According to the latest report of the Tax Department of Greater New York, the original total assessment of real and personal property has shrunk from over eleven billions of dollars to less than three and one half billions. The enormous reduction is in the 1 consonal estate, which has been reduced on the assessment rolls from over 88,000,000 by judicious "swearing off." Less than one per cent. of real estate valuations were deducted on hearings by the Tax Commissioners, and it is upon this class of property that the burden of taxation will chiefly and necessarily fall. Personal property has wings, and flies away when the taxgatherer appears.—Philadelphia Record.
