In its second straight home game, East Carolina brings a 1-2 record into today's contest with Southern Mississippi (2-2) and memories of two three-point losses.

The Pirates dropped its home opener last week to Syracuse 21-18 in a traditional "down-to-the-wire" finish.

The Pirates look to pick themselves back up and prepare to go head-to-head with Southern Mississippi who is also a part of the Liberty Bowl Alliance. A win today is another step forward to a berth in the Dec. 31 bowl game. (Complete standings - see page 46).

The Pirate- Golden Eagle Series

The history of the series is not on the Pirates side, however, as ECU has won just four games of the 19-game series. In games played in Greenville, Southern Miss leads, 8-1. The only ECU win in the Emerald City was on Sept. 11, 1976 in a 48-0 shutout. Since that ECU victory, USM has won six straight in Greenville.

The Golden Eagles will be looking for their third straight victory after defeating ECU 38-21 in 1992 in front of a Thursday night national

ESPN audience and taking a 24-16 win last season in Hattiesburg.

ECU Defense Finds Success Against USM

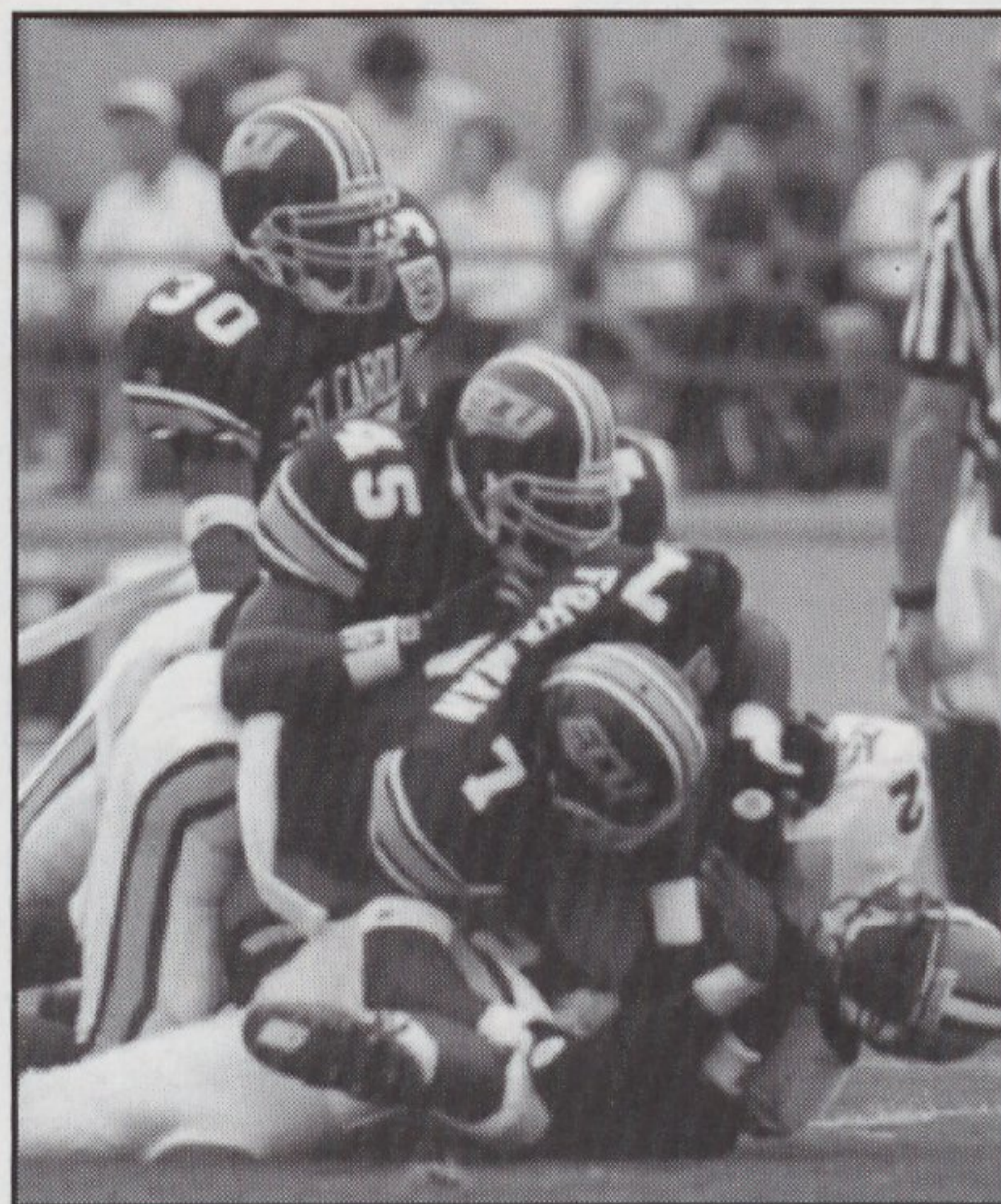
If one part of history is on ECU's side, it's the Pirates' defensive performance against Southern Miss in the 1990s.

Of ECU's top-five defensive performances in the 1990s, The Pirates 1991 and 1993 games with USM rank as their best outings.

Last season, the Pirate "D" allowed USM just 168 total yards, the best ECU performance since 1980. In 1991, ECU recorded its second best defensive performance allowing the Golden Eagles just 196 total yards.

This year, the Pirate defense continues to shine.

After three games, the ECU ranks 36th in the nation in total defense, 17th in pass efficiency defense, 23rd in scoring-defense and 37th in rushing defense.



Crandell, Waters Share Same Story

On the other side of the ball, ECU's sophomore quarterback Marcus Crandell will be rivaled by veteran USM quarterback Tommy Waters. Their age

and experience may vary but these two signal callers could very well be on the same wave length.

Sept. 18, 1993 was a significant date in both quarterback's careers with the two simultaneously suffering injuries that effected the remainder of the 1993 seasons for ECU and USM.

Crandell went down in the second quarter of ECU's game with



Central Florida, suffering a broken leg. The season-ending injury set up ECU for a long year that ended with a 2-9 record.

Waters, a two-year starter for USM, was injured in the second quarter of USM's Sept. 18 game with Northeastern Louisiana.

He separated his shoulder on a 48-yard touchdown pass to Fred Brock and went on to miss six games and played just a reserve role in USM's last two games. Following Waters' injury, the Golden Eagles went on to finish with a 2-9 record in 1993.

Both players returned to their starting roles this season and are seeing signs of their old form.

Against Syracuse, Crandell completed 21 of 43 passes for a career high 280 yards. His two touchdown passes were the first of the season and he recorded his second straight game without an interception.

Waters is also returning to form. Through USM's first four games, the senior QB has completed 61 of 124 passes for 587 yards and

Smith Goes For Record

Eyes probably won't be on the quarterbacks today, however, as

much as ECU senior running back Junior Smith. With 2,845 career rushing yards, Smith need just 45 yards to become ECU's career rushing leader.

With back-to-back 1,000 rushing seasons in 1992 and 1993, Smith is currently second on ECU's all-time rushing list. Averaging 101.3 yards a game, Smith is looking to claim the record set by Carlester Crumpler, Sr. (1971-73).

Start with the rivalry of ECU and USM, add the excitement and unusual endings in the two-team's history, a career record that's on the line and a chance of a post-season bowl and you'll get a great game today in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

A Look Back

1993 ECU-USM Meeting USM-24, ECU-16

Oct. 23, 1993, Hattiesburg, Miss.

After taking a 10-3 lead in the second quarter, ECU allowed three straight Golden Eagles scored in the second half to fall behind 24-10. The Pirates scored with 13:19 remaining in the fourth quarter but could not get in the endzone for the remainder of the game and fell 24-16 to USM.

The Pirate defense allowed just 168 total offensive yards which was the best defensive effort by an ECU team since 1980 when the Pirates held Duke to 165 yards.

Junior Smith led ECU with 74 yards on 23 carries and Perez Mattison completed 14 of 36 passes for 174 yards and two touchdowns. Jerris McPhail caught six passes for 107 yards and two touchdowns.

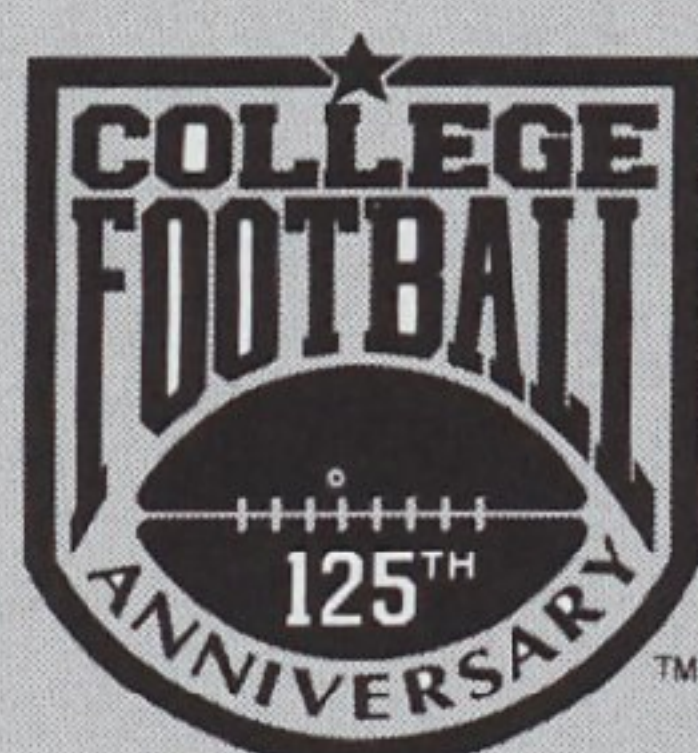
Defensively Jeff Cooke had seven tackles, two for losses, and forced and recovered fumbles. For his effort, Cooke was named the IFA Defensive Player of the Week.

On This Date

High Scores In College football history:

45 years ago: 1949

Wyoming shut out Northern Colorado 103-0 on Nov. 5, 1949, an NCAA record for most points scored that still stands today.

14 years ago: 1980

Oklahoma (12) and Colorado (6) combined for an NCAA record 18 touchdowns on Oct. 4, 1980.

Great Victories In ECU football history:

30 years ago: 1964

East Carolina defeated Massachusetts 14-13 in the Tangerine Bowl on Dec. 12, 1964. The win was the first of two straight Tangerine Bowl wins.

61 years ago: 1933

East Carolina recorded its first intercollegiate victory, defeating Campbell 6-0 in Greenville on Nov. 11, 1933.

ECU began competing in football on an intercollegiate basis in 1932 with Ken Beatty serving as head coach. Since that time, Pirate football squads have been fielded 58 times in 63 years for an overall record of 279-267-11.



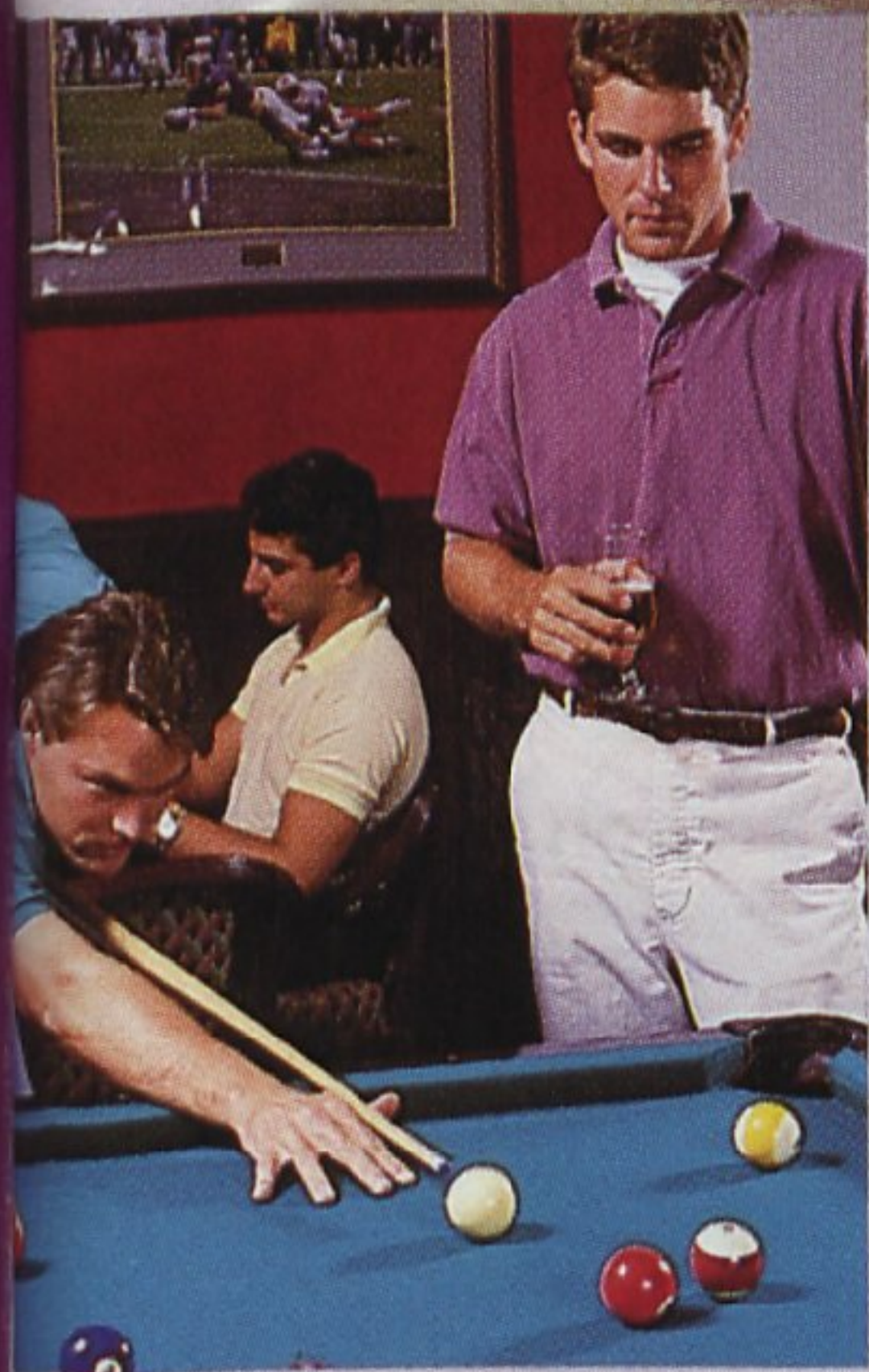

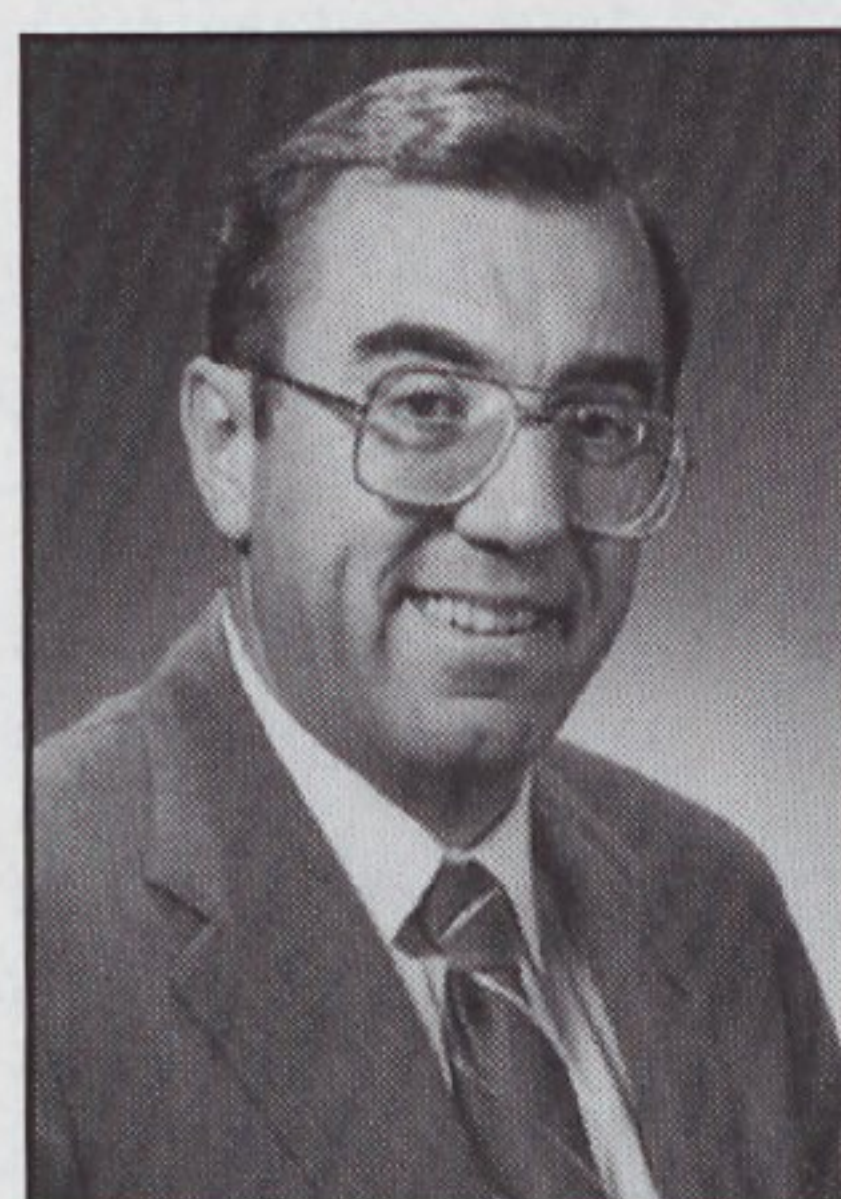
With enthusiasm and remarkable stamina, Dr. Eakin pursues this vision around the clock and on-the-road as ECU's highly visible top ambassador.

