My dear Sparrow;

I send you by the Steamer Charlotte, a few chess
some candles, and some other
little articles, by way of provis-
ioning you for the expected breeze
I would send you more, but Mr
Langshaw was kind enough to
offer to carry over^a, but for me
and I disliked to abuse my
privilege by sending a larger
package - I wish you to write
me all the war news, what you
think of the future of the Confed-
eracy &c, &c. It will be con-
sidered by me Confidential -
we very seldom see a Southern
paper here - The Yankee jour-
nals, although not credited en-
tirely, produce a painful anxiety

in the minds of the friends on
the South ~~here~~, the Yankees have
few if any friends ~~in the~~ ~~island~~
Send me if you please
a copy of the Confederate
tax law. If no vessel should
be coming here, direct to
me at St George's Bermuda
(Care of Major Norman S Walker)
and he will forward the letter
The steamer is about to leave
and I can not write more
at this time
