Dear Friend

I was very glad to hear from you - and that you are so well cared for by friends. I shall send you some books soon - and the Board of publication will send a parcel for distribution among those in the Fort -

Your family knew on the week after the taking of Hatteras, that you were well & unhurt - The flag of truce that went from Krubers for the wounded brought word that an officer was hurt - and Will. Stevenson went to Raleigh and secured all arrangements for your family - I would have gone to Washington before leaving so as to bring you & your friends the latest news of your families - but the forty

days - within which express was allowed
were too nearly expired - I doubt
not all are well, as Washington
is very healthy this season -

I saw Miss Taylor & Mr &
Mrs Partridge on their way home
from Kittrell's. They & friends were
all well. If I hear any thing
likely to be interesting to you -
as all from Eastern Carolina
will be - I will promptly in-
form you.
