Dear Father,

I have been or sent
down to the Steamboat for the
mail and since your letter was
received telling me it would be up.
If it is in Washington please try
to send by Monday's boat. I am
badly in need of it for 3 or 4 days.
To day I commenced selling manure
& listing up, & should it not come
by Wednesday at least I will have
to arrange some land manure, with
a big crop & no more team I have
no ^{time} spare. If any thing has happened
do you can't get it let me know
by Monday's boat. I send you
three bags of manure for the cow I
think they are worth as much as a
bush of hay & will save you that
much. I shall look for you up.
