Sir:

I send forward the Postboy Steamer, to Washington for some small repairs, & also to bring down your command, on Monday next to Ockraoke, in accordance, with the orders of the Adjutant General, which you have received.

You will encamp your company, in & about the Marine Hospital, which will be the nucleus for the encampment of several companies.

You will need table furniture &c, chiefly of tin - neatly packed in two or 3 camp chests - 2 large, or 3 smaller cooking stoves, & the usual outfit of a company in the field - being careful not to render your baggage too cumbersome, tho' bringing every necessary.