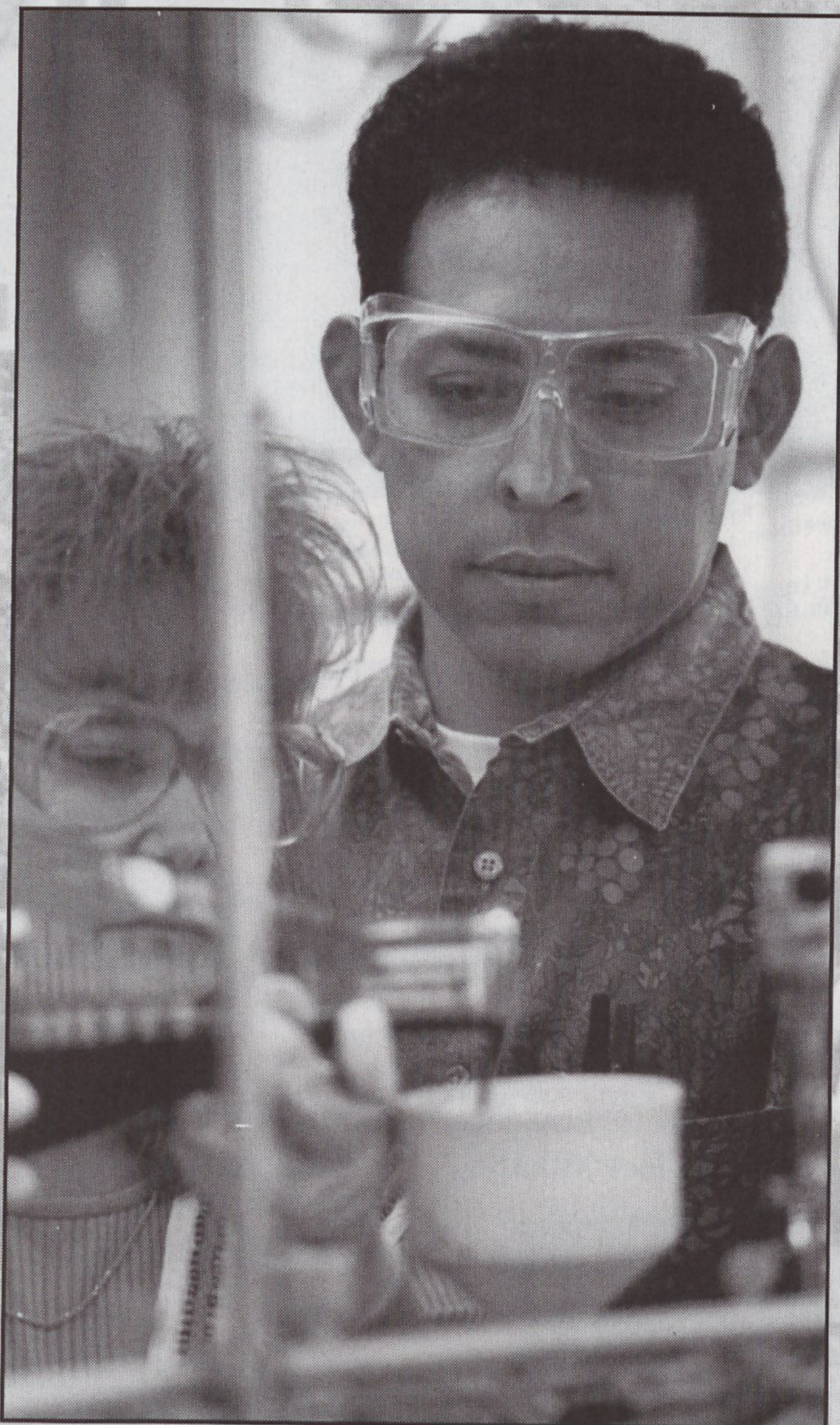
East Carolina University, a diverse, comprehensive university, is known for the quality and breadth of its academic programs and for its pursuit of excellence in a variety of activities.

With an enrollment of nearly 18,000 students, ECU is the third-largest institution of the 16-campus University of North Carolina system. It has a work force of more than 3,500, a faculty numbering more than 1,100 and a budget of almost \$290 million.

The campus today is alive not only with the activities of its students and faculty but also with the whirl and clatter of construction crews. More than 20 percent of the campus is under construction or renovation or will be in the next few months. Among the prominent projects are the Student Recreation Center, which will be completed in the fall of 1995, and the additions and renovations to Joyner Library, which will be under way for four years.

ECU students come from all 100 of North Carolina's counties, 45 states and 38 nations. Of the students, 57 percent are women, 83 percent are undergraduates and 13 percent are minorities.

The university offers 106 undergraduate degree tracks and 92 graduate degree tracks. It conferred 3,416 degrees during the 1992-93 academic year, and it has close to 70,000 living alumni.



Here is a selection of other distinctions of ECU:

- It has the largest teacher-education program in North Carolina and the 15th largest in the nation.
- It has one of the largest art schools in the Southeast and the only art program in North Carolina accredited by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design. The Wellington B. Gray Gallery is one of the largest contemporary art galleries in North Carolina.
- The School of Medicine has ranked No. 1 nationally in the percentage of graduates entering primary care fields.
- The School of Social Work is the only one in North Carolina with both undergraduate and graduate programs accredited by the National Council on Social Work Education.
- In the School of Human Environmental Sciences, the hospitality management program is one of only two such programs in North Carolina. The child life program is the first one in North Carolina.
- The music education program in the School of Music is among the largest and strongest in the Southeastern United States. The music therapy program is the only one in a state-supported school in North Carolina.
- The school of Business has the second-oldest accredited MBA program in the state.
- The university has state-of-the-art student computing labs campus-wide and some of the finest discipline-specific student computing labs in the nation.
- The Department of English publishes seven scholarly and literary journals: Children's Folklore Review, The Concord Saunterer, Minnesota Review, North Carolina Literary Review, Tar River Poetry, The Thoreau Society Bulletin and Victorians Institute Journal.

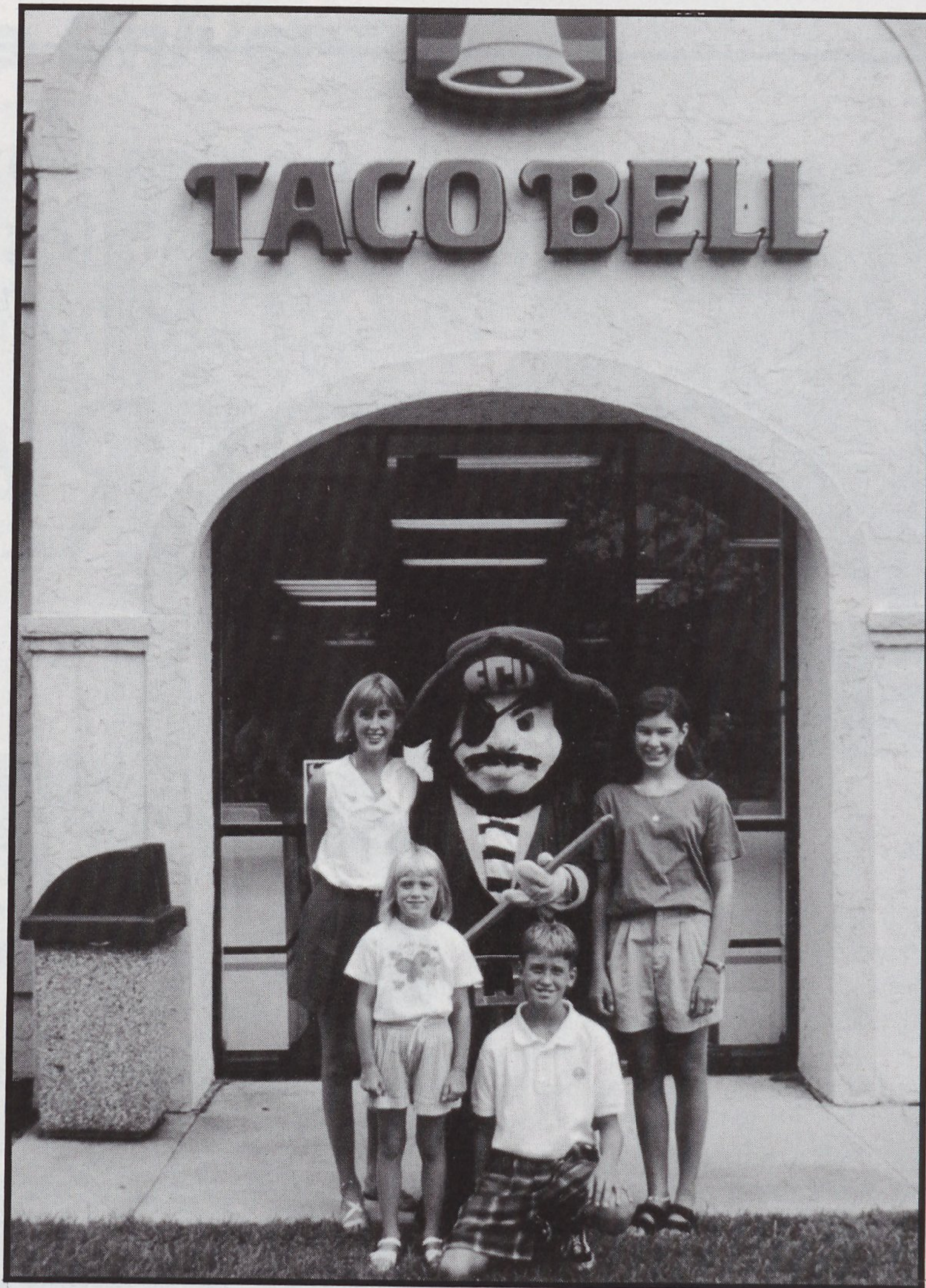

The practice fields are the classroom. Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium is the final exam. Steve Logan is the teacher.

It's the way the third-year East Carolina head coach prefers it.

"When I sat down and asked myself what I enjoyed most about coaching," said Logan, "it was the teaching that I enjoyed most and if teaching is what I enjoy then I would be teaching on Saturday as well."

If you spent time watching Logan on the sidelines, you'll get a feel how the 41-year-old coach uses Saturdays as another teaching tool.

He'll take one of his young quarterbacks on the sidelines and discuss different plans, options and ideas. It's a two-way conversation and the best way for a student-athlete to know what he's doing right and what's he doing wrong.

"He doesn't pressure you, he doesn't yell at you, but he makes sure you understand what you did wrong," said Jeff Blake, former Pirate and current Cincinnati Bengals quarterback. "He makes sure you know everything about the game. He taught me how to keep my composure, how to be a leader."

The teaching and leadership roles continue also off the playing and practice fields. The Lawton, Okla. native, feels that if student-athletes are going to be the best they are going to be, it requires self-discipline, hard work and dedication.

Members of the football squad are told three things by Logan about playing football at East Carolina: 1) if you go to class and practice hard, you will play; 2) have fun playing the game of football, and; 3) play as hard as possible on every play and the wins and losses will take care of themselves.

"I like to see the responsibility for the little things fall upon the players rather than for me telling them to do it," said Logan.

"We never talk to our student-ath-

letes about winning and losing - never," continues Logan. "We talk to them about showing up, playing every play as hard as they can play it and play to the last play of the game. We don't care who it is we're playing. We give a ton of respect to whoever that may be, home or on the road."

Logan developed much of his philosophy through the influence of several head coaches. He worked on the staff of current Ohio State coach John Cooper at Tulsa, with former Dallas Cowboys coach Jimmy Johnson at Oklahoma State, with Bill McCartney at Colorado and with Bill Lewis at ECU.

When Lewis resigned to take the head coaching position at Georgia Tech, ECU Director of Athletics Dave Hart, Jr., did not have far to look for the school's 17th head football coach.

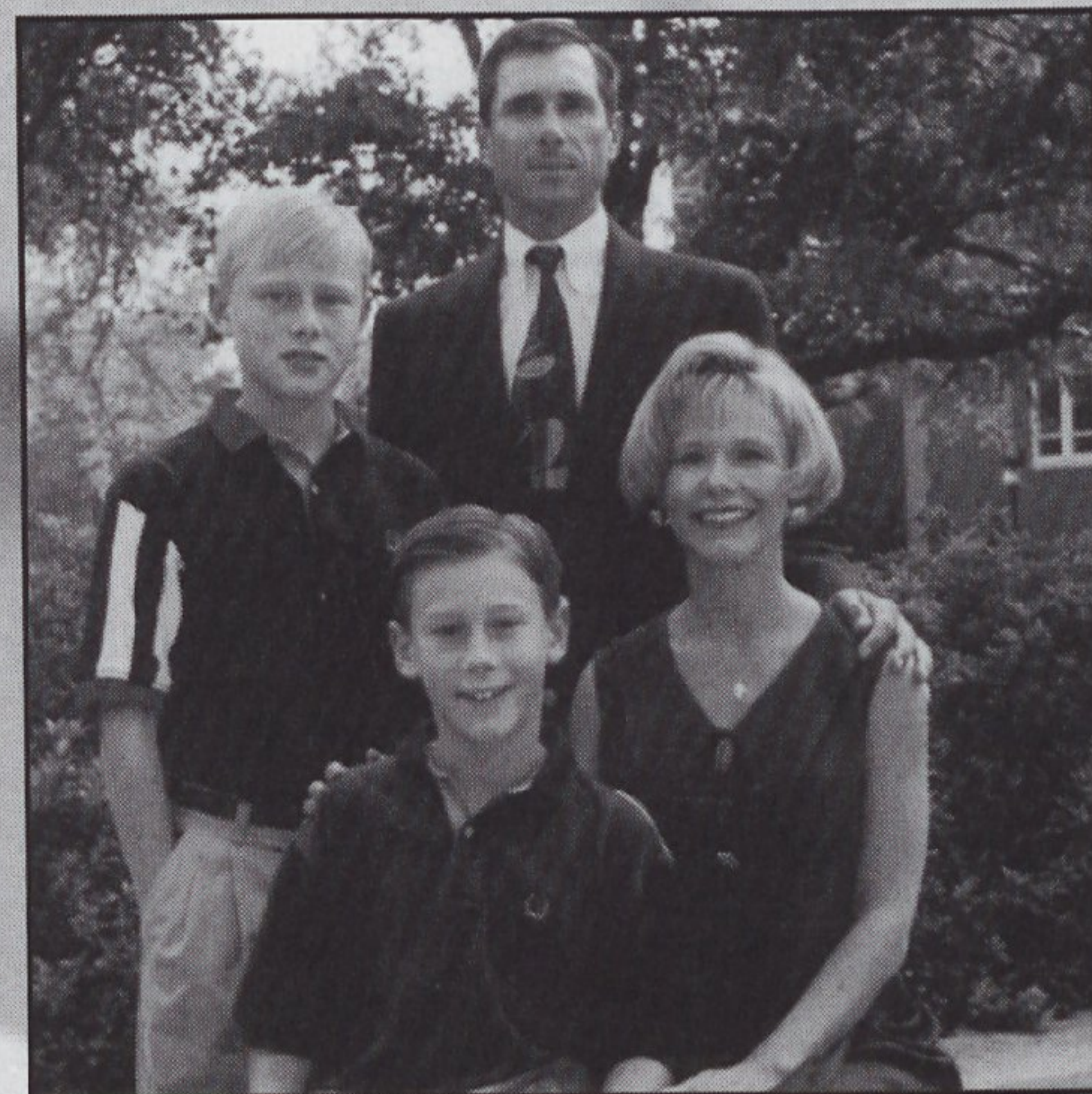
"It became obvious to me through conversations with Steve that he was the best man for the job," said Hart.

Logan is mostly credited with the development of the Pirate offensive attack during the 1990-91 seasons when he was ECU's offensive coordinator. In 1991, ECU finished the season with an 11-1 record and reached a Top Ten national ranking.

During the 1990-91 seasons, Logan coached quarterback Jeff Blake. The Sanford, Fla. native broke or tied 32 school records before leaving ECU, including most passing yards in a game, season and career. He was named the 1991 ECAC Player of the Year.

Logan continues to monitor the offensive side of the football closely. He still coaches the quarterbacks but also makes his way around the practice field to observe his coaches in action.

In 1992, it was Michael Anderson's turn to rewrite ECU record books. The Decatur, Ga. native, broke or tied 12 school records, including all of the school's sophomore records.

This season, as was in 1993, Logan has another young signal-caller with outstanding potential - Marcus Crandell. The Robersonville, N.C. sophomore, suffered a broken leg in the second game of last season and had to sit out the remainder of the year. Meanwhile, Logan had to use redshirt freshman Chris Hester for three starts and true freshman Perez Mattison for six starts last season.

Logan came to ECU in 1989 after serving as quarterback coach at Mississippi State for two seasons. During his first season at ECU, he coached the running backs.

As a student at Tulsa, Logan did not play football and had plans to get a doctorate degree and become a college professor.

"I realized I wasn't going to the NFL," said Logan. "But, I had to teach in the public schools before going to graduate school. There (Union High School) they wanted me to coach football. I got addicted."

During the next five years, Logan became a high school assistant coach while he completed all but six hours of credits towards his masters degree.

He began in the collegiate coaching ranks in 1980 as a tight ends coach at Oklahoma State.

"I loved working with the kids and having an impact on their decisions in and outside of football," said Logan. "That, and the intrigue of competitive strategy, really hooked me."

Logan, an avid tennis player, and his wife, Laura, are the proud parents of two sons - Vincent (12) and Nathanael (10).

