

Camp Washington
July 18th 1861.

Sir -

I have vacated the quarters assigned to me, for the use of the sick in camp. I have taken nothing away but what I took there. You are expected to occupy it as a Hospital for the post, and will of course use all diligence in organizing it for the comfort of the sick soldiers.

I am required to assign quarters to the Post in West, Chaplain to the Post, and I shall expect you to vacate the quarters at present occupied by you for that purpose. I have notified the Chaplain that he will take possession on your quitting it. I put you here, & shall look alone to you for its delivery. I know no one else in the matter.
