Your 2nd of 28th were both rec^d yesterday
the delay of the first cannot understand as the Boats
go to day they will reach you Monday at furthest
and be in time if they should not, hence a request for
the Trunk and Box to be returned at once and will
forward them to meet you at Fataep Monroe I
expect you to come on this way. you can then
meet your men at Fataep Monroe I want to
see my old acquaintances again

I saw Capt Johnson yesterday, as he said on South
both of the Packages of Liquor ^{sent} was Whiskey, the demijohn I
have been told was gin. not being a drinker have to
take the opinion of others

have sent with the Trunk of Malines, some Paper Ink Envelopes
Needles, Pot Monias, more Snuff 2 or 3 Bottles Whiskey.

By all means come on by land remember 152. E. 19th
have your Trunk left on the boat and will send for it
take the 3rd or Carr at the Park and I live between 27th &
Avenue 19th St. If I know the day of your leaving
will meet you at the Boat should you arrive after
8 am I shall be at 186 Front St. all the family well
and send regards