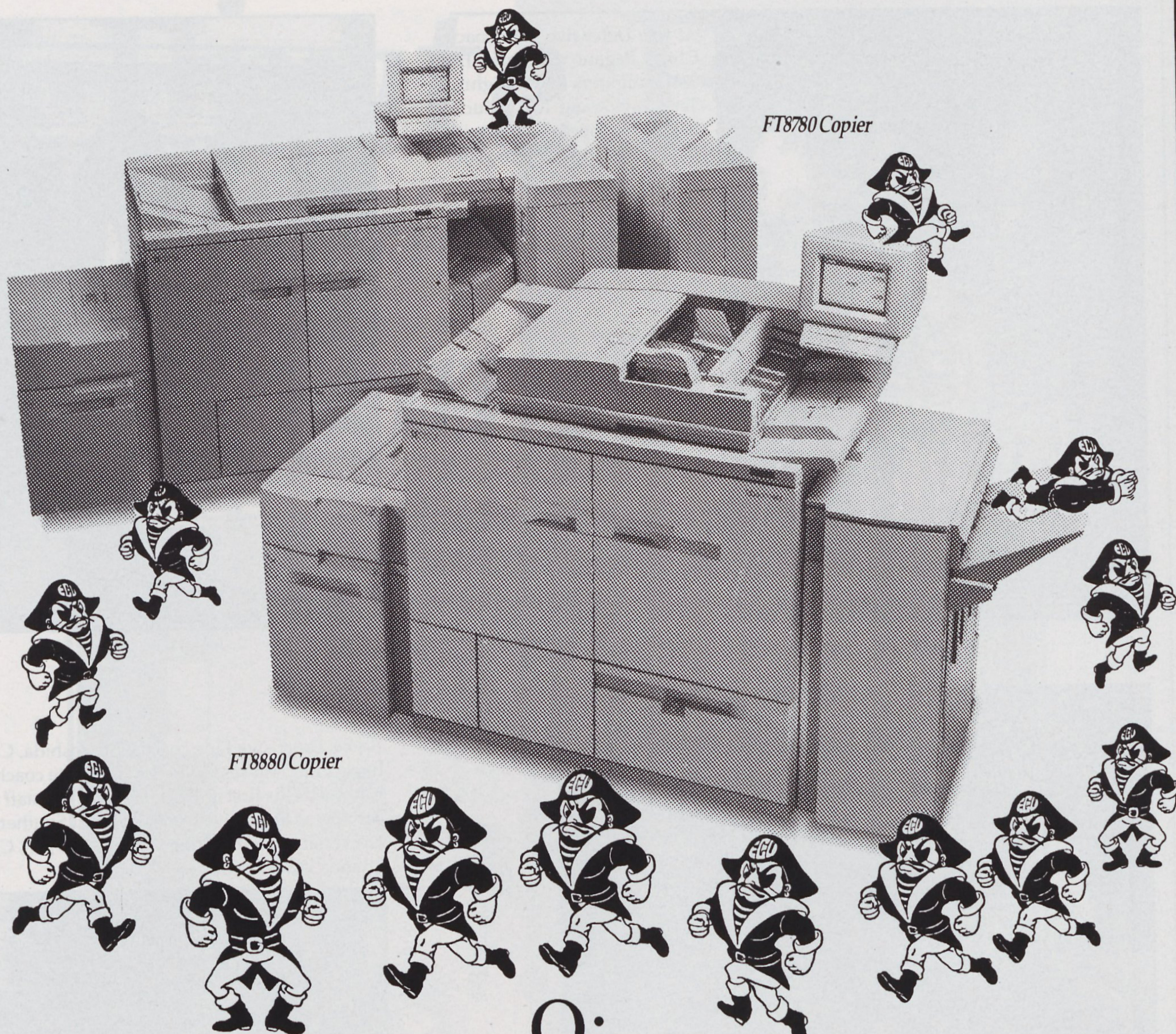

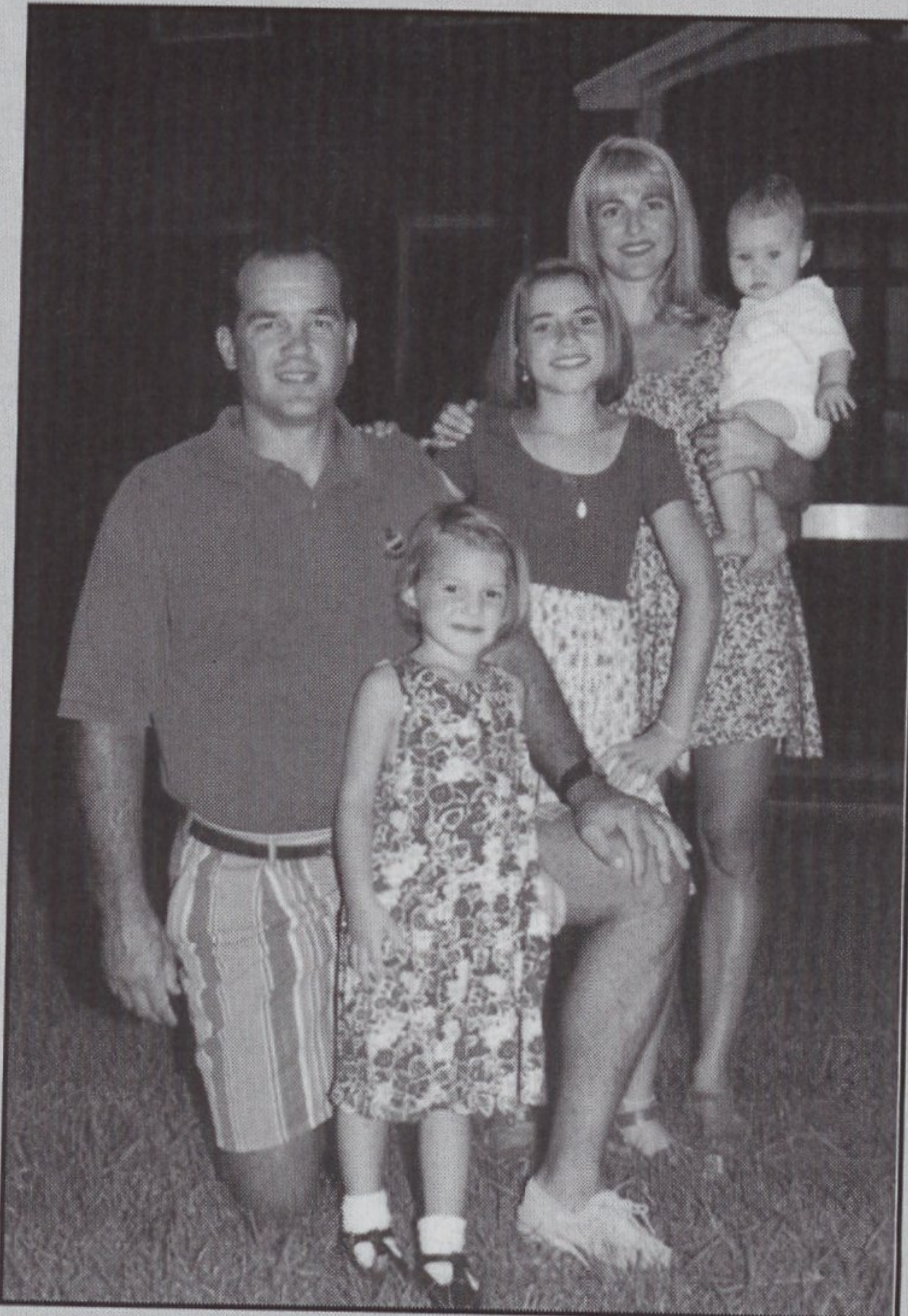

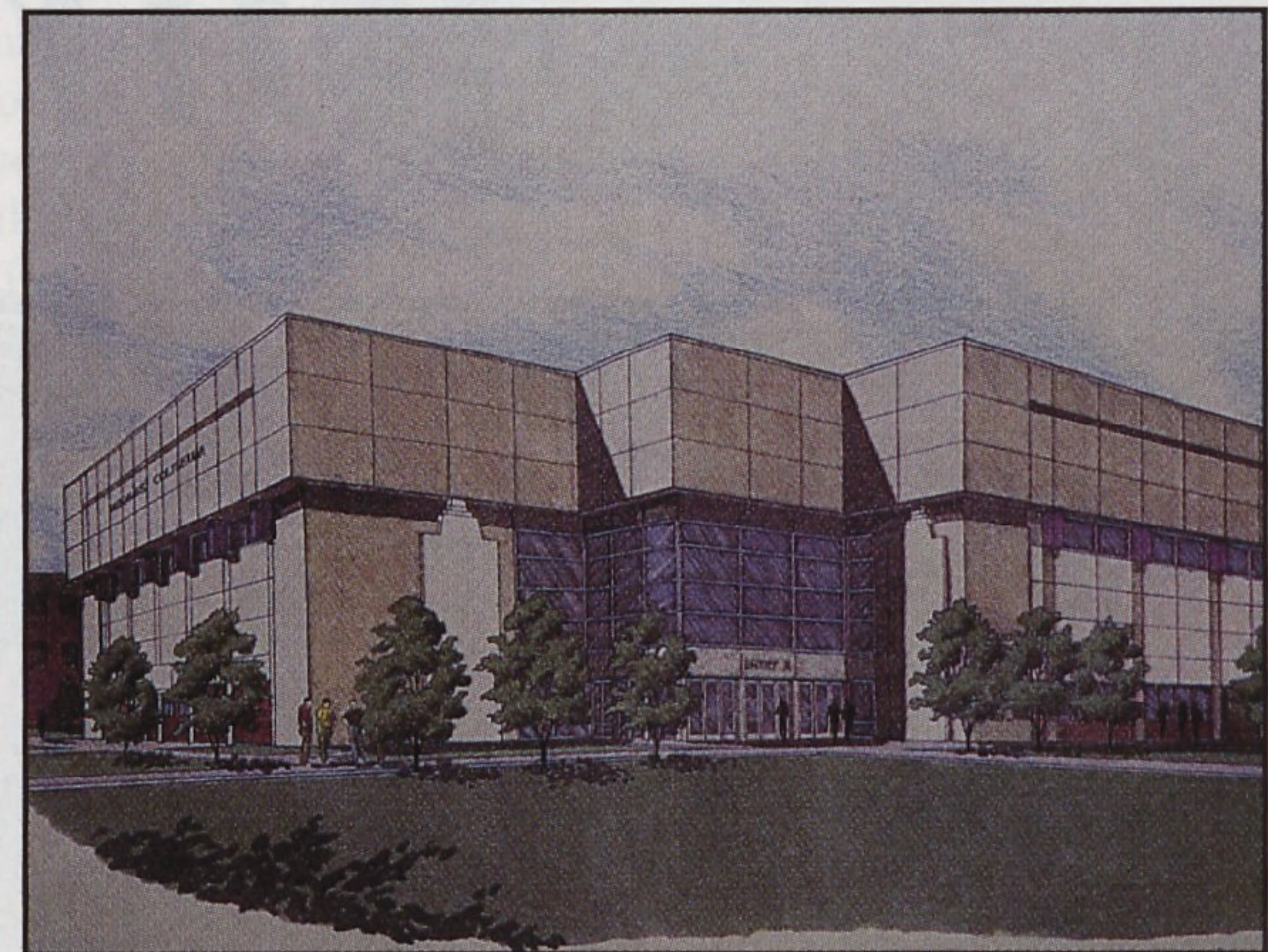
THE CAMPAIGN FOR EAST CAROLINA UNIVERSITY

As every fan knows, winning often comes down to timing. The right move at the right time often spells the difference between victory and defeat. For the athletics program at East Carolina University, the clock is ticking fast.

The University's athletics program significantly contributes to the public image of ECU. The benefits of ECU's recent national visibility extend to every department and program of the University, and to all students and alumni. Gifts that strengthen the athletics program help build ECU's

national reputation.

The athletics program at ECU is at a crossroads! The program has operated under limited financial resources. These limitations are further ap-



parent when comparing the University's athletics budget to other Division I-A institutions.

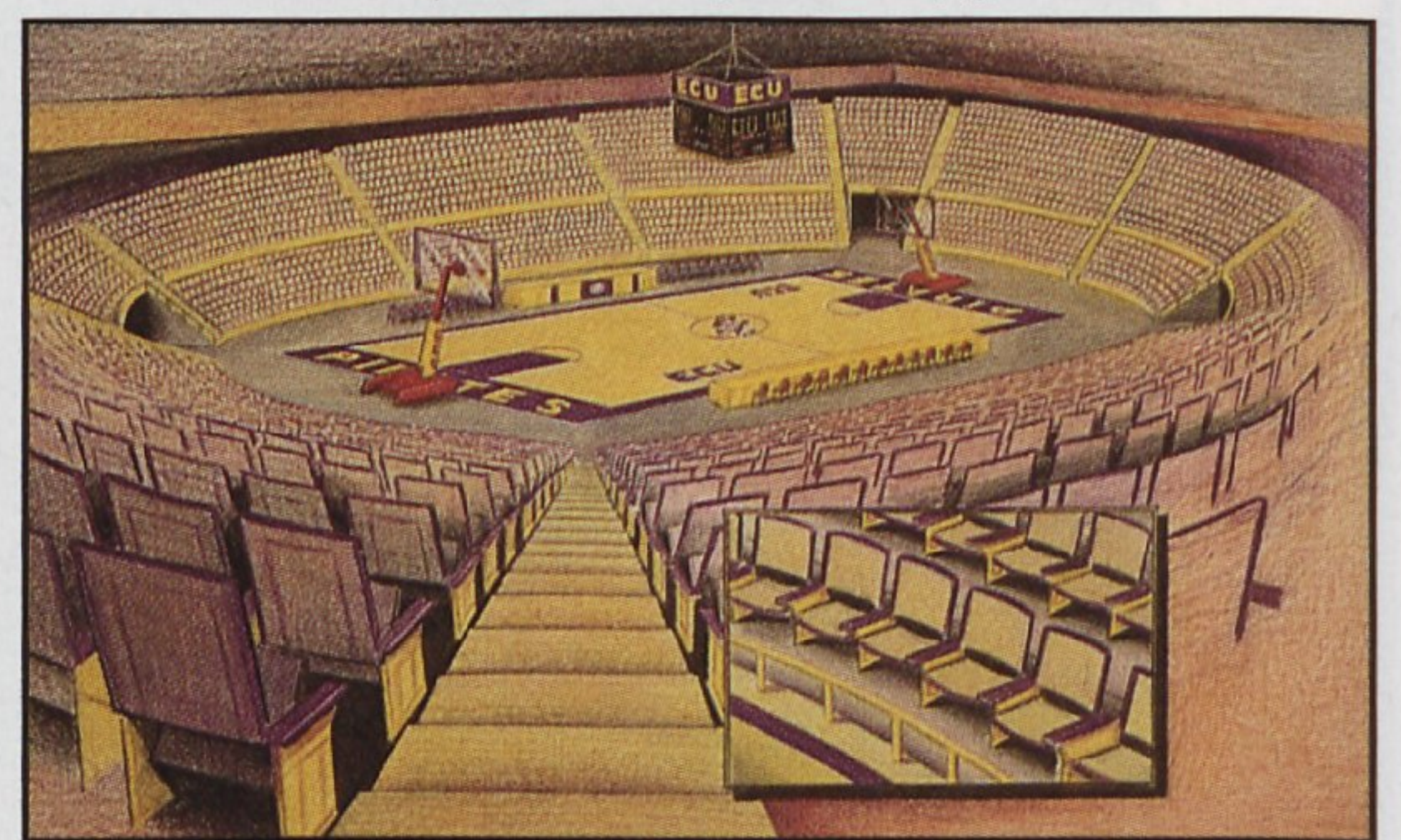
On the national scene, the ECU athletics budget is at the bottom echelon of NCAA Division I-A institutions. In the State, the athletics budget at ECU is approximately seventy percent of that of the next lowest budget of the other I-A institutions.

To improve the financial health of ECU's athletics program, we must increase revenues realized from the sale of season and individual game tickets. Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium must be expanded and further upgraded to accommodate more spectators - and make us even more competitive with other dominant teams.

In the area of athletic scholarship endowments, we are falling short of our potential. At

a minimum, our scholarship endowment fund should be at the \$2 million level by 1995. Our objective is to provide scholarship support for all sports comprising ECU's athletics program as allowed by the NCAA, so that we can attract the finest student-athletes to East Carolina University.

A special case of pride is the University's concern for the total development of student-athletes. At ECU, only academically qualified students are admitted into the athletics program. Throughout their college years, the academic, personal and career development interests of ECU student-athletes are carefully nurtured. A high-caliber, comprehensive student development program is essential to the Athletic Department. The cost associated

with endowing this program is \$1 million.

The expansion of Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium, a strong scholarship base, and a well-funded student-development program are all necessary for the ECU athletics program to move ahead. Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium

Just the name Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium reflects that the Shared Visions campaign is up and running and meeting its goals. In the spring of 1994, Ron and Mary Ellen Dowdy committed \$1 million dollars to the campaign for the expansion of Ficklen Stadium.

While the first phase of the stadium expansion was completed in the Fall of 1993 when part of the stadium's original structure was replaced, still two phases remain to be constructed.

The second phase involves the construction of a two-story structure from end one to end zone above the south side of the stadium. The structure will house a modern press box facility on the first floor and an enclosed donor seating area on the second floor. Private contributions raised through the campaign will fund the bulk of this project cost.

The final phase of expansion to the ECU football facility will make the dreams of ECU fans become a reality as the stadium's seating capacity will be increased to nearly 50,000, with an upper deck added to the south side.

The increased seating will provide ECU with a modern stadium large enough to showcase the Pirates football team and meet increased fan interest, as will as help attract major Division I-A football teams to Greenville.

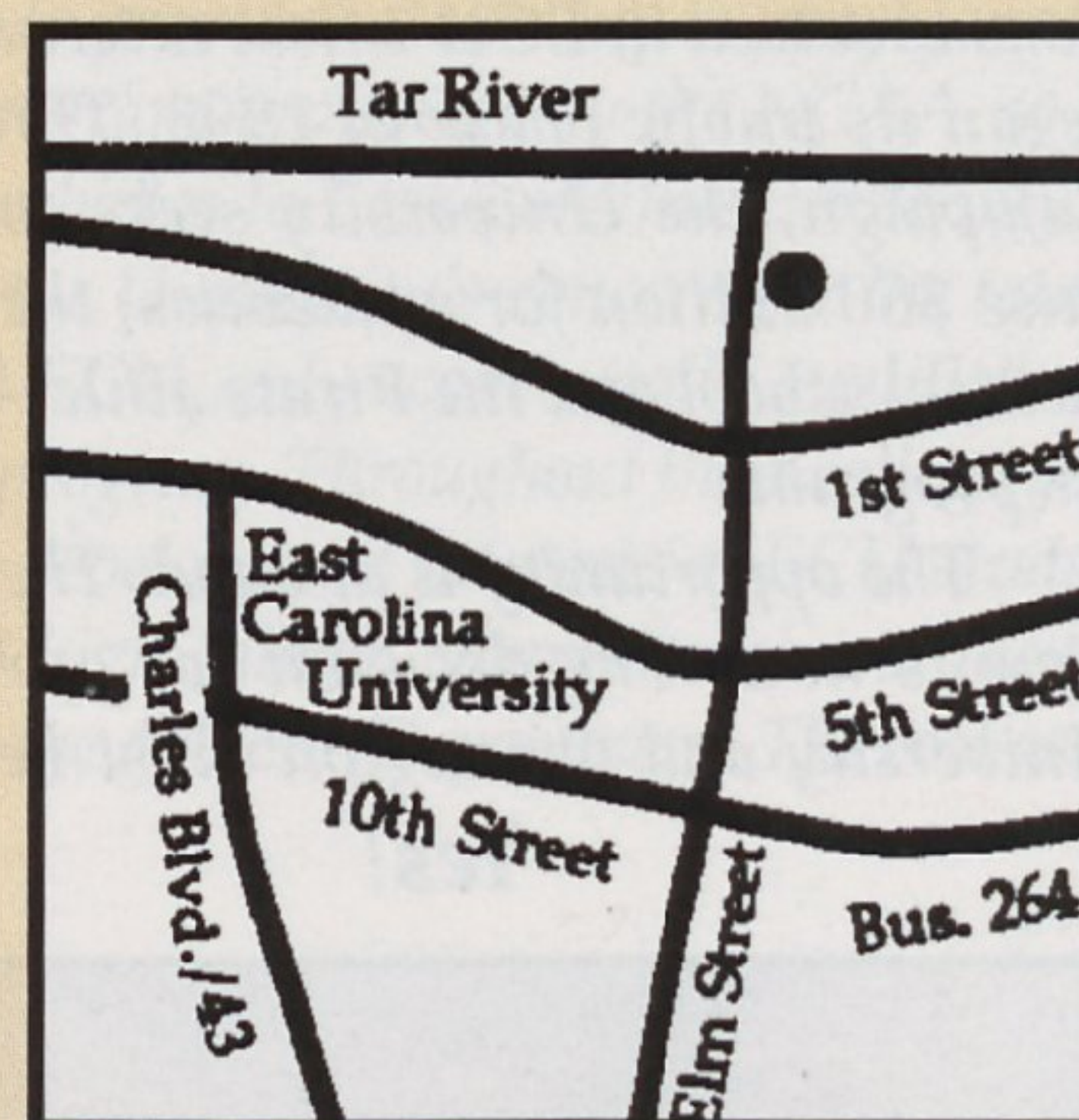

ECU Athletics Director Dave Hart, Jr

Within intercollegiate athletics circles, Dave Hart, Jr. has earned an outstanding reputation as one of the country's most respected athletics administrators. Hart has gained national recognition for his skills in the areas of athletics management, public relations, marketing and fundraising.

Since being appointed Director of Athletics at East Carolina University on December 21, 1987, Hart has led ECU Athletics to new levels of achievement. Under his leadership, ECU Athletics has gained the respect of its peers for the commitment to excellence and integrity exhibited throughout the athletics program.

