ewe that dropped three lambs, one of them being black, and the mother ewe would not have anything to do with that black sheep.

The most disastrous fire that has been recorded anywhere since the great conflagration of Chicago, last fall, occurred in Hull and Ottawa, Canada. The two cities are situated against each other on opposite sides of the river. The fire started in Hull, swept clear through the city, crossed the river and continued its destructive wake through Ottawa. Five miles of territory were burned over and the loss being estimated at \$200,000,000. Thousands and thousands of people were left homeless and penniless.

A physician in Scott county, Kansas, recently moved to another part of the State because he could not make both ends meet in his practice; but his services were so badly needed in the old field that the citizens circulated a petition asking the County Commissioners to appropriate a bonus of \$500 annually to the doctor on condition that he should return. The Commissioners made the appropriation and the doctor has gone back to his former home.

In Kentucky, where there is a law to compel railway companies to couple separate cars for white and colored people, a negro woman has brought suit against a railway company for permitting white men to ride in the coaches set apart for colored people. The white persons referred to, however, were drunk whiskey in the vehicle in which she rode, and the conductor and other employees of the company ignored her protests. Her feelings were outraged to the extent of \$10,000.

The fathers of more than three children are hereafter to be given preference in the selection of town officers in Givet, in the Ardennes, and married men will rank above bachelors as candidates. Prizes of \$5 are to be awarded yearly to those parents who shall have sent the largest number of children to school regularly, and scholarships in the national schools will be reserved only for families of more than three children. Fathers of families are also to have the preference for admission to almshouses and old people's homes.

Read Better Than Heels

On last Friday night there was a debate at Vanderbilt University at Nashville, Tennessee, between two students of that institution and two students of the University of North Carolina, and the latter were the victors.

Within the past three years there have been five debates between the students of our University and of the Universities in other States, and our "Tarheel" boys were the victors in four. This should be very gratifying to every North Carolinian, as it certainly is to us very creditable to our University. We feel much more elated and gratified at these intellectual and literary victories of our boys than at their victories in games of base ball and football.—Chatham Record.

The Candidates at Marion. Marion, N. C., Apr. 25.—This was a great day for McDowell Democracy. Up to last night it had been raining for about two weeks, but the weather today was perfect. The crowd began coming in early this morning and by 11 o'clock Main street looked like it does on census days. The Morgan-Lenoir brass bands played patriotic music between speeches. The crowd was enthusiastic and estimated at fully one thousand. Many believe this is the strongest Democratic ticket ever put up. Lacey started the ball rolling today by making a wise short speech. He was followed by Grimes, Dixon and Gilmer with short speeches. The speech of the day was made by Aycock. He made one of the best ever heard in Marion and held the attention of the entire crowd throughout the two hours he spoke. He won many votes for the amendment. This county will give an increased majority for the ticket and amendment.

A Negro's Bad Threat.

He said a few days ago that "before the election was over there would be more shooting here than there was in hell." What Defeat Means.

In the contest now waging in North Carolina says the Wilmington Messenger for and against the democratic suffrage amendment to be voted upon next August, there is much at stake in behalf of the continued prosperity and welfare generally and peace of North Carolina—so much connected directly with the supremacy of the white race—so much involved as to good and honest and equitable government that there must be iteration and reiteration of the question in its several phases and bearings. The chairman of the democratic State committee is doing his work with marked spirit, intelligence, resource and determination. His hands should be upheld by every true man who is genuinely while man with a white man's self-respect, pride of race and principles. It is to be hoped this class in all parties will rally to the amendment and carry it by a great majority. Let the unhealthy, disturbing contest as to race supremacy cease. It is not written in the book of fate that the white race shall ever be dominated and bossed by an inferior race, whether red, yellow or black.—Oxford Ledger.

THE AMENDMENT.

The following is the amendment to article 6 of the State constitution adopted by the General Assembly of 1899, and to be submitted to the voters for ratification next August:

Section 1. That article VI of the constitution of North Carolina be and the same is hereby amended in and in lieu thereof shall be substituted the following article of said constitution:

ARTICLE VI.

SUFFRAGE AND ELIGIBILITY TO OFFICE—QUALIFICATIONS OF AN ELECTOR.

Section 1. Every male person born in the United States, and every male person who has been naturalized, twenty-one years of age, and possessing the qualifications set out in this article, shall be entitled to vote at any election by the people in the State, except as herein otherwise provided.

Sec. 2. He shall have resided in the State of North Carolina for two years, in the county six months, and in the precinct, ward or other election district in which he offers to vote, four months next preceding the election; Provided, That removal from one precinct, ward or other election district to another in the same county, shall not operate to deprive any person of the right to vote in the precinct, ward or other election district from which he has removed, until four months after such removal.

No person who has been convicted, or who has confessed his guilt in connection with any crime the punishment of which is, or may hereafter be, imprisonment in the State prison, shall be permitted to vote, unless the said person shall be first restored to citizenship in the manner prescribed by law.

Sec. 3. Every person offering to vote shall be at the time a legally registered voter as herein prescribed, and in the manner hereinafter provided by law, and the General Assembly of North Carolina shall enact general registration laws to carry into effect the provisions of this article.

Sec. 4. Every person presenting himself for registration shall be able to read and write any section of the constitution in the English language; and, before he shall be entitled to vote, have paid on or before the first day of March of the year in which he proposes to vote, his poll tax as prescribed by law, for the previous year. Poll taxes shall be a lien only on assessed property, and no process shall issue to enforce the collection of the same except against assessed property.

Sec. 5. No male person who was, on January 1, 1867, or at any time prior thereto, entitled to vote under the laws of any State in the United States wherein he then resided, and no lineal descendant of any such person, shall be denied the right to register and vote at any election in this State by reason of his failure to possess the educational qualifications prescribed in section 4 of this article. Provided, he shall have been registered in accordance with the terms of this section prior to December 1, 1908. The General Assembly shall provide for a permanent record of all persons who register under this section on or before November 1, 1908, and all such persons shall be entitled to register and vote at all elections by the people in this State, unless disqualified under section 2 of this article. Provided, such persons shall have paid their poll tax as required by law.

Sec. 6. All elections by the people shall be by ballot, and all elections by the General Assembly shall be viva voce.

Sec. 7. Every voter in North Carolina, except as in this article disqualified, shall be eligible to office, but before entering upon the duties of the office he shall take and subscribe the following oath:—"I,....., do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and maintain the constitution and laws of the United States, and the constitution and laws of North Carolina not inconsistent therewith, and that I will faithfully discharge the duties of my office as....."

Sec. 8. The following classes of persons shall be disqualified to office: First, all persons who shall deny the being of Almighty God

Second, all persons who shall have been convicted or confessed their guilt on indictment pending, and whether sentenced or not, under judgment suspended, of any treason or felony, or any other crime for which the punishment may be imprisonment in the penitentiary, since becoming citizens of the United States, or corruption and malpractice in office, unless such person shall be restored to the rights of citizenship in a manner prescribed by law.

Sec. 9. This act shall be in force from and after its ratification.
