

Memoranda for Lieut
Chambers & Messrs

1st. In the event of a difficulty between Capt's Leitch & Johnston as to the command of this Post, this Company is to recognize only Capt Leitch as in command, & obey only his orders. This is to apply to the Eastern at the Fort. Should Capt. Leitch leave the Post, the command will devolve on Capt. Gilliam, & he will be recognized as Senior Captain & not as Major.

2nd. Let all the men in Camp marked with a x to volunteer for the war if possible.

Let for each 1/2 Mo's man who quits our company, a substitute from another Company. All who do not furnish substitutes will be transferred to Capt. Lord's Company when it shall arrive.

3 Receive no man from any other company who is not a sound sober man. I want no drunkards.

4 The new recruit Ireland, should be drilled thoroughly every day. Select some of the worst drilled men in a day or two, and put him in a squad with them.

5. Open all letters from Raleigh or Virginia, bearing the appearance of being official. If orders come to move the Company to Newbern for Virginia. Let preparations be made to move immediately. Don't delay over 24 hours. Let the Squire, or Ahermacle or Post Boy to take the Company up. Let each man take a days provisions if the Company shd go on a steamer, & two days if on a ~~best~~ sail vessel.

Report in Newbern to Lt. William H. Oliver Asst. Quarter Master, & he will furnish quarters & subsistence.

6. V. R. Norton's case should be disposed of, at least by Tuesday. He might plead guilty & have some moderate punishment imposed on him. If he will volunteer for the war, take him.

7. Let the camp be never without a Commissaries office. Let the officers be mild but firm in discipline, and endeavor by all means to enforce order in camp.

8. Turn all the provisions and Quarter Masters Stores over to the Commissary & Quarter Master of the post. & take a receipt for all.

9. Leave all the Muskets, in good order, & deliver them over to the Commandant of the post, taking a receipt for them.

10. Carry the box of Ammunition & Ordnance Stores, except the Lead-Licks
Shawals. I remain Capt. W. G. G.
