ABDOMINAL CAVITY.-No. 6.

FROM THE SAME SUBJECT AS THE PRECEDING VIEW.

The small intestine has been removed, and also a portion of the colon, and the caecum opened. The positions of the pyloric portion of the stomach and of the pyloric orifice are seen, and also

the interior of the caecum.

The pyloric orifice has moved downwards and to the left, and the duodenum has been thrown into a loop.

This view shows in a very typical manner the structure of the ileo-caecal orifice, and the retinacula which pass round the interior of the caecum. The vermiform appendix is seen passing down into the pelvis. The anterior surface of the liver shows the groove which contained the first part of the transverse colon.

The figures indicate-

1. Anterior surface of the stomach.

6. Cut edge of the mesentery.

2. Pyloric portion of the stomach.
3. Pyloric orifice.
4. First part of the duodenum.
5. Second part of the duodenum.

7. Vermiform appendix.
8. On a retinaculum, above the ileo-caecal orifice.
9. Orifice of the vermiform appendix.
10. Pelvic colon.
