How much worse was the treatment of the Cubans by Spain than the treatment of the Boers by England, or to come nearer, than the treatment of the Filipinos by America.

Every victory of the Filipinos over the Spanish was joyfully hailed by us as a victory of patriots fighting for liberty. The Filipino claim to the right of self-government is just as strong and valid now as when we recognized it then.

The Pennsylvania League of the Republic Clubs has declared against the civil service reform law, though the way the law is administered under this administration it hardly amounts to enough to be worth denouncing.

Every American interest would have been satisfied by the gaining of a naval station in the Philippines and the opening of Manila to trade. It was President McKinley that insisted on continuing the war with Spain unless she sold us her island title to the whole of the Vanished.

Deplorable as may be the crushing of the Transvaal Republic by the British Empire, how much more shameful and unpardonable is our establishment of a military despotism in the Philippines by this Republic, which until now stood before the world for liberty, self government and the rights of man.

The discussion that is becoming so prominent as to who shall be the next Senator from North Carolina as the successor of Marion Butler, is entirely out of place. It is a question that should not have been mentioned at all until after the constitutional amendment is carried next August, an effort had been deferred until after the general election in November of next year, so much the better. The question ought to be dropped and not carried any further at present.

Mr. R. B. Cotton, of this county, himself a practical farmer and a member of the Board of Directors of the State prison, recently made a tour of inspection of the several State farms and made a report of his investigations at the meeting of the Board in Raleigh last Tuesday. His report made excellent reading, and showed the exact condition of things at each farm. It also showed in a number of particulars that there might be improvement in the work and management of the farms and that the convicts might be better clothed and cared for.