While enhancing the image and reputation of ECU athletics, Hart has structured several programs of significance within the Department. The most notable might be ECU's comprehensive Student Development Program for all student-athletes. Two years ago the Department of Athletics received a half-million dollar gift, from Bob and Margaret Ward of Burlington, NC, towards the endowment of the Student Development Program. ECU has recently been selected as one of five advisory schools within the NCAA's Life Skills Pilot Program targeted for all 106 Division I-A programs. Forty-one of the 106 I-A programs have volunteered for the Pilot Program which will focus on the total development of student-athletes. Hart serves as Vice Chairman for the Missions and Values Committee of the I-A Athletics Director's Association which proposed the Life Skills Program, called CHAMPS, at the I-A level, in conjunction with the NCAA Foundation.

ECU also participated in the NCAA's Pilot Certification Program in 1991-92, as one of thirty-five Pilot schools. Athletics Certification has since been adopted for all of Division I. When the University completed its Southern Association of Colleges and Schools accreditation program in 1992, the Athletics Department received one of four commendations from the SACS review team for the manner in which the Department of Athletics is managed at ECU.

Women's athletics have made great strides during Hart's tenure as Athletics Director. Indoor Track and Soccer have been added as Lady Pirate sports while the budget for women's athletics has tripled. In addition, scholarship support for women's athletics at ECU has tripled in the last five years. In 1990 ECU initiated a "Ladies First" fund-raising concept with a goal of raising one million dollars to help endow additional scholarships for student-athletes participating on Lady Pirate teams.

Revenue growth has been one of Hart's continuing goals. Since 1989, ECU's athletics budget has more than doubled to a current level of \$8.5 million. During that same period of time, the athletics endowment fund has grown from \$300,000 to over \$2 million while the Department's fund balance has gone from a meager \$65,000 to nearly \$2 million.

Facility enhancement is tangibly evident during Hart's tenure. He has planned, overseen and spearheaded tremendous growth in facilities within the athletics complex totaling nearly \$30 million. Renovations to Scales Field House, Baseball's Harrington Field, and the Lady Pirate Softball Field, are among "facelift" projects which have been ongoing during Hart's tenure. He helped plan and coordinated the transition into the Ward Sports Medicine Building, a \$6.5 million project, which is one of the finest facilities of its kind in the nation. This winter, Williams Arena will open in Mingos Coliseum following an \$11.4 million renovation. Targeted for 1996 is a \$9 million expansion to newly named Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium to include

a state of the art press box facility and club level seating. Also, targeted for 1996 is a new \$1.5 million, two story multipurpose Pirate Club Building to house Ticket Office staff, Pirate Club functions and staff, and a 300 seat banquet hall with easy access to the Coliseum and Stadium.

Pirate athletics continue to gain in exposure and credibility under Hart's guidance. In the past three years, ECU football enjoyed six telecast appearances while finishing 11-1 and ranked #9 in the nation in 1991. The men's basketball program has also reached new levels of success and exposure, winning the CAA Championship in 1993 and making their first NCAA appearance since 1972. Pirate Baseball has made five trips to the NCAA Tournament since 1988 and the Pirate Golf team has captured the last five CAA

golf crowns. Lady Pirate Softball and men's and women's Swimming have excelled during that same time frame with the Softball team posting a school record of 42 wins in 1992. Pirate Track and Cross Country athletes have set numerous school records during the last three years, illustrating the positive growth taking place throughout the program.

Hart has served on several committees during his tenure as Director of Athletics. He was appointed in January to the prestigious NCAA Council. He also serves on the NCAA's Special Events/Post Season Bowls Committee. He Chairs the Colonial Athletic Association's Marketing Committee and serves on the CAA Gender Equity Committee.

Hart was named associate director of athletics for external relations and executive director of the Pirate Club in 1985. During his first two years in that position, the Pirate Club experienced record-setting growth as it surpassed the coveted \$1 million mark in contributions for the first time ever.

Hart first joined the ECU athletic department in 1983 as an assistant athletic director of marketing. His hiring immediately brought dividends as ECU's marketing program gained national attention for the rapid growth in crowd participation through tailgating and other promotional efforts. Hart was also responsible for implementing the "Great Pirate Purple/Gold Pigskin Pig-Out Party," which is a weekend extravaganza surrounding the spring football game.

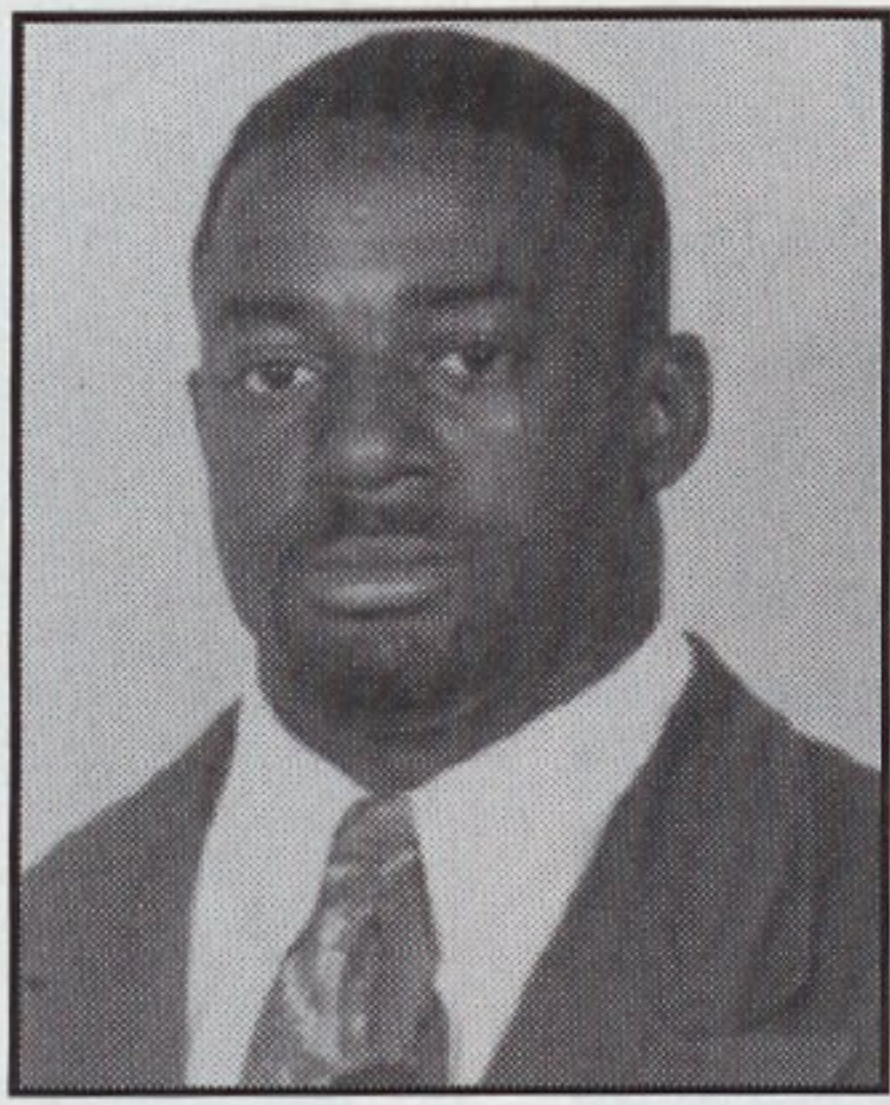
Additionally, attendance at home football games increased greatly as evidenced by the fact that 11 of the top 12 crowds in Ficklen Stadium history have entered the turnstiles since the 1983 season. Promotional ventures such as the "Ain't It Great to Tailgate" idea have added to the atmosphere at Pirate home games.

Hart is a popular speaker at the national level and has authored articles for a number of national publications. He has made numerous speaking presentations at conventions and seminars on program management, marketing, fundraising, and personnel transition. For the past seven years he has been an instructor at the National Association of College Directors of Athletics' Management Institute.

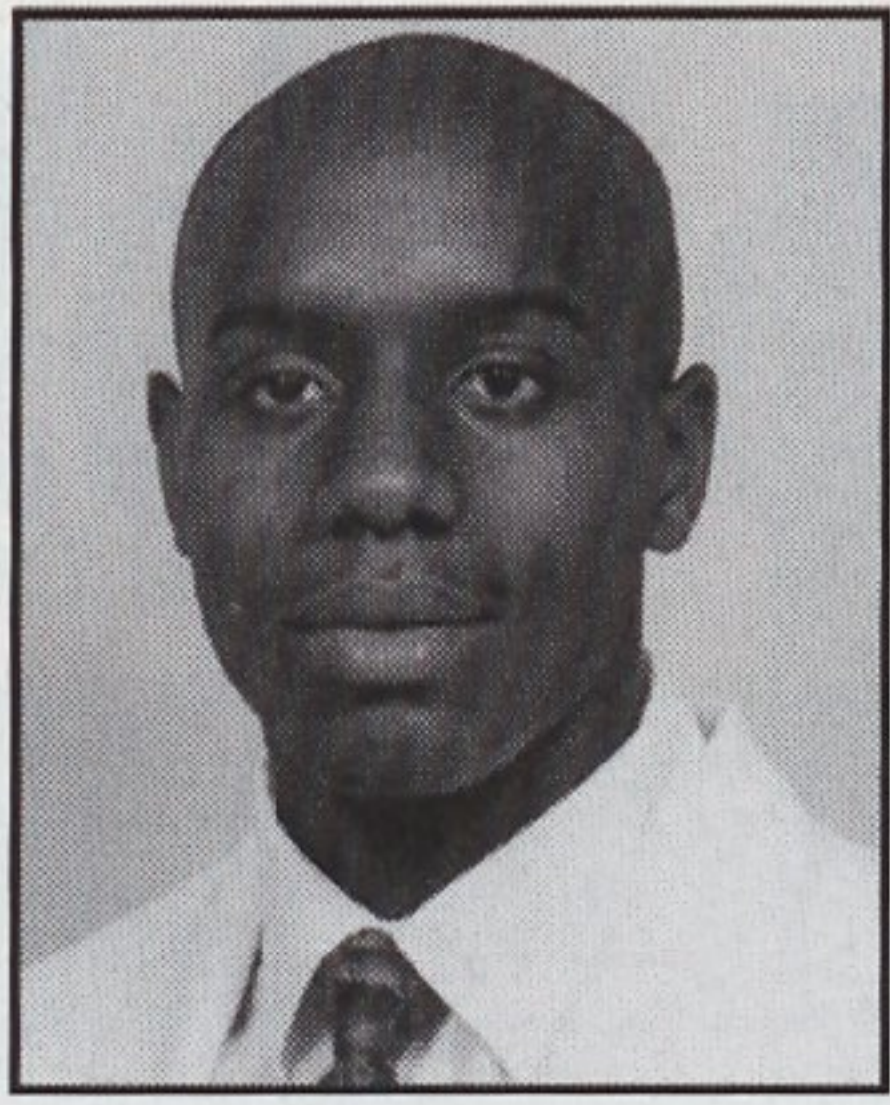
Hart, just the fifth athletics director in ECU history, received his undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Alabama, earning a B.S. in English/Speech in 1971 and a master's degree in 1972. He attended Alabama on a basketball scholarship and was a graduate assistant coach for the Crimson Tide program in 1972. He won nine varsity letters in football, basketball and baseball at Annapolis (MD) High School where he was also an All-State basketball and football player.

He is married to the former Pam Humble of Tuscaloosa, AL, and they have three children — Ricky (22), Jamie (20), and Kelly (17).

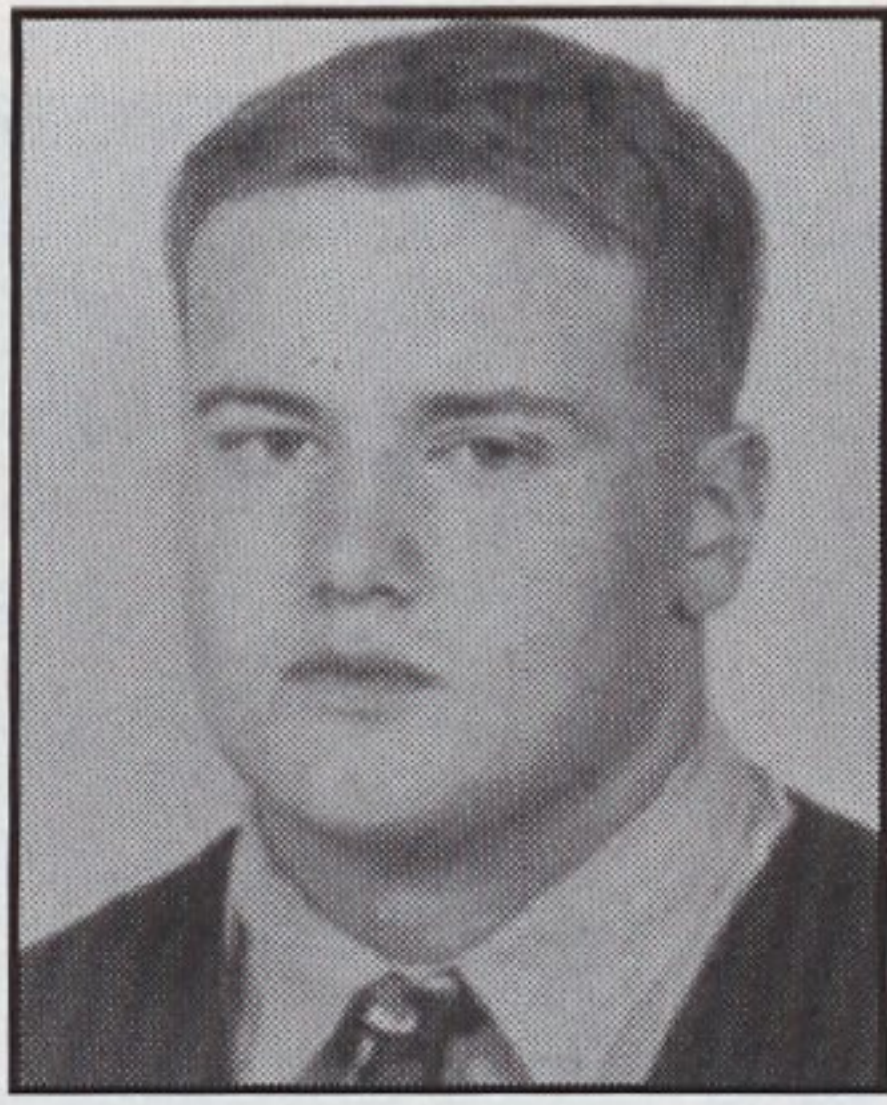

School Colors

Old Gold and Royal Purple were established as the official ECU colors in 1909.

Nickname

The Pirate, a symbol of East Carolina University and its athletic teams, was adopted from the legend and lore of coastal North Carolina and was a natural choice for the nickname when intercollegiate athletics began at the school more than 57 years ago.

Pirates, fierce and colorful, were prominent in North Carolina's colonial period. The state's Outer Banks which jut far out into the Atlantic were ideal hideouts for these legendary gangsters of the high seas. Many had homes and families in small villages along the Carolina coast.

East Carolina University's interest in pirates and sea lore began in 1934. That year, the Tecoan, the yearbook for what was then East Carolina Teachers College, carried pirates as its theme. The pages were filled with paintings and sketches of patched eye figures, tall ships and buried treasure. The book referred to the tales of the infamous "Teachy the Pirate" often told by natives in the nearby historic town of Bath.

Four numbers have been retired in the history of East Carolina University's football program. Those are numbers 16, 18, 29 and 36.

The jersey number 16 was last worn by Robert Farris, a kicker from Falls Church, Va. Farris was killed in an automobile accident while returning to campus for fall practice prior to his senior season in 1967.

The jersey number 18 was last worn by Norman Swindell, a blocking back from New Bern. The most valuable player on the 1965 team, Swindell drowned near his home during the Christmas holidays following the 1965 season.

The jersey number 29 was worn by James Speight, running back from Greenville. The MVP of the 1957 and 1959 squads, Speight still holds the school record for the most points in a single game with 26, while sixth on the all-time rushing list with 2,276 career yards.

The East Carolina University Sports Medicine Division and Curriculum, reputed to be one of the finest programs in the Southeast, affords every Pirate athlete the best available care and treatment of injuries.

The East Carolina sports medicine program offers the best possible prevention, evaluation, immediate treatment, and rehabilitation of injuries.

Acting Head Trainer Mike Hanley, Assistants Jim Bazluki and Sue Graner, Graduate Assistant Mike Myers and Team Physician Dr. John Siegel oversee the sports medicine program for football. All serve on the staff of the ECU Sports Medicine Conference and as faculty for the Sports Medicine Curriculum within the School of Health and Human Performance.

They are assisted by more than a dozen community-based professionals who lend valuable time in the athletic health care and instructing the 30 to 35 undergraduate students enrolled in ECU's sports medicine educational program for athletic trainers. Dr. Edwin Bartlett and Dr. Tally Lassiter, Jr. are the orthopaedic consultants for football.

The Sports Medicine Center is in the Ward Sports Medicine Building. The Division, which has been in operation since 1971, is now able to better serve the student-athletes and educate sports medicine student athletic trainers using the latest, state-of-the-art facilities and equipment.

The Sports Medicine Staff are in attendance at every athletic event that involves East Carolina University athletes. Radio communication from practice field to the center is a must and a sports medicine vehicle provide instant transportation for injured athletes to the Center. Prevention, evaluation, treatment, and rehabilitation are the main objectives of the Sports Medicine Division and when an injury does occur, the staff provides on-the-spot treatment to make certain the injury does not become more serious.

SMITH SET TO MA

This afternoon, Junior Smith's pursuit of Carlester Crumpler's all-time rushing record at East Carolina continues against Southern Mississippi. At some point in today's game, if he rushes for 45 yards, he could become ECU's all-time rushing leader. However, that is the last thing on his mind, as he leads the Pirates into battle with the Eagles.

He wants to downplay the fact that he is about to make history and rumble into the East Carolina record books. He doesn't want to focus on the stats sheets, only the scoreboard. You see, that is Junior Smith, a team-oriented player.

Smith knows the importance of today's game for the ECU football program in general, as the Pirates attempt to get back in the race for the Liberty Bowl. He would much rather sacrifice the record book for a win.

"It will be nice," said Smith when asked the question about his feelings towards eclipsing Crumpler for the all-time record. "However, I'm not really focused on the record. I'm more focused on Southern Mississippi. This game will be a big factor in our chances of making the Liberty Bowl. It would be nice getting the record at home, but I'd rather win the game."

It has been a long-time and coming for the native of Fayetteville, N.C., who is putting the finishing touches on what has been a brilliant collegiate career. His presence and electrifying runs have captured the hearts of many, including the Voice of the Pirates, Jeff Charles.

"Junior Smith is a young man who has a great perspective on life," said Charles, who has watched Smith emerge into one of the most unsung backs in the country. "He realizes God has blessed him with incredible physical gifts. It's so refreshing to meet a talented athlete who remains humble. Junior is a great football player and a great person."

