ABDOMEN.

BLADDER-No. 3.

TWO SPECIMENS OF BLADDER, PROSTATE, AND SEMINAL VESICLES VIEWED FROM THE SIDE.

In the upper specimen the peritoneum has been left, covering the upper surface, and the line of

reflection is seen separating the upper from the lower surface. Prostate. The apex points downwards and is in contact with the deep layer of the triangular ligament, and the urethra issues from it. The posterior surface is flattened and is related to the rectum, while the lateral surfaces are rounded and are in relation to the levator ani muscle. There is no indication on the surface of any sub-division of the gland into lobes.

The figures indicate-

Apex of the bladder and urachus.
Upper surface of bladder.
Inferior.
Ureter.

- 5. Vas deferens.
- 6. Seminal vesicle
- 7. Prostate gland.
- 8. Apex of prostate and urethra issuing from it.
