Supreme Court Affirms Lower Court.

The Supreme court has affirmed the action of the lower court in the case of Sylvester Barrett, for murder, which case went up on appeal from Pitt county. Barrett was one of the negroes tried in January term of Pitt Superior court for the murder of Constable W. J. Lovitt, of Farmville township, the crime being committed on the night of January 20th. The jury returned a verdict of murder in the first degree as to Barrett and he was sentenced to be hanged Feb 16th, but his counsel took appeal to Supreme court.

Jerry Cobb, the accomplice of Barrett, was convicted of murder in the second degree and sentenced 25 years in the penitentiary. He is now serving his sentence.

ELECTRIC BURGLAR ALARM.

National Bank of Greenville Installs System.

The Electric Bank protection Co.'s double automatic burglar alarm system has been installed by the National Bank of Greenville. It is the most complete system of burglar alarm that has been invented, and the company installing keeps a standing offer of \$1,000 to any one that can attract and defeat the object of the alarm.

Cashier J. W. Aycock and Teller F. J. Forbes, showed the reporter through the bank and explained the alarm system. The battery clocks and switches that operate the alarm are located within the vault. Large gongs are placed on either side of the vault door and a large gong placed on the front of the building outside. The interior of the vault is lined with metal and so connected with the mechanism of the alarm that every inch of the surface is protected and an attack on the vault at any point will start the gongs to ringing and at the same time turn on all the lights in the bank. When the gongs are thus started they will ring for 15 hours, or until the vault is opened and the mechanism switched off. With such a system the bank is absolutely protected against attack by burglars.

The clock in the vault is constructed that it also sounds the large gong in front of the building for 5 seconds at 12 o'clock each day.