At the completion of this season, Smith's eligibility will have run out,

but his memories will last forever. Though his performances are often unnoticed by the nation, however, they aren't overlooked by the ECU faithful.

"The one play I'll remember is the opening play of the Kentucky game, last year," said Charles. "Junior took a tremendous shot from a linebacker. That would have leveled any other back. He bounced off the would be tackler, like a pinball and went 63 yards. It was a special run from a special player."

Stardom is nothing new for Smith. Only five years ago, he led the State of North Carolina in rushing, gaining 2,454 yards his senior season at E.E.

Smith High School. At the time, his mark was the second highest rushing total in state history, to Anthony Barbour of Garner. The former North Carolina State standout rushed for 3,125 yards his senior season in 1987.

Despite taking the Golden Bulls almost single handedly to the semi-finals, division I recruiters weren't exactly knocking down the door for the phenom. His ability wasn't the problem, however his size was.

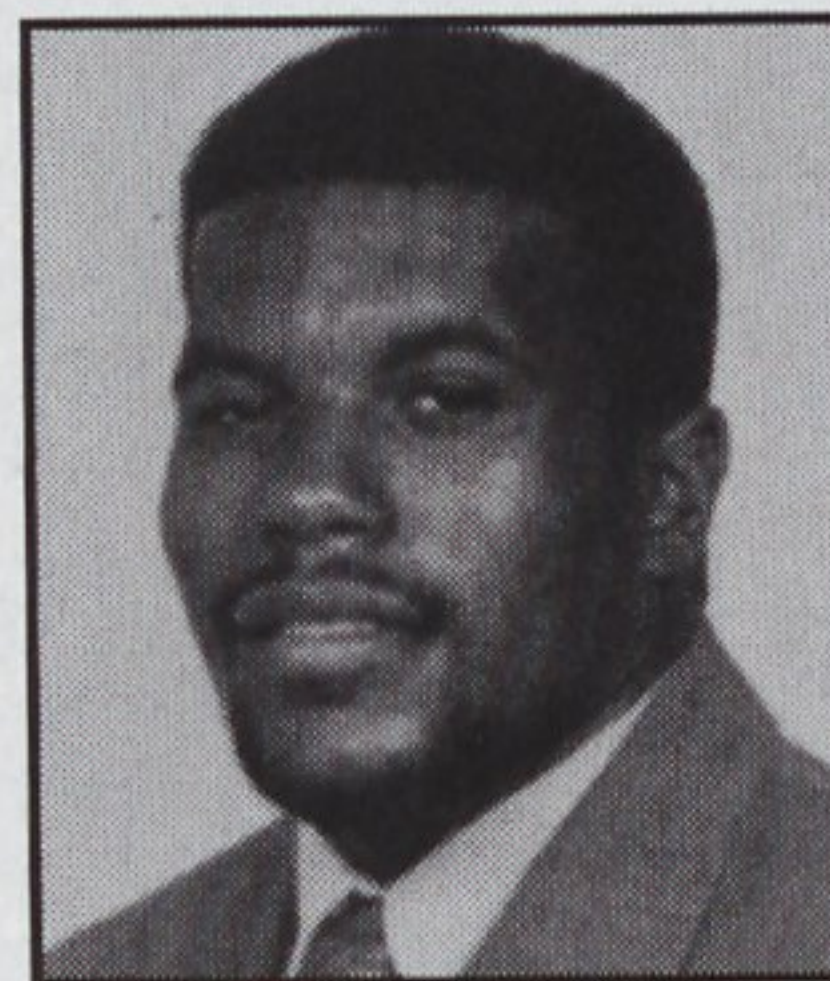
"Sure it was a problem," said current Greenville-Rose High School Coach Lonnie Baker, who coached Smith in high school. "ECU didn't show interest in him in the beginning. When Lee Becton decided to go to Notre Dame, ECU then turned to Junior."

Smith pondered going to Pittsburgh, Minnesota and Appalachian State, of which Smith made a verbal commitment. When the opportunity to don a Pirate uniform came available, Smith took it and the rest is — or will be — history.

Once hitting Greenville for his freshman season, he just wanted a chance to prove his worth. Little did

he realize in two years, he would become a 1,000-yard rusher, in three years earn honorable mention All-American honors, and finally in four years become ECU's all-time rusher.

"When I stepped on campus, my first goal was to try not to red-shirt," said Smith, insinuating that if he worked hard enough and showed the coaching staff his talents he would crack the Pirate line-up his freshman season. "I always wanted to be a 1,000-yard rusher."

Smith made the best of his opportunities and wasn't red-shirted. In fact, he was the lone true-freshman to play in the season-opener against Illinois in 1991. Smith rushed the ball nine times for 39 yards against the Illini.

He made the trip with the Pirates to the Peach Bowl against North Carolina State, but did not play. Ironically, Barbour was on the other sidelines, playing for North Carolina State as a junior.

Smith's sophomore season started out slow as Syracuse and Virginia Tech held him to a combined 65 yards. Smith rushed for 133 yards

against South Carolina in the third game of the season. However, it wasn't until the next to last game which propelled Smith into stardom. His 243-yard performance against Arkansas State started his conquest towards re-writing the ECU record books.

Smith was on a mission right from the start of the 1993 season, as he racked up 168 yards against Syracuse. Several other 100-plus efforts were had in Central Florida, Memphis State, South Carolina again and Kentucky. Then came what could be classified as the best rushing performance in ECU history.

"I'll always remember Junior's performance against Tulsa in the mud last year," said Charles, remembering Smith's record-setting performance. "He rushed for 282 yards, while blowing through the Golden Hurricane all day."

Smith went on to rush for an ECU record 1,352 yards in 1993, finishing sixth in the nation in rushing yards per game. He would garner All-Independent Football Alliance and All-South Independent honors, as well as being named honorable mention All-America by Football News.

Hopefully, Smith will have the chance to follow in the footsteps of former ECU running backs Tony Collins and Earnest Byner into the NFL. He has overcome many doubters before. He is the true epitome of what hard work, dedication and drive can do for a person.

"Imagine being told your entire life that you're too small to play and then become an all-America," said Charles. "Junior's dedication, attitude, work ethic and faith proved the skeptics wrong. He's a great inspiration to every player out there who's being told he's 'too small'."

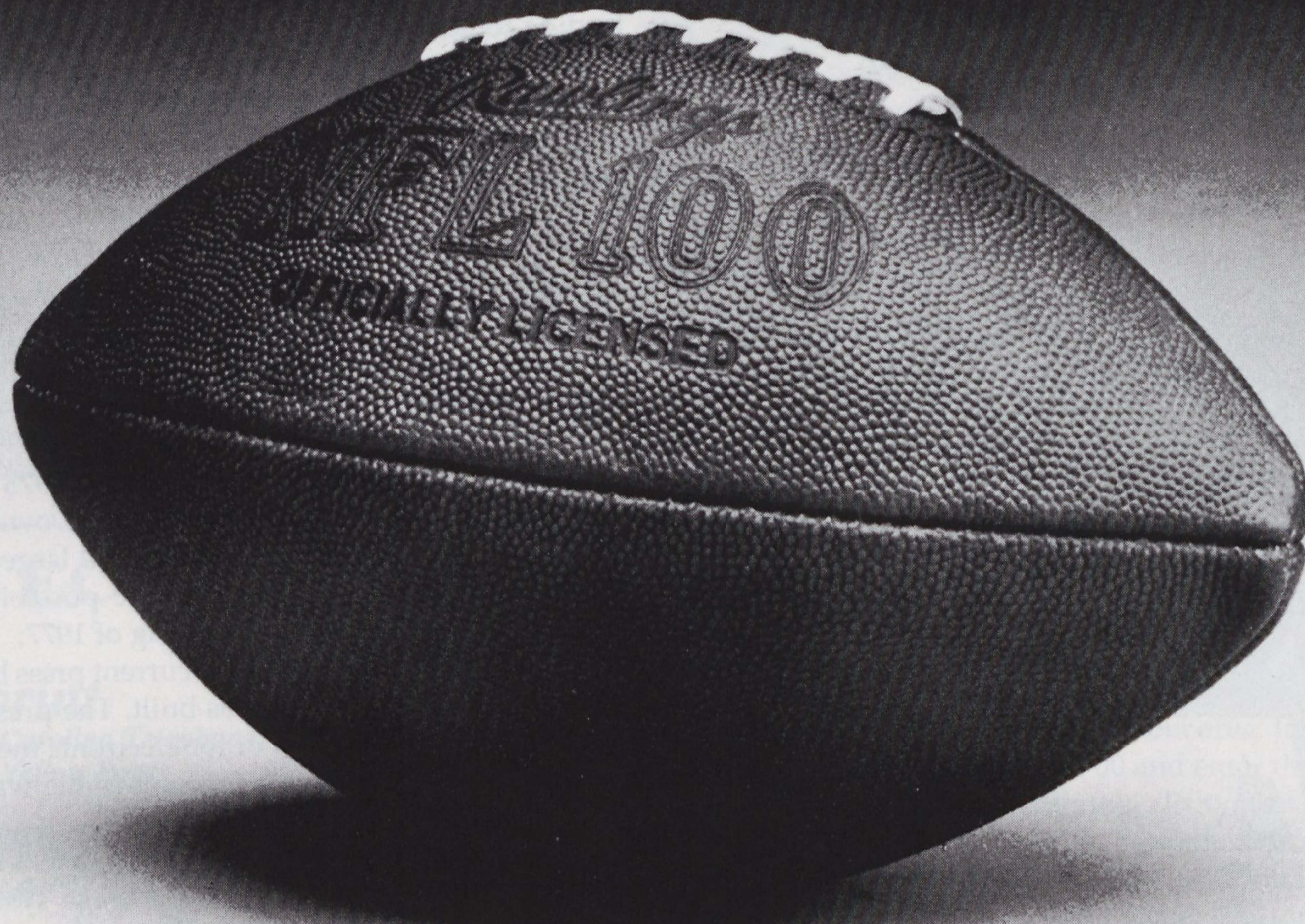

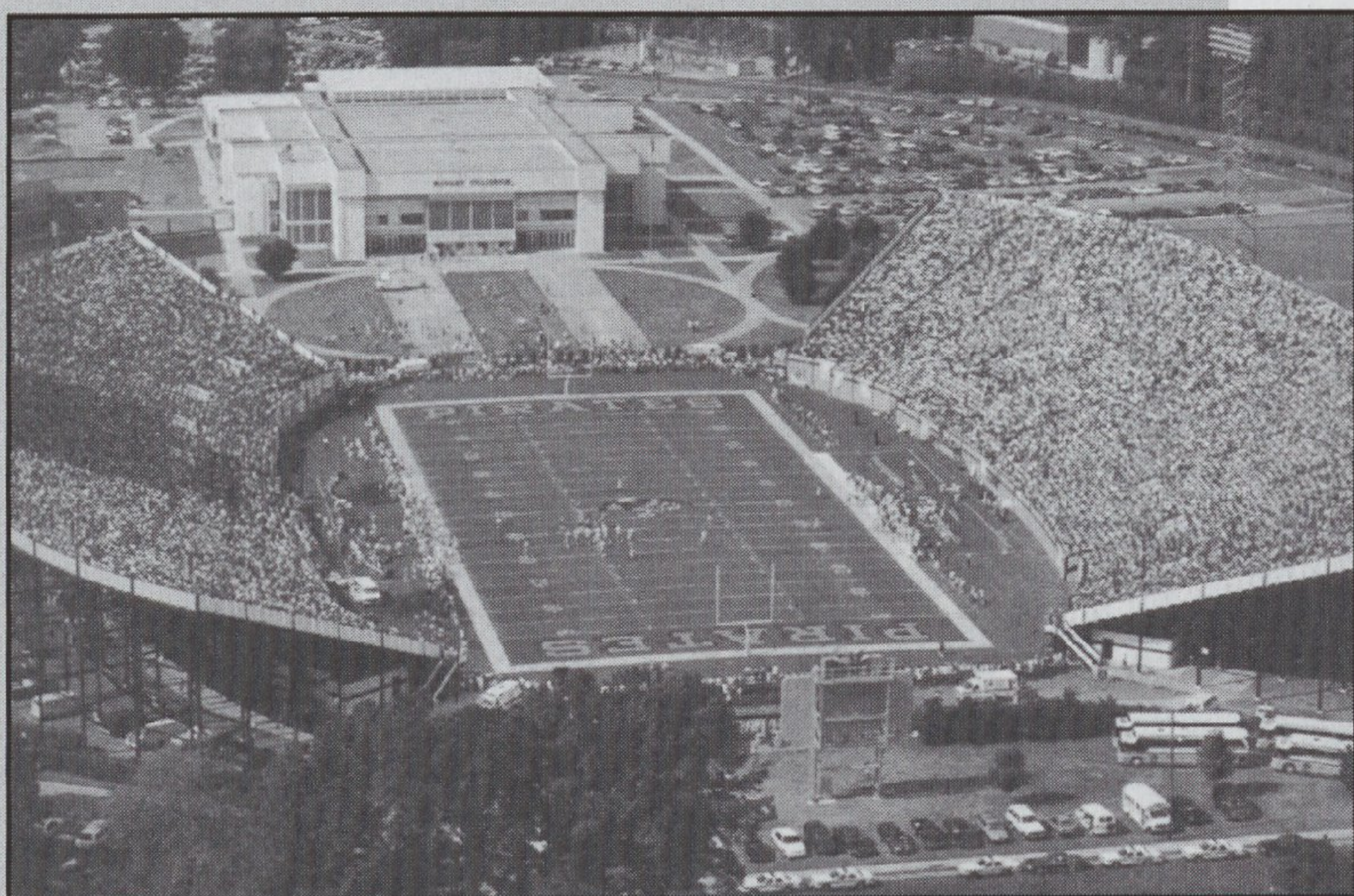

The James Skinner Ficklen Memorial Stadium was dedicated on September 21, 1963, with East Carolina defeating Wake Forest 20-10.

In April, 1994, Ron and Mary Ellen Dowdy, of Orlando, Fla., announced a \$1 million gift to the ECU Educational Foundation. The gift will go toward the planned expansion of ECU's football stadium, which will be renamed Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

Ron Dowdy, who is a member of the school's Board of Trustees, currently oversees commercial leases, residential apartments and several other enterprises, as part of Dowdy Properties in Orlando.

Dowdy, a 1966 graduate of ECU, has been involved with many civic organizations, including the Executive Committee of the Florida Citrus Sports Association, the Board of Directors for the Florida Citrus Bowl, the Board of Directors at Humana Hospital Lucerne in Orlando and the Senior Citizen Advisory Committee in Orange County.

The original plan for the stadium was announced on Oct. 7, 1961, by Dr. Leo Jenkins, Chancellor of the College, at a meeting of the Society of Buccaneers.

Within a year, \$283,387 had been raised, although the goal had been only \$200,000. With the funds in hand, Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium was built.

The original stadium consisted of the permanent stands on the south side, a small press box and the old lighting system which was removed after the 1974 season. Total cost was \$300,000.

The north side permanent seating was constructed in 1968, increasing the stadium seating capacity to 20,000.

The stadium was named for the late James Skinner Ficklen, a Greenville resident, who distinguished himself as one of America's leading tobacconists. At the time of his death in 1955, Ficklen was President and Chairman of the Board of the E.B. Ficklen Tobacco Company of Greenville. He was a close friend of the College and established a financial aid foundation, the Ficklen Foundation, to aid students of the College.

The first major change in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium was the lighting systems, a change that occurred just before the 1975 season opened. The old inner stadium lights on six poles were removed and replaced with six towers outside the stadium. The system is a combination of metallic and incandescent lights. There are 288 fixtures of 1500 watts each on six 162-foot towers. Cost of the system was \$450,000.

A radical change greeted fans as the 1978 season opened. An expansion on all four corners boosted Dowdy-Ficklen's seating capacity from 20,000 to 35,000, the third largest stadium in North Carolina. This expansion was made possible with 2 1/2 million dollars through a drive in the spring of 1977.

In addition to more seats, the current press box with three levels and an elevator for access was built. The press box has space for 92 writers and an entire floor for electronic media. Also, a modern scoreboard with a lightbank message center was placed on the east end of Dowdy-Ficklen.

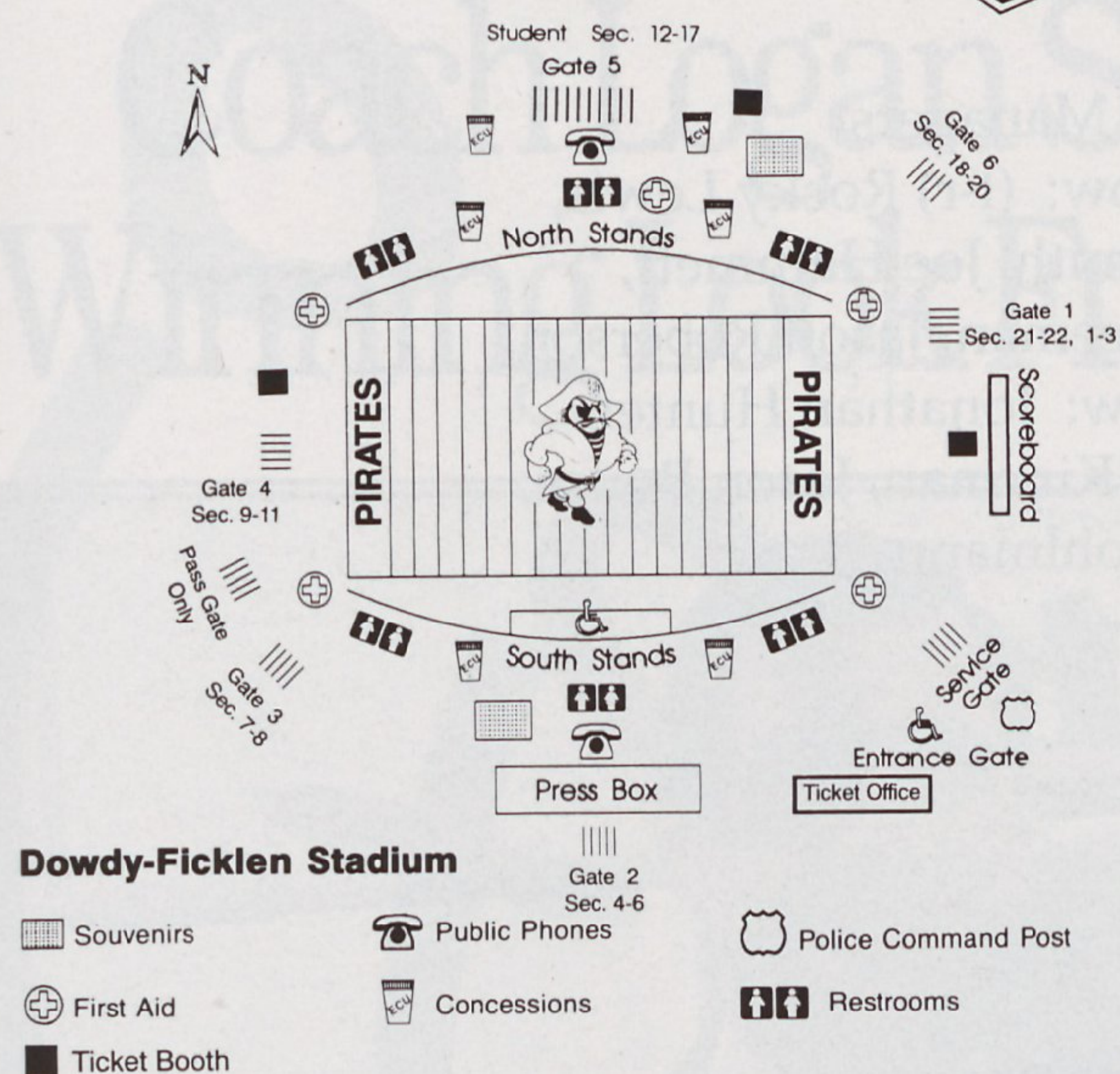
During the summer of 1983, a complete renovation took place on the playing surface. A new drainage system, a new base of gravel and sand, new treated topsoil and a new grass was installed. The new grass, Tifton 419 Hybrid Bermuda was sprigged at the rate of 600 bushels per acre.

