

Camp, Pottigum Tapesail  
Oct. 2<sup>d</sup> 1863.

My Dear Father

Your letter of the 30<sup>th</sup> sent by  
Sergt. Swankins has been received. I was very glad  
to hear that you were well. A day or two  
ago I sent by one of our wagons, a bundle  
containing three letters, one to you and two to  
be mailed, by your not saying any thing about  
them I presume you did not get them. He  
says he left them at your office. In the letter  
I asked you to procure me if possible some  
Glow Crickets, or something of the kind (Glow  
if you can get from the Commencement) if you  
can get the things send me a bill and I  
will send you the money. If you get them
