OUR RALEIGH LETTER

An Appeal in Behalf of the Blind For Insane and Unfortunate.

RALEIGH, N. C., Dec. 3, 1900

Perhaps no "policy" followed by any political party has caused more suffering and heartaches than niggardliness of the dominant element in our legislatures for the past several years—politely except by them "economy"—in dealing with our charitable institutions.

No matter how closely the committees have pared down the appropriation bills, there has always been some close shod, sluggy, ungenerally smart Alick who will sink up his jack in the box head and yell "economy," and ask for a further reduction. And this when the jails of scores of counties in both the east and west hold the blank minds and tortured bodies (in chains) of God's own people—children of the State of North Carolina who have a right to be properly cared for in one or the other of our hospitals for the insane (and probably cured there), but who are confined to a fate worse than death because there isn't room, or, if there is room the appropriation has been made so small that they cannot be clothed and fed there. It is outrageous, it is inhuman!

I see from the reports that more than 60 per cent. of the patients who are sent to Dr. George L. Kirby, superintendent of the hospital for the insane at Raleigh, are cured. At Dr. Murphy's hospital in Morganton, about 50 per cent. are cured, as I believe. And there are hundreds of poor unfortunate every year who are denied this one chance of their lives to be restored to their right minds, but instead are bound with chains, many of them, and thrown into the common county jails—manacles for life, then, of course.

Others are hurt by their families at home as best they can—always a source of heartaches, and in most cases there—the one place in every case denied the skill of these splendid specialists who might cure most of them, under proper conditions, in a few months.

And now I see it announced by the principal of the Asylum for the Blind here that, although there are ample accommodations now for all who would come, so far as room is concerned, he has been forced to deny applications—cannot give notice that no more poor blind children can come there—the one place in North Carolina where they can secure an education—because the appropriation is so small that no more can be supported. And the sorrow remain vacant and the sightless orbs of these poor children are lifted towards Heaven with the mute inquiry upon their voiceless lips:

"Why, oh Lord, do our own flesh and blood treat us thus?"

Aye, why? Ask the little soul-shattered man-child who objected to an adequate appropriation for the weary time servers whom he searched out of the manliness they should have exhibited when the vote to cut down the appropriation was taken.

In Heaven's name (and I say it reverently), gentlemen of the General Assembly of 1901, do not follow in the disgraceful example set you by the last several legislatures.

Come out in the broad open of humanity and charity, and be just to yourselves and to your State while you meet out the common, even-handed justice which these stricken and dependent wards of our State ask at your hands, and have a right to demand.

Vote to the asylums for the insane at Raleigh and Morganton and Goldsboro and to those for the blind at Raleigh and the deaf-mutes at Morganton sufficient funds to operate them so as not to impair their usefulness, and thus remove this ignominious and disgraceful blot from the fair face of our prosperous and humane commonwealth.

The Board of County Commissioners began the new fiscal year on the first Monday in this month. The usual paper orders were issued and claims for general county purposes were allowed.

At 12 o'clock the new Board with the exception of C. J. Tucker who was absent, qualified and R. L. Davis was elected chairman.

T. R. Moore, Register of Deeds elected, presented his official bond with S. T. White, W. F. Hart, W. E. Proctor, R. A. Tyson and Chas. Cobb as sureties, which was accepted and the oath of office administered.

The former bonds of D. C. Moore, Clerk Superior Court, were examined and deemed amply sufficient.

O. W. Harrington, Sheriff elected, tendered his official bonds with J. O. Proctor, W. E. Proctor, B. F. Patrick, J. A. K. Tucker, J. B. Galloway, W. G. Mizelle, G. T. Tyson, G. M. Tucker, G. M. The Christmas present problem will be the paramount issue for the next few weeks.

Mr. H. B. Varner, editor of the Lexington Dispatch, and who in August was elected Commissioner of Labor and printing for the State, will be married on the 20th to Miss Anna Constock, of Lexington.

The Sultan is to pay up through the purchase of a cruiser and the United States has professed itself satisfied. It may be pointed out, by the way, that payment could have been had months ago by this means, but was refused and the very idea of its acceptance was ridiculed. But that was before the election.