The 1992 season saw the season attendance record fall in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium as the Pirates drew a school-record 164,068 fans for five home games.

Future plans call for expansion of Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium, with an upper deck. That would add an estimated 15,000 seats, giving the stadium a capacity of 50,000. Also, plans call for a renovation of the press box, enlarging it to include a club seating level.



Stadium Information



Artificial Noisemakers: Artificial noise-makers are not permitted in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

Alcoholic Beverages: Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the stadium.

Banners/Flag: Banners hung in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium must be approved by 5 p.m. Thursday prior to the day of the game. Call: (919) 328-4530 for approval. For the convenience and safety of all fans, flags on poles are not permitted in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

Containers/Coolers: Containers and coolers are prohibited in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

Field Regulations: No one is allowed on the playing field during or after the game without credentials. Stadium ramps must be used for exit. Fans may be ejected for throwing any objects within the stadium.

First Aid: The First Aid facility is located under the North stands behind Section 19 (between Gate 5A and 6) with a nurse on duty at all times. Rescue Squad units are located at both ends of the field.

Game Times: All game times are subject to change. ECU will publicize any game time changes. Ticket refunds will not be made because of a change in schedule of kick-off time.

Gate Inspection: Point of stadium entry inspection of parcels, bags, and the like may occur. Any alcoholic beverages or other items not permitted inside the stadium must be discarded before entering the facility.

Handicapped Access: An entrance for the handicapped is located at the service game entrance at the Southeast corner of the stadium near Section 1, with a seating section available in the South stands at field level directly in from of the press box.

Lost & Found: A "Lost & Found" station is set up at Gate 1 at the score board end of Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium. If you find an item, please turn it in to the attendant at the Station. To recover a lost item, make identification of the item with the attendant.

Public Telephones: A telephone for public use is located under the South stands at Section 6 and under the North stands at Section 167.

Requests for Assistance: Request for assistance should be directed to stadium ushers, located at every ramp throughout the stadium, for your convenience.

Rest Rooms: Rest rooms are located under the North and South stands and can be reached by exit from any portal.

Stadium Personnel: Anyone having questions regarding Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium security of personnel should call (919) 328-4503.

Stadium Re-admittance: There is a "no re-admittance" policy in effect at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

Tickets for ECU Football: Tickets for all ECU athletic contests can be purchased through the Athletic Ticket Office Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. -5 p.m. Tickets on the day of an ECU home football game can be purchased at ticket booths, conveniently located around the stadium.

Ticket Refunds/Resale: Tickets cannot be resold at the Dowdy-Ficklen Site. Lost or stolen tickets are not a responsibility of management and additional tickets can be purchased through the ticket office. There is a No Cash refund policy in effect on all tickets. The management reserves the right to refuse admission.

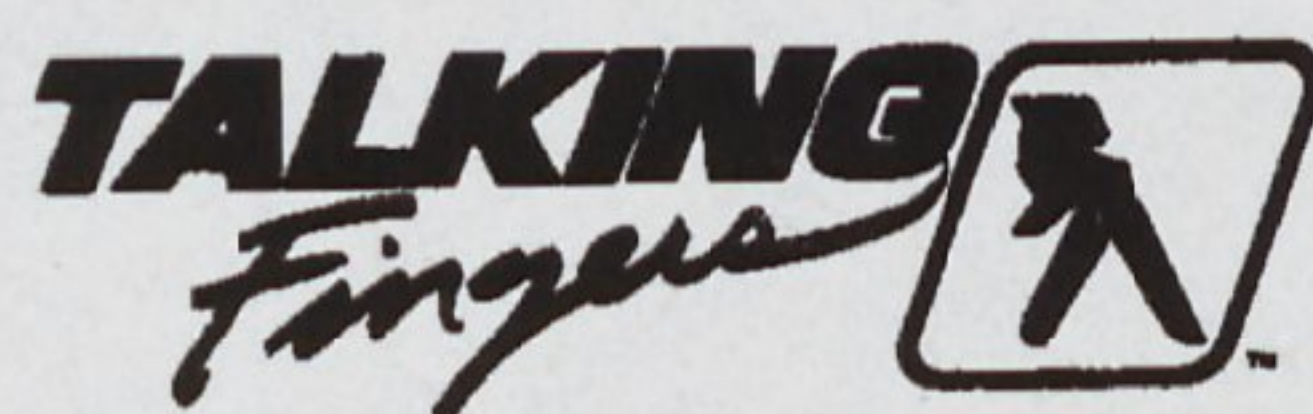

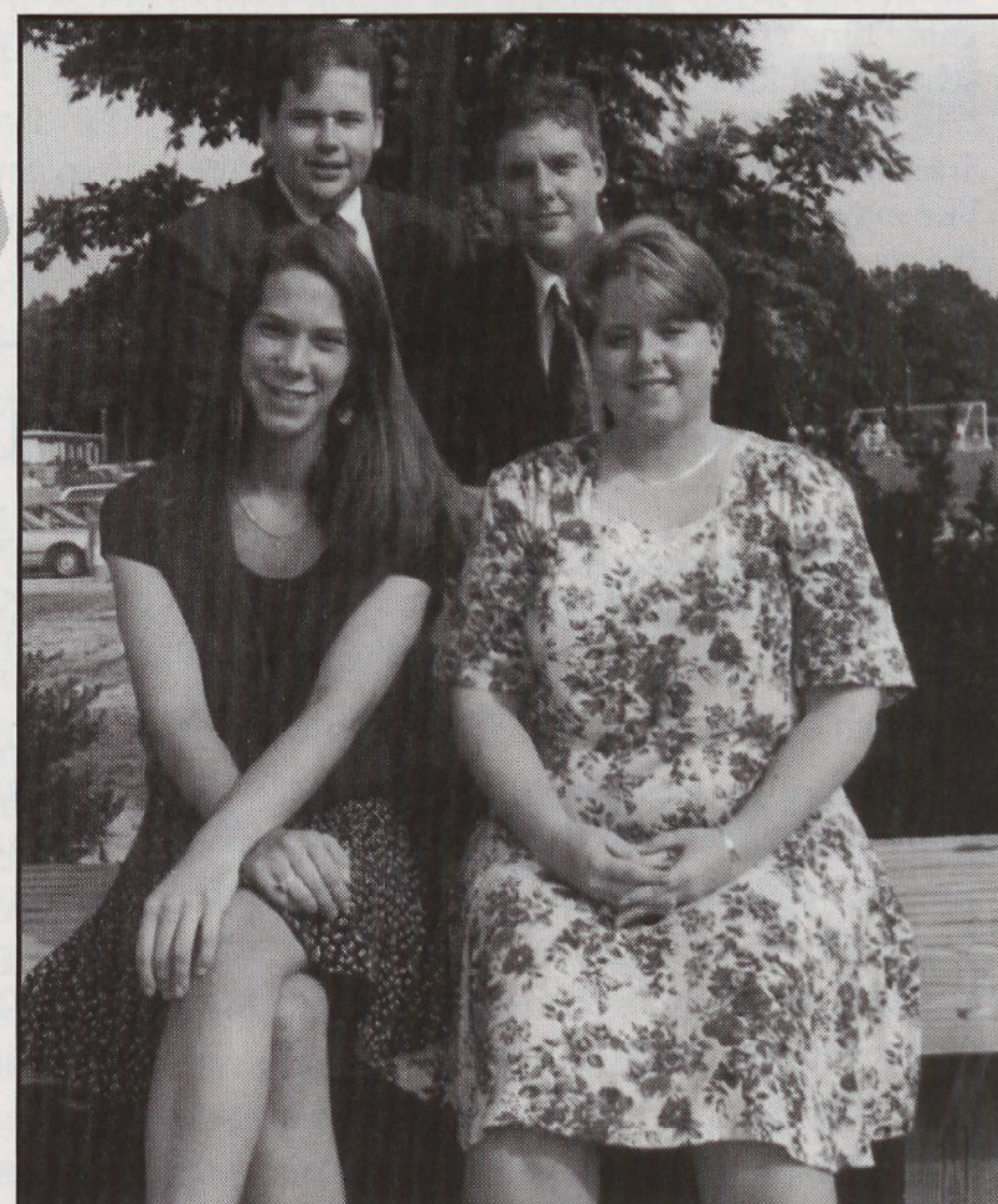

DePasquale Looks to Lead ECU to Success

Women's Soccer Begins Inaugural Season

Women's soccer at East Carolina University jumps to the intercollegiate level this season for the first time in the school's history. Competition abounds as club soccer is part of ECU's past.

Junior Robyn DePasquale scored two goals to lead the Lady Pirates to their first intercollegiate victory against UNC Wilmington, 3-2, on Sept. 7.

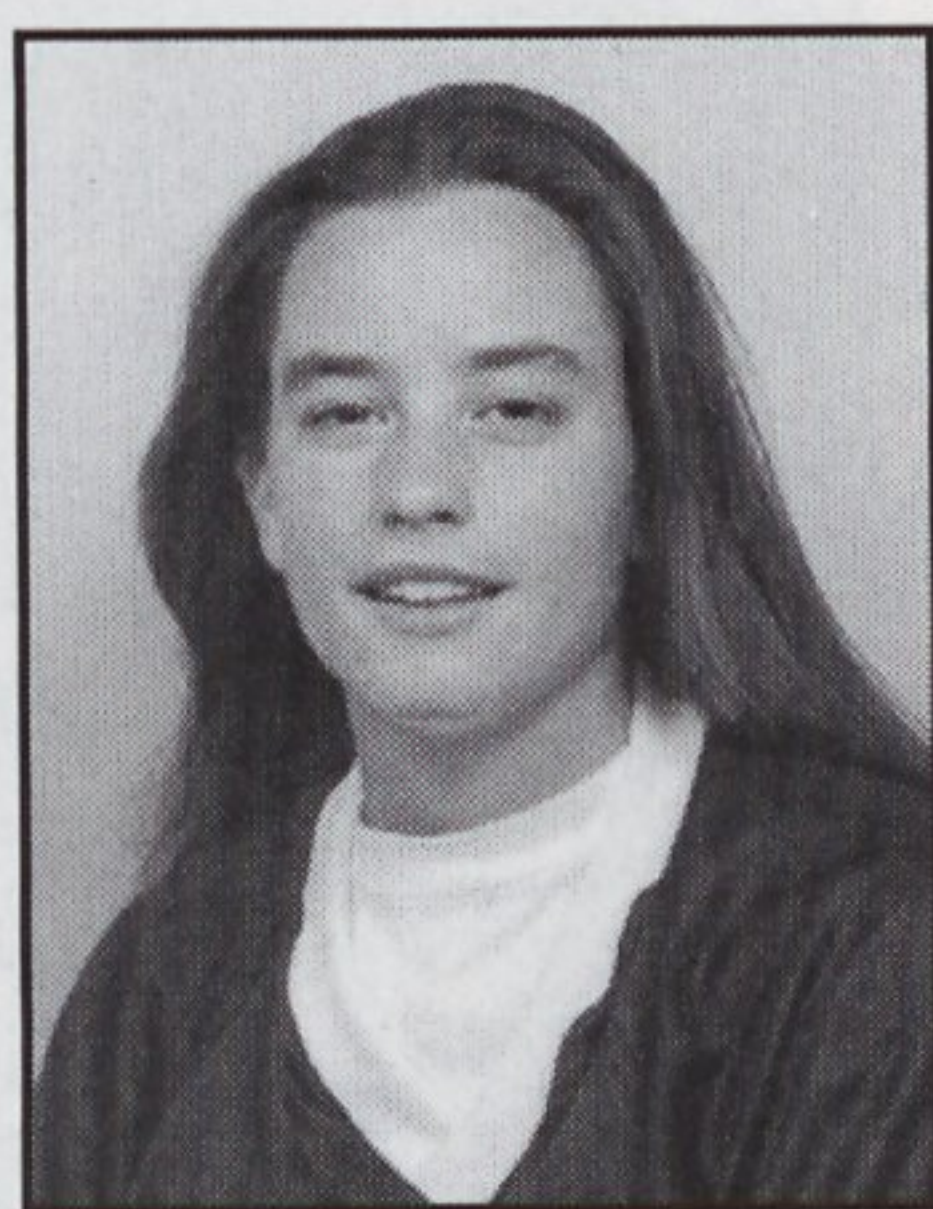
"The win helped us a lot. We needed the extra boost, and I think we are coming together well," explained DePasquale. "The first year for a team is tough, but it's also exciting and challenging."

ECU Assistant Coach Colette Gilligan feels that every time out, the players come together more as a team.

"Working as a team is not an automatic process; players must learn each other's habits and tendencies, which takes a long time," said Gilligan.

A tri-captain for the Pirates, DePasquale leads the team in scoring and is ranked among the leaders in the CAA statistics. Maureen Corcoran and Jill Wagner also serve as team captains.

DePasquale, a twenty year-old Baltimore, Md. native, came to ECU from Essex Community College, where she played soccer for two years on the junior college level.



Achievement is a usual occurrence for DePasquale. She feels her greatest achievement in soccer was winning the Junior College National Championship at Essex in 1993. She played a significant role in the victory being named Most Valuable Player of the tournament.

"The victory was a real high because it was the first time Essex ever won Nationals, and we were the underdogs," exclaimed DePasquale.

Other recognitions DePasquale has received during her collegiate career are being named two time Junior College All-American (1992, 1993) and Junior College All-Region (1992).

DePasquale's former Essex teammates, Stacey Schott, Leigh Biggerman, and Therese Merritt have also joined the Lady Pirate team. Schott and Biggerman have recorded significant playing time, while Merritt has been red-shirted.

DePasquale is a versatile player for the Lady Pirates and can play several positions. This season she has

played both center midfield and left midfield.

Coach Gilligan sees DePasquale as a great contribution to the team with broad leadership abilities and skills.

"She has a great attitude and love for the game. She gives 110%," said Gilligan.

"Robyn is the kind of player I would like to play alongside, because I respect her work ethic and skill level," Gilligan said.

DePasquale has developed that work ethic and sharpened her skills during the last ten years.

"I began playing soccer when I was eight or nine and have been playing ever since," said DePasquale, who shows a great love for soccer. "I grew up with the sport, all my friends played, and I enjoy the team unity."

When asked about her hobbies and extra curricular activities, DePasquale responded, "Soccer is my hobby. I mainly just go to school and play soccer; there's no time for much else." DePasquale did play basketball in high school and enjoys playing tennis.

Like many athletes, DePasquale often looks a little beyond skills and wishes for a little luck. "I have worn the same shinguards a teammate gave me since before Nationals last season," explained DePasquale about her soccer superstitions.

Following the '94 season, DePasquale will have one year of soccer eligibility left. She hopes the end of her playing career will not be the end of her relationship with soccer. Sports management is her intended major, and she desires to either coach a women's soccer team or be an athletic director.

