bills & acct. I advanced the Major
\$100 for himself & companions &
charged it in yr.

If Mr Demille you desire it, give
him a draft on me as authorized
in my letter 21st inst to Major G.
for the bal due him.

Capt Duke & Lt. West & Shaw
got here yesterday. Capt D & Lt.
W. went on yesterday evening, but
Lt. Shaw, who promised to meet
them at the point of leaving, was

left behind. His baggage
went over with theirs. He said
to Mr Deuce he would follow this
morning. I judge he did so.

Your note 23^{cts} in relation
to advancing funds to Lt Col
was left by him with Mr
Deuce who sent it to me this
morning. Lt Col asked for only
\$10 yesterday which I advanced
him & charged in a/c.

Majr G asked me 22^d to send
you or Capt Lamb \$100 for the
use of the remaining Officers
& I promised to do so, but just
now the balance in Boston is
against New York & our banks
are not checking. You or he
can draw at sight for \$100, or
I will send it in Treasury or
small bank notes by Express
as you prefer. Gold is at a smart
premium - 3c4%. Yours Truly
