Great Light For Diamond Shoals.

Washington, Nov. 9 .- An ex. eriment of great interest to the lighthouse system of the world is to be made on the Diamond Shoals lightship, off the North Carolina coast, next month, through which he officers of the lighthouse board expect to project a great 13 inch beam of light from the sea to the sky and visible to mariners from 30 to 40 miles. The cluster of white electric lights now shown from the masts of the ship can be seen but 13 miles, and it is proposed that shipping passing Hatteras may be able to pick up the light ship three times this distance by light appratus arranged between the two stationary masthead lights now displayed. The apparatus now being fitted to the Diamond

Shoals light vessel will project powerful light straight toward the sky and the rolling of the ship in the rough waters off Hatteras will play it about wig wag fashion. Some system of wireless telegraphy will be applied to the Diamond Shoals and Nantucket Shoals lightships.