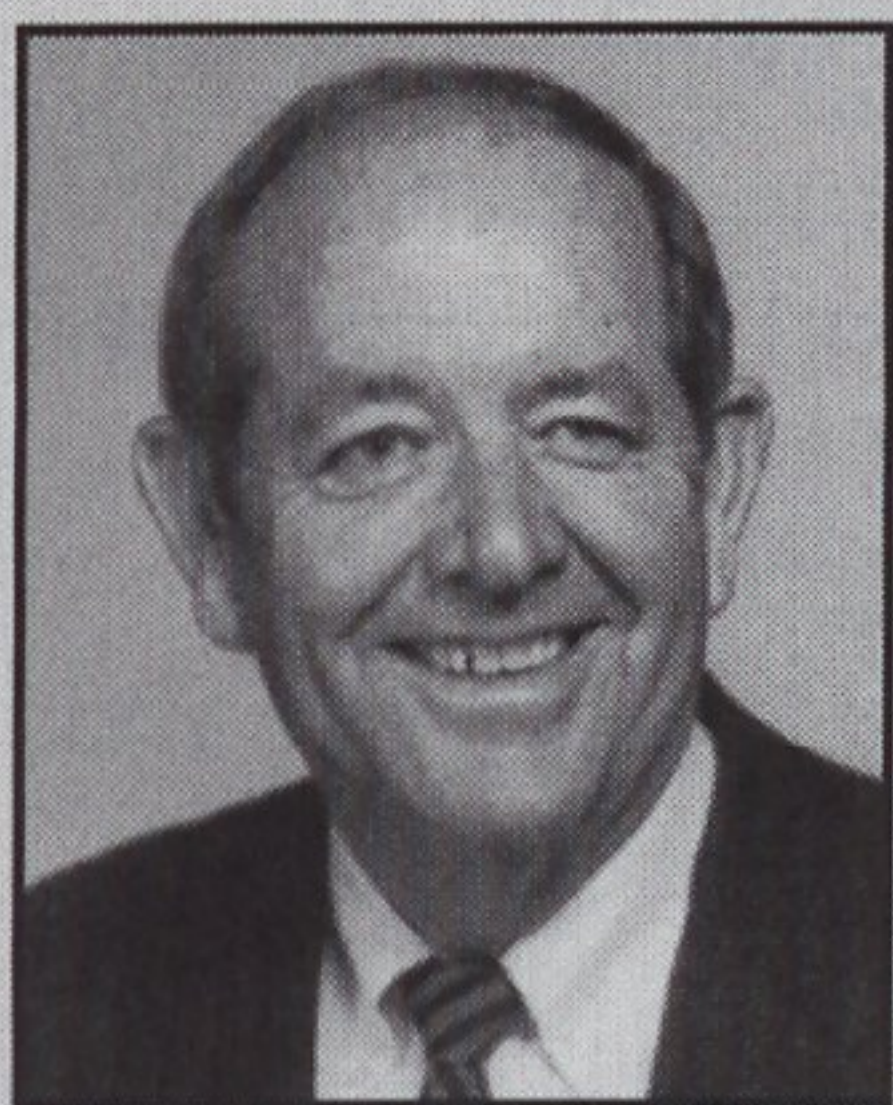

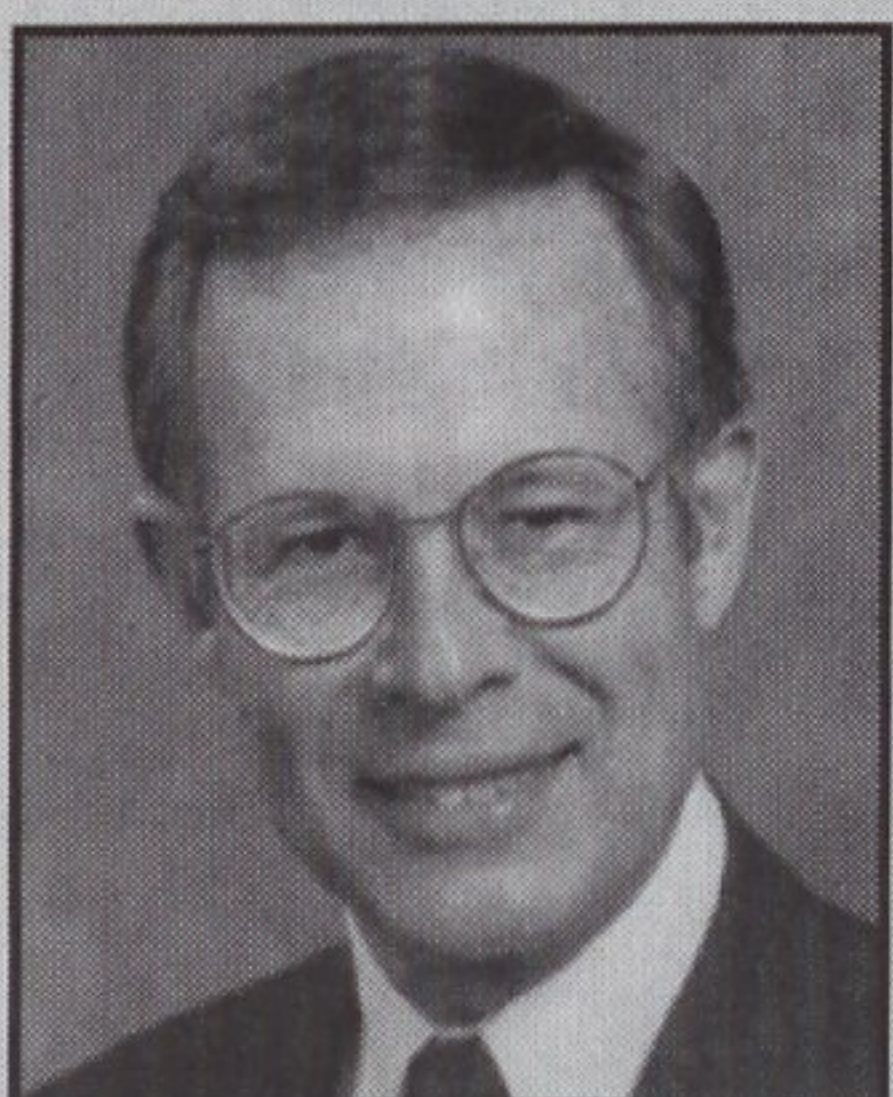

Buckhalter and McGee Lead Golden Eagle Offense

Success was a long time in coming for Southern Mississippi's junior tailback Chris Buckhalter.

After three years of ups and downs, mostly downs, Buckhalter is poised on the edge of realizing his vast potential. The breakthrough has come none to soon.

Buckhalter, along with senior backfield mate Howard McGee, opened the 1994 season in grand fashion at Tulane. Both players set career marks for carries and yardage in that game — Buckhalter with 30 for 186 yards and McGee with 13 for 141 yards. Because of the strong combined effort by the duo, teammates began calling them the "One-Two Punch."

The effort surprised a lot of Golden Eagle fans, but the least surprised by the outburst was Buckhalter, McGee, their coaches and teammates.

"We both felt like we were capable of doing that, but we were both just concentrating on going out and playing as hard as we possible could," McGee said. "We knew something positive would happen if we did that."

That, according to USM running backs coach Mike Williams, has been the biggest difference among his troops this season. Attitude and hard work have

made the opportunities for success much more plentiful.

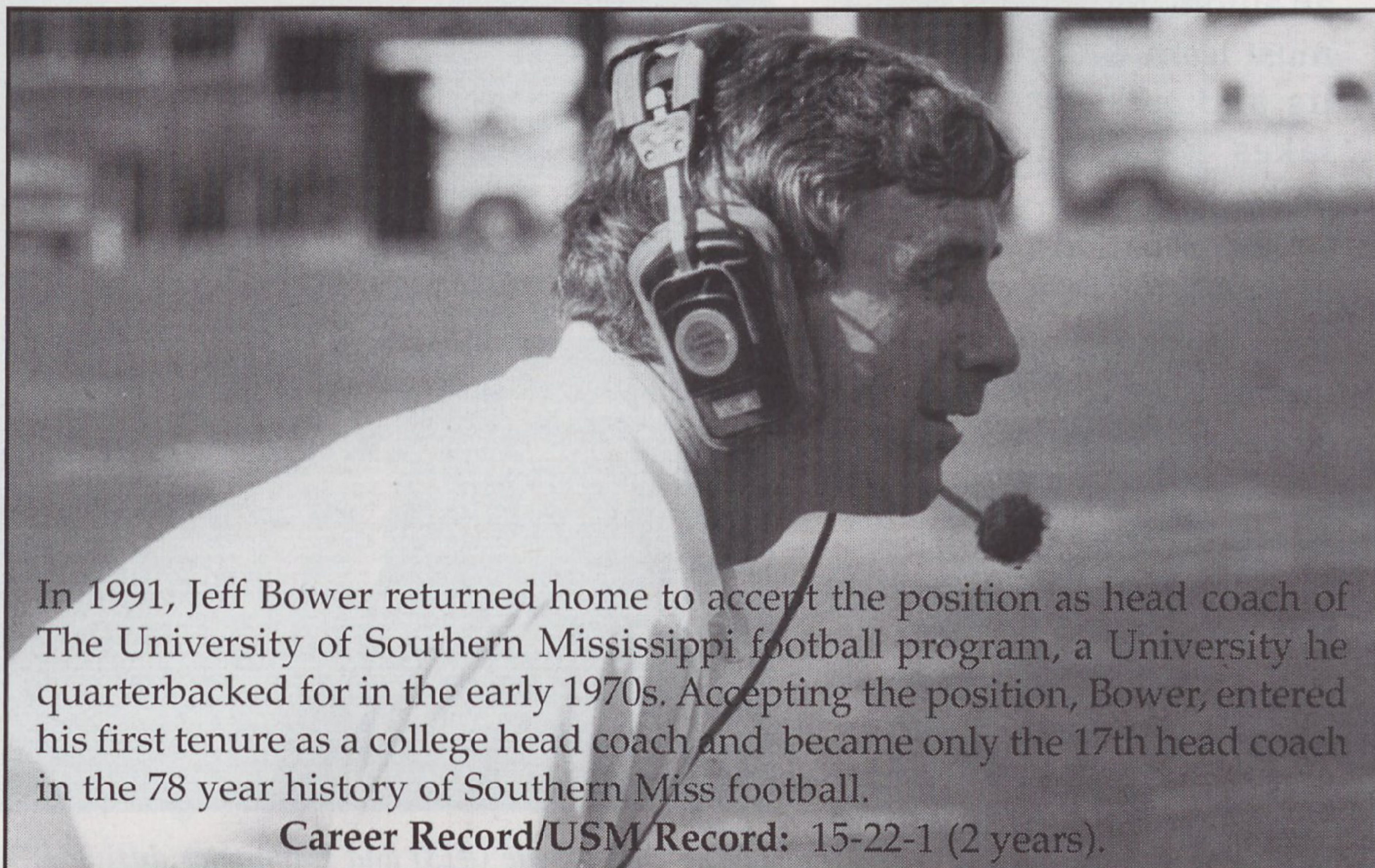
"I have always felt that when they got their opportunity, they would take advantage of it," Williams said. "They have done that thus far, but they have to continue doing that. We have a lot of good players, and if either one of them should ever get slack, we can always put some fresh legs out there."

Maybe it is the knowledge that there are some talented younger players behind them pushing for playing time that has helped Buckhalter and McGee elevate their performance. It could also be that they both have the experience they need to go with the drive to success.

"The attitude I have is that, even if I'm not the best, I am one of the best," Buckhalter said. "I think my work habits, and desire keep me ahead of everybody else."

"Some people don't want it as much, they just want to be there. I am not like that, I want it."

The junior also let everyone know how determined he is to win during USM's Sept. 10 game with nationally-ranked Virginia Tech. He went out of the game in the first half with severe back spasms after suffering a vicious hit. Team trainer Jim Gallaspy told head

coach Jeff Bower that Buckhalter would not be able to return, but Buckhalter refused to accept that diagnosis.

"He had back spasms so bad that he couldn't even stand up straight," Bower said. "He went in and showered and, all of sudden, his back loosened up.

"He put his gear back on and went out and played in the second half. I was happy to see that."

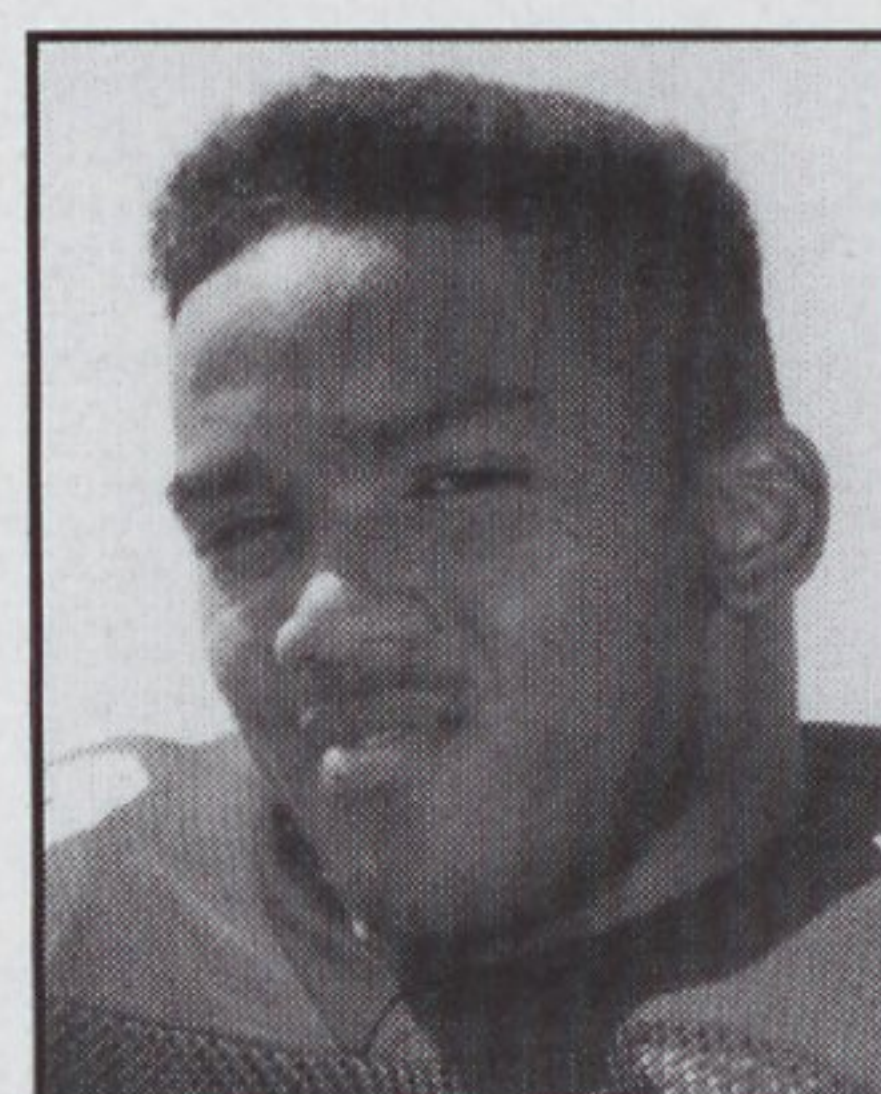
He finished the game with 47 yards on 11 carries, enough to keep him listed among the top ground gainers in the nation for the second consecutive week.

Both players know that their continued success, as well as the continued success of the team, will be determined by a lot of factors, the biggest of which

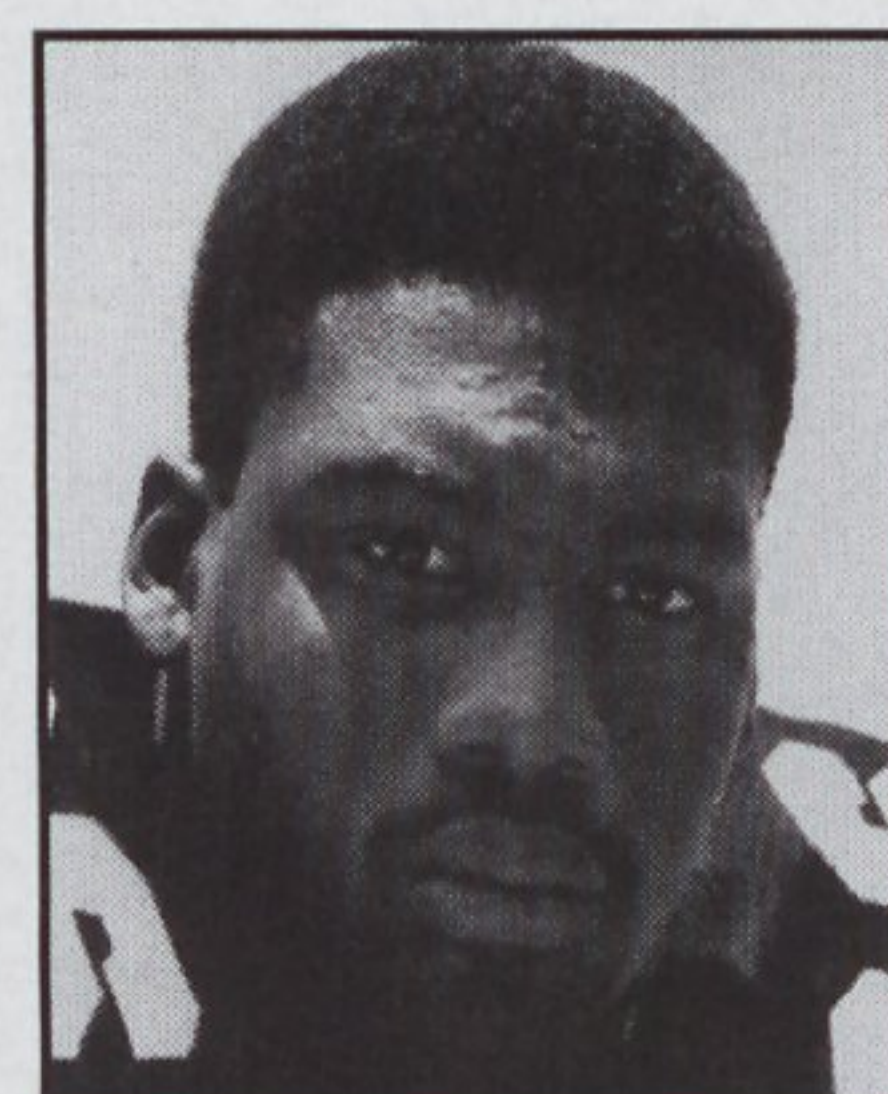
may be determination.

The East Carolina University Educational Foundation, better known as the Pirate Club, is the fund-raising arm of the East Carolina University athletics program. Money raised through the Pirate Club's annual fund drive is used to help fund Pirate student-athlete scholarship costs. The Educational Foundation's goal for 1994 is to turn over a record \$1,050,000 in unrestricted scholarship funds to the University's Athletics Department. Future goals of the Pirate Club include full-funding of all student-athlete scholarship costs associated with ECU's 18 men and women's sports programs. In today's dollars, that translates to approximately \$1.7 million in unrestricted scholarship support.

This program has put nearly 300 committed, well-informed volunteers in the field making solicitations to increase support of Pirate athletics. ECU Athletics and Academics

The Name of the Game is ... LIFE

At East Carolina University, athletic and academic excellence are inseparable goals for student-athletes. The University is committed to the academic success and graduation of students participating in its athletic programs. The Department of Athletics supports this commitment with extensive counseling services in order to maximize the success of every student-athlete.

"Our mission looks beyond fielding competitive teams and winning games," said ECU Director of Athletics Dave Hart, Jr. "Winning, while important to all of us, is only a part of that development. Graduating student-athletes who are responsible for themselves and to our society is our ultimate goal."

Under the direction of the ECU Student Development Staff, headed by Pam Overton, Pirate student-athletes have reached new heights in academic achievement during the past few years.

East Carolina has had seven student-athletes become recent GTE-CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including baseball player Lee Kushner, a second-team All-America in 1993, softball player Laura Crowder, a second-team last year, and swimmer Marc Cook, who earned first-team honors in 1992. Stacey Boyette (softball) was given the honor twice, Pam Young (softball), Robin Graves (softball) and Steve Sides (baseball) have also attained the high honor.

Also, this year, the College Football Association recognized ECU for its football graduation rates with an honorable mention Academic Achievement Award.

The ECU Athletics Department is committed to its Student Development Program and the understanding that student-athletes become well-rounded in all aspects of life.

East Carolina University is proud to be one of 47 pilot schools participating in the NCAA's Life Skills Program and one of five serving as model programs. The NCAA and the Division IA Athletic Directors Association have developed a life skills program for student-athletes to help them bridge the gap from college to career and in the process make meaningful contributions to their communities. The mission of the CHAMPS (Challenging Athletes Minds for Personal Success) Program is to provide a personal development program designed to reach each student-athlete based on his or her individual needs. The focus of the program is on the student-athlete, as a whole person—academically, athletically and emotionally—and on their changing needs and skills during college and in the years after graduation.

The CHAMPS Program is comprised of five key commitments that address critical areas of personal development: (1) The Commitment to Academic Excellence, (2) The Commitment to Athletics Excellence, (3) The Commitment to Personal Development, (4) The Commitment to Serve, and (5) The Commitment to Career Development.

Ultimately the CHAMPS Program is designed to help student-athletes realize higher academic achievement, a higher level of maturity, self-responsibility and greater overall success. As a participant in this program, ECU is dedicated to carrying out all the program's goals and commitments.

The Office of Student Development does this with a staff dedicated to the principle that the development of the student-athlete is the most important objective.

Overton is in her 11th year of overseeing the academic progress of all student-athletes at ECU. The staff is also involved in personal, social and career counseling as well as supervising the study center and tutorial program for all of ECU's student-athletes.

Carlester Crumpler, Nita Boyce, and Bobbi Welch also serve as academic counselors while Dana Monson is the office's academic development coordinator.

Among the Academic Development Services available for student-athletes are tutorial programs, study halls, academic skills development, orientation, and reading and math assessment.

Additional programs such as interview skills workshop, tutorial recruitment and training, leadership development seminars, a speaker's bureau and community service programs are an important part of the student development program.

