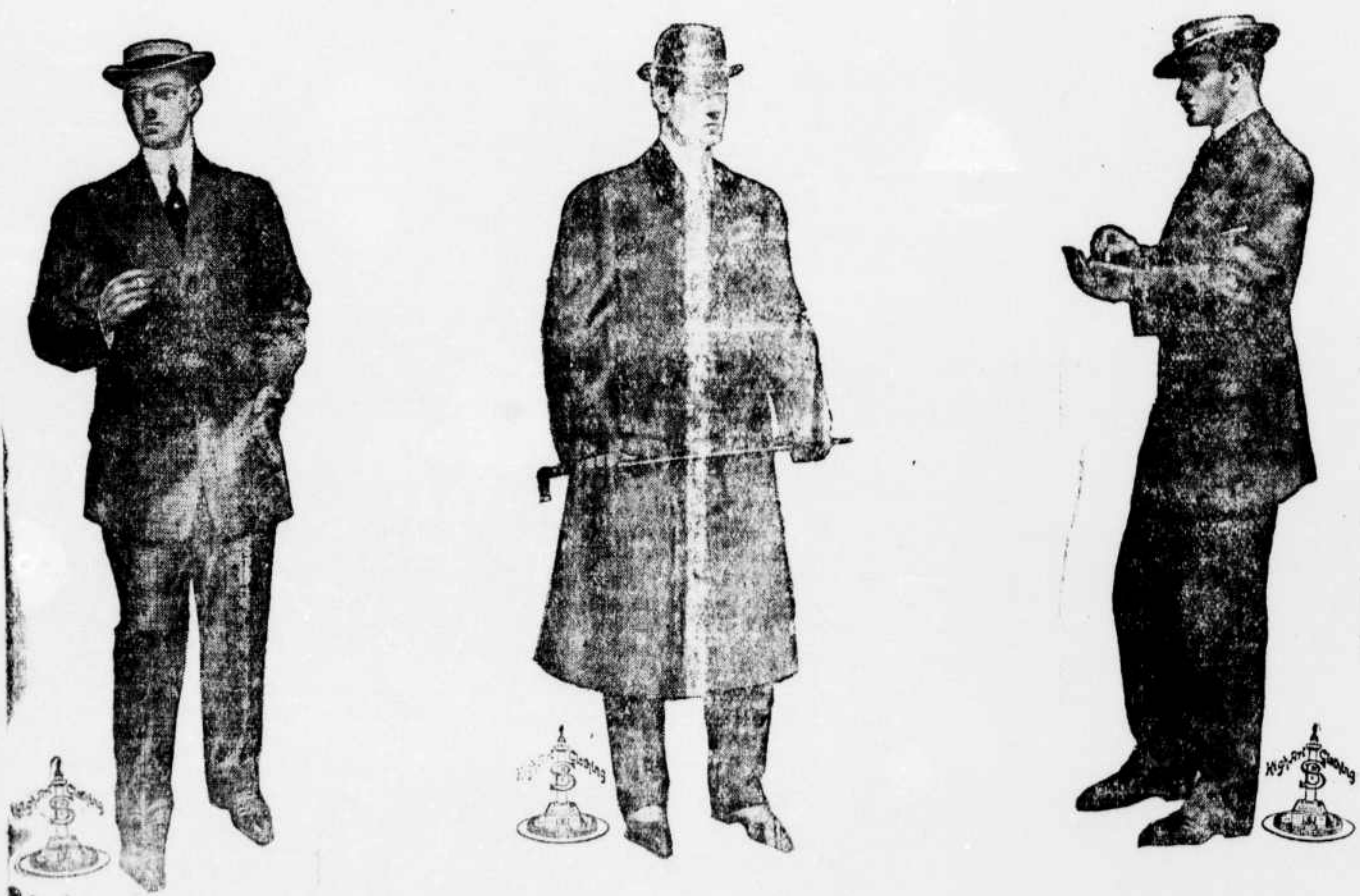

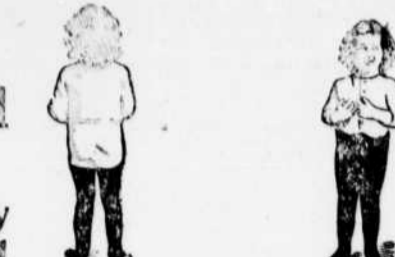

THANKSGIVING DAY. November 29th the Date by Proclamation. Washington, Oct. 23.—The President today issued a proclamation naming November 29th as a day of thanksgiving.

A Proclamation. The time of year has come when, in accordance with the wise custom of our forefathers, it becomes my duty to set aside a special day of thanksgiving and praise to the Almighty because of the blessings we have received, and in prayer that these blessings may be continued.

Material well-being, indispensable, though it can never be anything but the foundation of true national greatness and happiness. If we build nothing upon this foundation, then our national life will be as meaningless and empty as a house where only the foundation has been laid.

Accordingly I hereby set apart Thursday, the twenty-ninth day of November, next, as a day of thanksgiving and supplication, on which the people shall meet in their homes or their churches devoutly acknowledge all that has been given them, and to pray that they may in addition receive the power to use those gifts aright.

WHO IS EXEMPT FROM JURY? Interesting Question is Settled by the North Carolina Supreme Court in Case of an Ex-Fireman. A number of opinions were filed by the Supreme court yesterday of which that of most general interest was in the case of State vs. Cantwell, in which the rather vexed question of who is and who is not liable for jury duty is finally settled.
