Ocracoke Inlet

Sir -

Aug. 3^d 1861.

I ask to have the Washington Guards (Co A. 7th Regt. N.C. Volunteers) of which I am com-
mander, stationed at this post, transferred
to Col^l C. C. Terrell's (2nd) Regt. State Troops.

The Company, with few exceptions,
have twice voted for the war, & I shall
proceed to muster them in immediately.
There is a vacancy in Col^l Terrell's Regiment,
not likely to be filled, I learn, by Capt.
Cerator's Company, for whom it has
been held in reserve.

Those of the Company who may prefer
to remain 12 Mo's Volunteers, can be
transferred (I respectfully suggest) to
Capt. James Swindell's Company, from
Beaufort County, to be ordered I learn,
to the coast. This Company is short.

I can move from the coast to
Newbern at a day's notice. I need
knapsacks, cap-Bunches & Bayonet
& cut-throats, & cartridge boxes.
