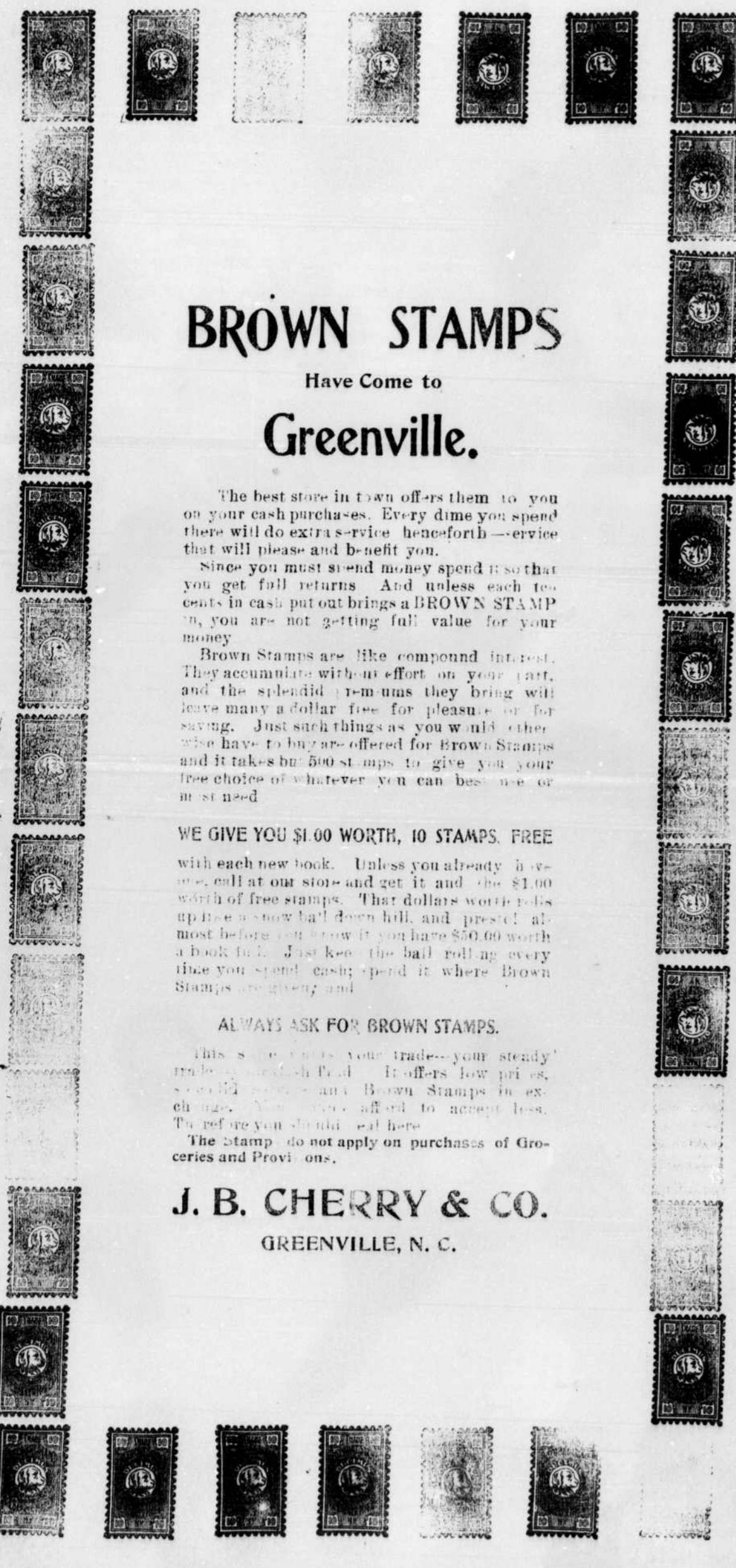

Woman Kills Assailant.

Givans, S. C., Feb. 11.—A killing took place near here this morning at about 6 o'clock. A peddler named Greenburg, frequently visited the home of J. D. Bivens, up to about a week ago, when he made advances to assault Miss Bivens and was arrested. He promised to pay a fine and leave the country if they would free him, which was done. But he came back last night and entered the Bivens house and made the same advances towards Mrs. Bivens, when she shot him with a shotgun, the lead entering his neck. Magistrate Cummings was notified of the killing and he summoned a jury of inquest, the verdict being justifiable homicide. Mr. Bivens was in Columbia at the time.—Charlotte Observer.
