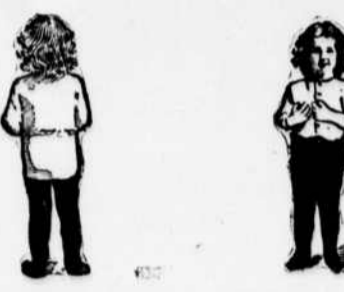

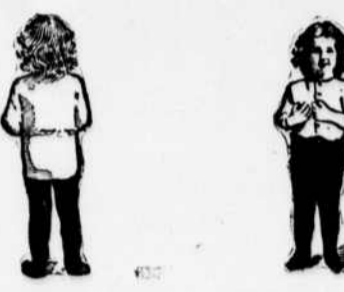

SHODDY LEATHER.

"It's a fierce age, this," sighed the shoemaker. "They are making shoddy leather now. It's worse than shoddy wool. They buy up all the old boots and shoes, and they throw them into a big machine and grind them into a coarse powder. Whichever goes the machine, and in at one end of the old shoe, side out of the other, comes a chocolate colored dust. This dust they mix with about 40 per cent of melted India rubber, and the mixture they press into a pie crust and under heavy rollers, apply a pressure of 10,000 pounds to the square foot.
