

DEEP SEA WATER.

At one Thousand Pathems its Pressure is a Ton to the Years Inch. When marine life began to command notice, the question of the depth to which life could extend divided scientific thought into warring camps. About 1840, it was generally believed that the bathymetrica limit was about 300 fathous, and some strange dieas were current as to the physical condition of water when under a pressure such as adepth of two miles would produce. It was thought that sicletons of drowned men, or even heavy cannon and the "wedges of gold" that popular imaginal levels, beneath which is water so compressed as to be impenetrable. In fact, water is a simost incovapressible, and the weight of a cubic inc hof it at the depth of a mile is very little more than at the surface, but it was assumed that no living being could survive a pressure which at 1,000 fathoms is about a ton to the square inch.

We ourselves live under a pressure of about 15 pounds per inch, and are unawar or it.
