North Carolina Goes Democratic by 65,000 Majority.

REPUBLICAN CONGRESS IS ELECTED.

North Carolina Sends Solid Democratic Delegation to Washington.

Odell's Majority Estimated at 70,000—Close Contest in the Ninth District of Virginia—Pennypacker Elected Governor of Pennsylvania by Republicans.
