

A KENNEL FOR YOUR DOG. Any Boy Who is Handy With Tools Can Make One in Half a Day. There are undoubtedly any number of boys who have a dog, but no kennel to keep him in. Almost any kind of kennel, people think, will do for a dog, so long as it affords him a place to sleep in and protection from the rain and cold. If he gets a big dry goods box with a hole in one end large enough for him to go through he is better off than the average of his race, but a kennel made especially for his use is much better, and it can easily There are undoubtedly any number

use is much better, and it can easily be made in half a day. Its size will depend, of course, on the size of your dog, but for a canine of medium size a box 36 inches long. 29 inches wide and 32 inches high from the ground to the roof peak will give ample room. If it is made larger or smaller, the same relative proportions should be maintained.


