My Dear Sir,

Your note 27th rec^d
yesterday. I let G. Whiston have

I will supply them cheerfully.

Mr Demille has just now, 4
o'clock p.m., sent to my office
a letter you wrote him 22nd inst.
He says he only got it today.
The bags & trunk will be
sent to morrow if you are gone
they can be sent back - if
you get them, & the bill in time
to do so, add the am^t to the
sum now due Mr Demille &
send him a draft on R.W.

Hyman for the whole. Mr
I says you have his eye now
I know the am^t. In case the
bill of lading & bags don't get
to you in time you can draw
the order for the eye as it now
stands. I will in that case
pay Mr D for the bags & let
it stand. Mr Hyman agreed
to advance \$1000 more. He is
now in Chicago sick but will
soon be back here. For such
sum as you draw on Hyman
in favor of Mr Demill please
send a draft on the Adjutant
& Dr Master Genl. of A. C. in
favor of Hyman, "with same
exchange as may be paid on
the draft of \$7500 given to
said Hyman by O. Martin". So
that Mr D can hand this to
Hyman when he pays Mr D.

I send now a statement of the
amount due me, \$1350 (41) -
when you get to Charlestown you
will please give my brothers,
Messrs Hardy & Brothers, an order
on the adjutant & Quartermaster
Master General of N. C. for
this sum, "with exchange
"same as may be paid to R.
"H. Hoffman on the draft of
"\$7,500 given him by Col. Hoffman
"F. Martin"

I send also by
Express today to Capt Lamb
(with \$100 for himself & the
officers generally, which I
was requested to send by
Major Gilliam) \$853 in N. C.
Cash & Money for which from
time to time I sent silver
& gold in change. This sum
I want you or Capt Lamb,
as may be most convenient,

to hand to my brother at
Charleston, with the draft
of \$1350 (41), request
them to put the whole
to my credit -