One of the worst bills of its kind ever proposed is now pending in Congress. By its provisions all veterans, whether disabled or not, are to have preference for appointment and promotion in the government service. If the bill passes, it will mean that the entire government service will be put into the hands of the veterans to the exclusion of all civilians.

American girls are beginning to marry foreigners should look very carefully into the laws. In most European countries it is a felony to marry a foreigner without having her marriage declared void by the courts of the country. In France, for instance, a marriage is void without the written consent of the parents of the groom.

Dr. Chas. D. Melver, President of the State Normal and Industrial College at Greensboro, has conceived a plan by which he hopes to raise a fund of \$100,000 as an endowment for the institution. He hopes to find 1,000 persons in the State who will give \$100 each for this purpose. When the fund is secured it will be invested and the interest derived from it used to aid young women who are not able to pay their way through the college. It is an undertaking that ought to succeed.

Now good people, let your interest in the welfare of Greenville assert itself. The Board of Aldermen have called a special meeting in the Court House on Friday night, 13th, to consider the matter of preparing a bill to present the coming Legislature asking that Greenville be allowed to hold an election on the question of holding bonds for the construction of electric lights, water works, better streets and sewerage. The Board requests that all citizens interested in the matter be present at the meeting Thursday night. This request ought to bring every man to town to the meeting, for there is no one but should be interested in seeing the business interests prospered. Greenville is depending on the outcome of this election, and if it is time we were getting out of town. These matters under consideration are urgent needs of the town, and the sooner they are granted the better for the town.

WASHINGTON LETTER.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 7th.

The Republican leaders in Congress are on their knees to the brewers, begging to be let off with a small reduction in the tax on beer instead of the entire war tax as demanded by the brewers. All this has been brought about in a week. A week ago the republican members of the Ways and Means committee refused to even consider a reduction in the beer tax. Since then Representative Babcock, who was chairman of the Republican Congressional Committee and knew all about campaign contributions and promises, has succeeded in getting a member of the Ways and Means Committee, and has had the republican members thereof a few things, as Mr. Hanna has also done. Now it is no longer a question of whether there will be a reduction of the beer tax, but of how small a reduction the brewers can be ejected into accepting. The bill as reported from the Ways and Means Committee makes a reduction of 10 cents a barrel in the beer tax, but it is not yet certain that the brewers will accept that.

While the democratic caucus on the Army bill, which was not held, did not agree upon any party policy in opposing the bill, the democrats who spoke against the bill in the limited time allowed them were practically unanimous in objecting to the imperial powers given the President, of increasing the regular army from 58,000, the minimum number provided by the bill, to 100,000 men whenever so disposed and of retaining it at the highest figures as long as he wanted to. The democrats agreed that it was more power than Congress ever possessed in the hands of any man.

Meeting of Board of Aldermen.

The Board of Aldermen met in regular monthly session Thursday night, six of the members being present. The several standing committees made their monthly report.

A special committee consisting of Aldermen J. B. White, J. N. Hart and B. F. Patrick was appointed to have settlement with Alderman O. E. Warren, Cemetery Committee, for funds received by him from sale of lots in cemetery.

A motion to reduce the license tax on tobacco pipeholders from \$5 to \$2.50 per year was lost.

Dr. C. J. O'Hagan appeared before the Board with a letter from Dr. Richard H. Lewis, Secretary of the State Board of Health, requesting that vital statistics of the town be furnished him.

The Clerk was instructed to write the Secretary for such blanks as are necessary to make the reports and distribute them among the physicians of the town and request them to hand in statistics monthly.

The Tax Collector and Policemen made their reports for the past month showing amount of collections.

A special meeting of the Board was called for Thursday night, 13th of the month, to consider the matter of preparing a bill to go to the next Legislature to authorize Greenville to hold an election on the question of issuing bonds for the construction of electric lights, water works, sewerage, etc. All citizens of the town are requested to attend this meeting and confer with the Board on the matter.

The town attorneys were instructed to prepare an answer to the complaint filed in the suit brought against the town by the Board of County School Directors for fines collected by the town.

S. M. Daniel was allowed to list taxes for 1900.

A restaurant license was granted to Austin Hanrahan, in tobacco town.

Accounts were allowed and orders issued amounting to \$695.80.
