Hillsborough, July 27th 1862

Dear Father

I was very much pleased this morning to receive a letter from you containing the welcome intelligence that you wanted me to come to Wilmington. There are several Cadets here from there that are going home in a few days and I shall have plenty of company. One received a discharge by the same mail that I got my letter. This session ends on next Thursday 31st July one week from to day I shall have ample time to hear from you before then. I can Aunt Maggie yesterday morning she is trusting for you to come up but as you are so busy about the Court martial I suppose it will be impossible to

come now. I know very well that
it will cost too much to let Sister
Anna spend her vacation in Morgantown
but could she do so, she would find
it a very pleasant life indeed we have
a good many friends and relations there
now. Aunt Mary's family, Cousin Fannie
Gusts, Mr. Blackwell's, Mr. Williams and
Cousin Fannie Jarvis from New Bern and
a good many other families that I could
mention, one of my roommates a son
of Todd R. Caldwell, has been urging
me to go up to Morgantown and spend
some time with him. As the mail goes
off shortly I am compelled to close
hoping that I may tell you more in
