


Council Notes

March 1914.

Greenville, N.C.,
March 27, 1914

The adjourned meeting of the Council was called to order this afternoon at 3:35 o'clock.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Discussion of the report from the Committee on the amount of work, outside of classes a student may undertake was taken up.

After much discussion of the report in general it was decided that certain changes were necessary. It was moved and carried that Council member be counted as three points instead of five. It was moved and carried that President of the Athletic League be counted as two points instead of three.

A motion was then made and carried that we accept the report as follows:

Report of Committee on the Amount of work, outside of classes, a student may undertake.

This work shall be measured in points. Five points to be the maximum any one student may carry.

The following positions shall

Carry five points each:

Editor of Magazine, Business
Manager of Magazine.

The following positions shall carry
four points each:

Assistant Editor of Magazine,
Presidents of Societies and Young
Women's Christian Association.

The following positions shall carry
three points each:

Secretaries of Societies and Young
Women's Christian Association,
Council Members.

The following positions shall carry
two points each:

Presidents of Classes, Treasurers
of Young Women's Christian
Association and Societies, President
of Athletic League, Business
Manager of Athletic League.

The following positions shall
carry one point each:

Secretaries and Treasurers of
Classes, Secretary of Athletic
League, Chairmen of Standing
Committees in Societies and
Young Women's Christian Association.

A motion was carried that
this action of the Council be
made known to the student body
at once, and that this action effect
all offices held by students,
during the year 1914-15 and
following.

Council then adjourned
to meet April 14 at 3:35 o'clock.

Jan. 21, 1915.

The first meeting of the Council was held this evening. The first business was the election of a secretary. Irene White was elected secretary. A council member from each class made a report on Class privileges. The D, C, and F classes were in favor of having privileges. Mr. Wright instructed the council members of those classes to draw up the privileges and send them to him.

The problem of Fifth St. was brought up, but as nothing definite was done, the question was left open for discussion at the next meeting.

The council members from the C class stated that one of the privileges that they wished was to attend the moving picture show twice a month. The advantages and disadvantages were discussed; also what arrangements should be made with Mr. White. Mr. Wright suggested that this privilege should be given to the whole school if it could be worked out satisfactorily. The question was left open for further discussion.

Council then adjourned to meet on the following Thursday.

The Council met during the fourth period on Saturday, Jan. 30

The question of attending Moving Pictures was referred. It was moved that the ^{senior} school only should have the privilege of attending the matinee at White's Theater once per month on Monday, when the pictures are such as to meet with the approval of the class advisors. The motion was carried.

The question of attending church on Sunday evenings when it does not conflict with Y.W.C.A. was brought up. After being discussed, it was not approved.

It was recommended and approved that if a student violates a privilege, the class will deal with the case by recommending to the President that she lose her privileges and also how long she be denied them.

The advisability of limiting the number of times a girl can go out at night or spend the weekend away from school, was brought before the Council by Mr. Wright, to be discussed at the next meeting. He proposed to limit the number of week-end visits to six during the school year, and the number of times to go to anything at night, to four during the school year.

The matter concerning Fifth St. was discussed. Nothing definite was done.

The meeting then adjourned, subject to call.