The athletics department has set up several prestigious awards for ECU student-athletes. For the past five years, Texasgulf, Inc. has sponsored the ECU Outstanding Scholar-Athlete Award. The award is designed to be the most prestigious that is presented annually to a male and female athlete. Last year, Eric Adamski, a cross country runner, was the male recipient, and Cathrine Norstrand, a cross country /track performer, was the female recipient.

Student-athletes also can serve on the Student-Athlete Advisory Council, which serves as an advisory organization for the staff of the Office of Student Development and the Department of Athletics.

The council is comprised of two members from each intercollegiate athletic squad.

The primary goals of the council include (1) serving as a liaison between athletic teams and the Office of Student Development, (2) emphasizing academic opportunities and responsibilities, (3) encouraging student-athletes to apply what is learned in athletics to their course of study and career development, (4) implementing orientation programs for student-athletes, (5) encouraging development of leadership skills, (6) promoting positive relationships between student-athletes and student body and (7) implementing programs that will promote a positive image for intercollegiate athletics and the student-athlete.

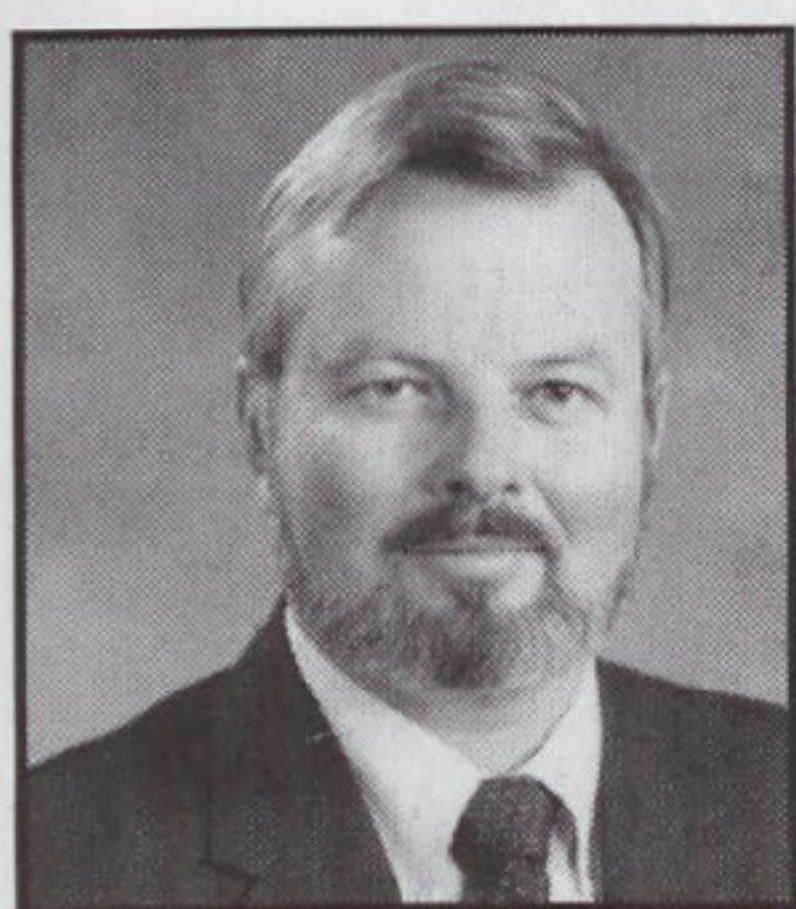
"College athletics is the natural place to give young people the important opportunity not only to grow in the areas of physical development and athletic ability," said Hart, "but just as much in the areas of academic, social and personal development."

Adds Hart, "We in the East Carolina program are in the 'people business', because after all, 'People are our most important product'."

R. W. Moore Scholarship

The scholarship carries a \$1,000 value and is presented in the name of the deserving player to the ECU Educational Foundation (Pirate Club). The money is then contributed to the general athletic scholarship fund.

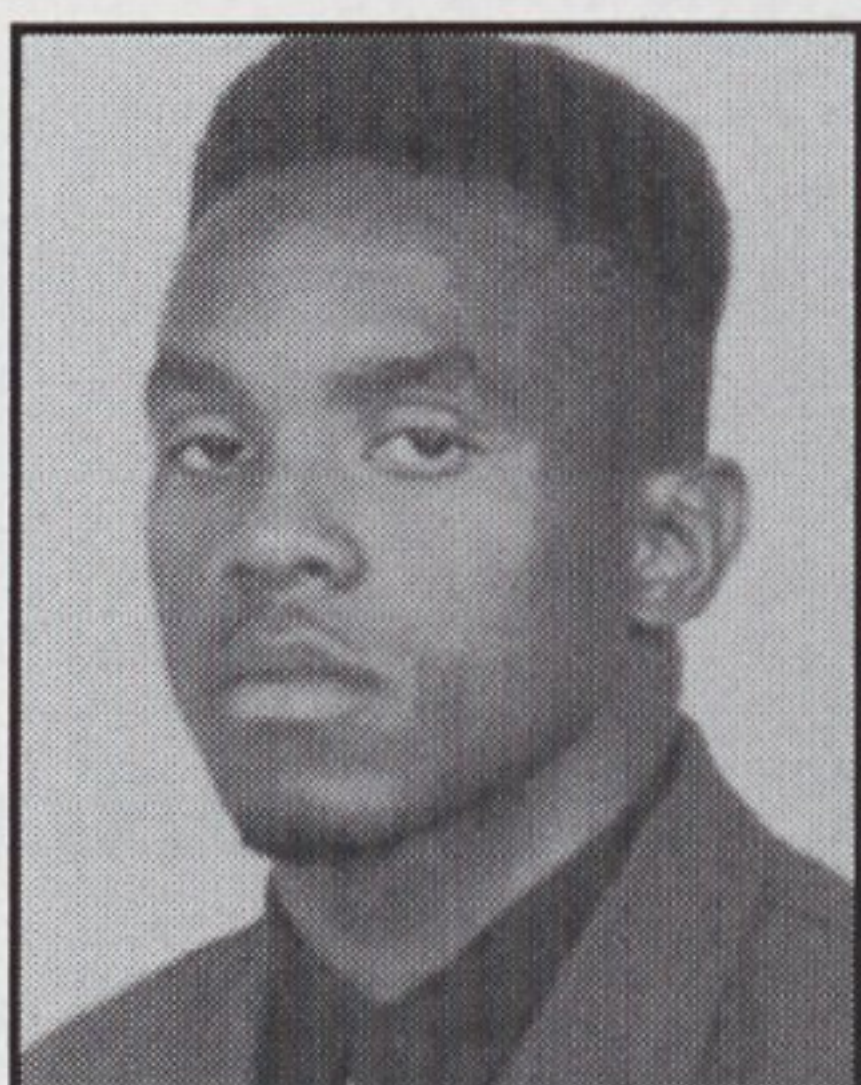

Dwight Henry shines as two-sport standout.

Dwight Henry is not your typical college athlete. His love for running fast and hitting hard have thrust him into the two-sport limelight.



For this sophomore social work major from Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., expectations run high for the 1994 football and 1995 track season.

"I expect to win, not only in football but in track as well. The defense has many goals; our motto this year is 'no excuses'," said Henry.

Going into the 1994 season Henry and his teammates instilled a new attitude in the ECU secondary.

"We wanted to become one of the top-30 defenses in the country. Most of us stayed around this summer to condition and get better. Coach Chuck Pagano told us that we would be better. We dedicated this summer to being more focused as a defense and as a team."

Henry's accomplishments have already made many people take notice of his athletic talent. He was recruited by some of the top football and track schools in the nation. Florida, Florida State, Georgia Tech and Clemson all expressed interest in him.

Running track and playing football share many similarities, however the coaching and conditioning vary within each sport.

"In football the coaches are much more intense. They push us to the limit. Coach Pagano makes all of us work on our tackling, coverage and reaction to the ball. The attitude is much

more intense and pressure packed."

"In track we have a more laid back attitude. Coach Carson makes us work on our technique and making us faster as individuals and a team."

As Henry's secondary coach Pagano feels that the two-sport standout adds quickness and big play capabilities to the Pirate defensive squad.

"Dwight is a well conditioned athlete. He has good reaction to the ball and has a good sense of where the plays are going," said Pagano. "As he matures he will be a good football player for East Carolina University."

In 1993 Henry was third among the Pirate freshman defensive players in total tackles. He was also ranked 12th on the defense with 41 stops which included one tackle for a three yard loss and two pass deflections.

Henry's initial success on the football field carried over to the track in the Spring of 1994.

His track accolades during his first season show that Henry can be a force in the sprint events for the next three years.

During his inaugural track season Henry was named the Colonial Athletic Association Outstanding Meet Performer after setting a championship record in the 400 meters with a time of 46.77. Henry also anchored the 4X100 meter relay team with Charles Miles, Kareem Lamb and Lewis Harris, which captured the CAA Championship.

At the IC4A outdoor meet, Henry teamed with Kareem Lamb, Brian Johnson and Lewis Harris to win the 4x400 meter relay.

ECU head track coach Bill Carson has high praises for the sophomore runner.

"Dwight Henry is a well rounded individual and fine Christian athlete. His core toughness is an example of his excellent character and his extreme versatility. He is excelling in every aspect of his college career," said Carson.

Henry's decision to come to East Carolina was solidified when he learned of Carson's accomplishments on the Olympic Committee and ECU's reputation for its sprinters.

"Coach Carson drove from South Carolina to Florida in one night sleeping on the road, to watch me run," said Henry. "He showed me that he was truly interested in me. He also told me that I could play football and run track at East Carolina."

Balancing school, athletics, and a social life does not bother Henry. He is a good student, who makes time for everything in his life.

"I am not a very social person. I find a room to myself to study and catch up on school work. Athletics has given me discipline and allowed me to structure my studying and athletic career."

Dwight Henry is one of those people that make ECU athletics what it is today. As a gifted athlete who excels in his athletic and academic endeavors, he exemplifies the role of today's student-athlete.

Pearson Focuses on Goals Lets Nothing Stop Him

College football has always been a sport filled with motivational stories about athletes overcoming incredible odds. East Carolina is no different in that regard.

Junior middle linebacker Bruce Pearson was told by countless people that he would never play football at the collegiate level. It wasn't, however, that he lacked the physical ability or the talent. When Bruce was five years old, his parents were told that he had suffered extensive hearing loss resulting from a battle with spinal meningitis. As a result, he was declared legally deaf.

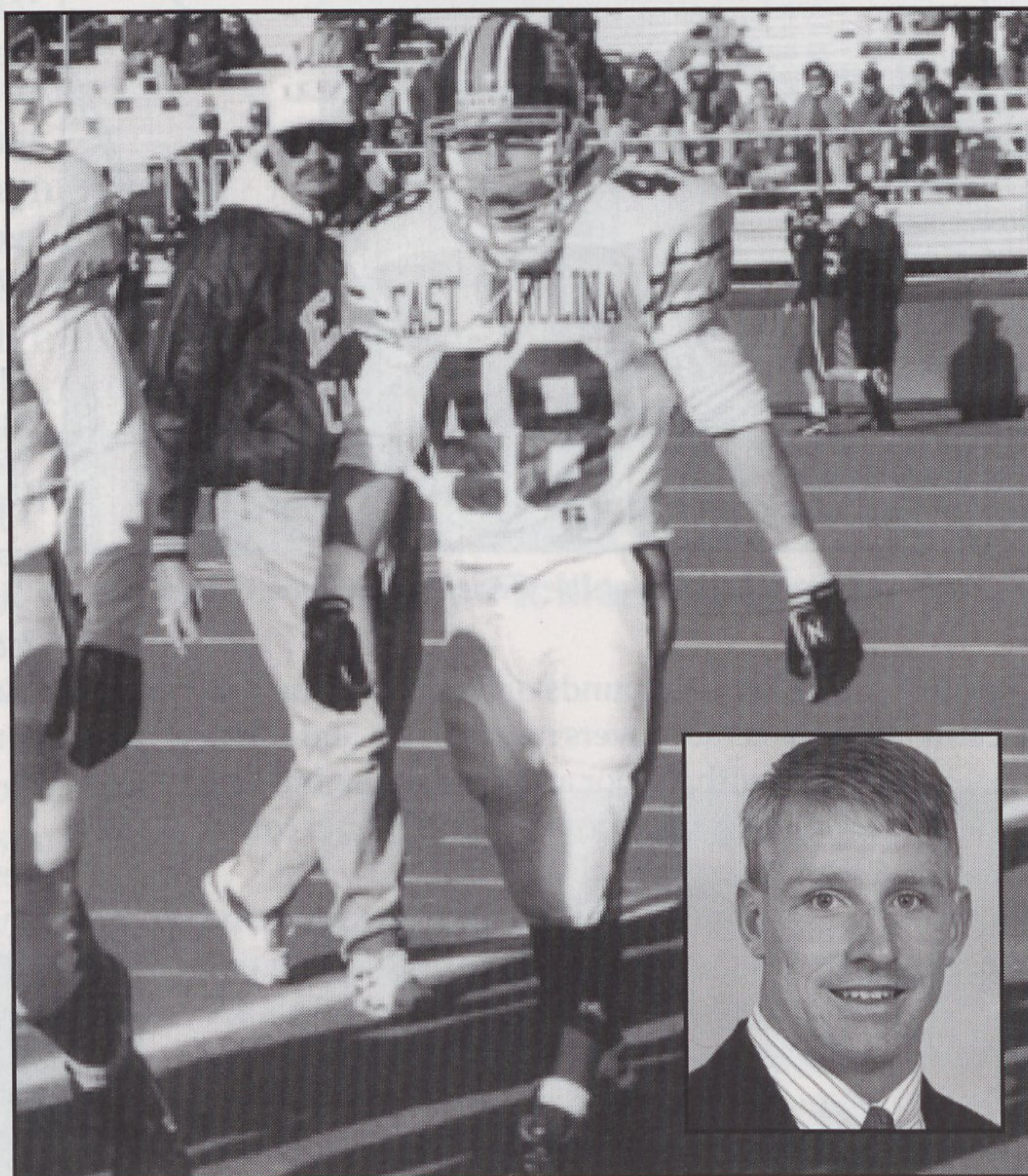
When it came to football, most schools instead of seeing his talents and abilities, chose to focus on his handicap.

"I don't feel I have a disability," said Pearson, "but when my Senior year in high school came, I had no scholarship offers."

Instead of giving up on his dream of playing college football, the Goldsboro native remained resilient and decided to just work harder.

"I realized that my only chance was to try and walk-on somewhere and that I was going to have to work harder than the average person because of my hearing."

Indeed, that is just what he did. Pearson came to ECU in the Fall of 1991 as a prospective walk-on and impressed the coaches with his determination and work ethic. He was

rewarded with a spot on the squad as a member of the scout team.

"I had wanted to play college football since I was in the eighth grade, so when I finally made it here, it was great," said Pearson.

He still wasn't satisfied though. He knew his role on the team was on the scout team, but he wanted to play.

"After I made the team, I set another goal for myself to actually play in a game," said Pearson.

Two years after he set that goal, his wait was finally over. In the final home game last year against Tulsa, special teams coach Doug Martin gave Pearson the opportunity he had waited so long for. He played so well in that game that Head Coach Steve Logan and the coaching staff named him special teams captain for the final two

games of the season against Kentucky and Cincinnati.

At the end of the year, the coaches acknowledged Bruce's contribution to the team by awarding him the Rick Bankston Memorial Award for Outstanding Scout Team Player.

"Bruce is just a special kid," said Logan. "He's had to overcome some things in life and I think that it shows up on the field, he gives you 110% on every play."

On the practice field and in the weight room Pearson is one of the most determined and hardest working players on the team. Pearson, who attributes his positive attitude and determination to

his older brother said, "I have to work harder, I want to set an example for my teammates and for others, so I can prove that anyone with a hearing disability can play football, or any other sport."

While in the class room, Pearson wears a hearing device that contains a receiver connected with his professor to enhance communication. The same device doesn't work on the field, however, so he makes a special adjustment to compensate for the crowd noise.

Bruce's work ethic has also paid off in the classroom where he is majoring in Industrial Technology and has a goal of becoming a draftsman after graduation.

If Pearson's past accomplishments are any indication, this Pirate's goal should be reached easily.

Construction Zone: ECU Builds For the Future

West of Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium, daylight shimmers through columns of exposed steel and concrete of Minges Coliseum. The 25 year-old building is getting some much needed care and attention, and, if buildings could smile, this one certainly would be wearing a happy face.

But happy faces abound on campus these days. At Minges and at other sites, crews are busy erecting brick, steel and mortar. Some sites are getting major facelifts while brand new structures rise from the campus sod in other locations.

With nearly \$120 million earmarked for construction and new equipment projects, ECU is undergoing a building boom the likes of which it has not experienced in 87 years.

More than \$11 million will freshen the look and give the "big league" atmosphere to Minges. The plans include air conditioning, a new playing floor and over 1,500 new seats that slope up from the floor to the rafters.

Elsewhere the changes are every bit as impressive, and perhaps, even more so. Interested in taking a brief tour? The bus is now leaving. All aboard!

Tall cranes sway near the southwest corner of campus where two mammoth building projects are under way. The Student Recreation Center, nearest to the downtown area, took six months of foundation work before steel girders material-

ized above mounds of fresh dirt. The spacious center covers nearly three-and-a-half acres with indoor and outdoor swimming pools, aerobic rooms, eight racquet courts and six basketball courts.

A few steps away, more cranes and earth movers are preparing the foundation for the addition to Joyner Library. This \$30 million project was approved in last November's bond referendum.

Included in the project are expanded student study areas, more room for books, an electronic information processing area and renovations to the current library structure. In about three years, the library and the recreation center promise an entirely new look and entrances way to the west end of campus that is expected to be both impressive and pleasing.

Continuing along the campus's southwest perimeter, the construction tour marches for only a few more yards before reaching Slay and Umstead Residence Halls. These buildings sit now as vacant shells, but by late spring they will look spiffy and inviting with over \$6 million in new walls, fixtures, air conditioning, activities center and other attractive improvements.

From here, the tour takes a right turn on College Hill Drive. Half way up the hill, in a scenic wooded area, is the new Todd Dining Hall. The building, reminiscent of the architectural style of ECU's early campus, opened this summer as a modern and efficient foot preparation and dining facility.

Now, head back to the main campus and just roam a bit, but be careful!

The trenches and narrow tunnels give the impression of a giant gopher and biology experience gone awry. Most of the digging sites are marked with yellow ribbon and have protruding tubes of orange and gray snaking onto the ground surface. This is part of the installation for the nearly \$15 million fiber optic network that will open the campus to a whole new world of voice, video and computer data opportunities. The project, when completed, won't change the way the campus looks, but will produce a near quantum leap for ECU into areas of new technologies.

These projects are just a handful of what amounts to a whole basket full of im-

provements, more than 30, that range from roof repairs, to energy-saving light fixture replacements. Attention is also going to roads and walkways and to the renovation of medical clinics and to the improvement of chemistry labs.

"I'm having a wonderful time watching the daily progress of all the many projects," said Chancellor Richard Eakin, commenting during one of his late afternoon walks past some of the construction sites.

"This is one of the most exciting periods we've ever seen," he added.

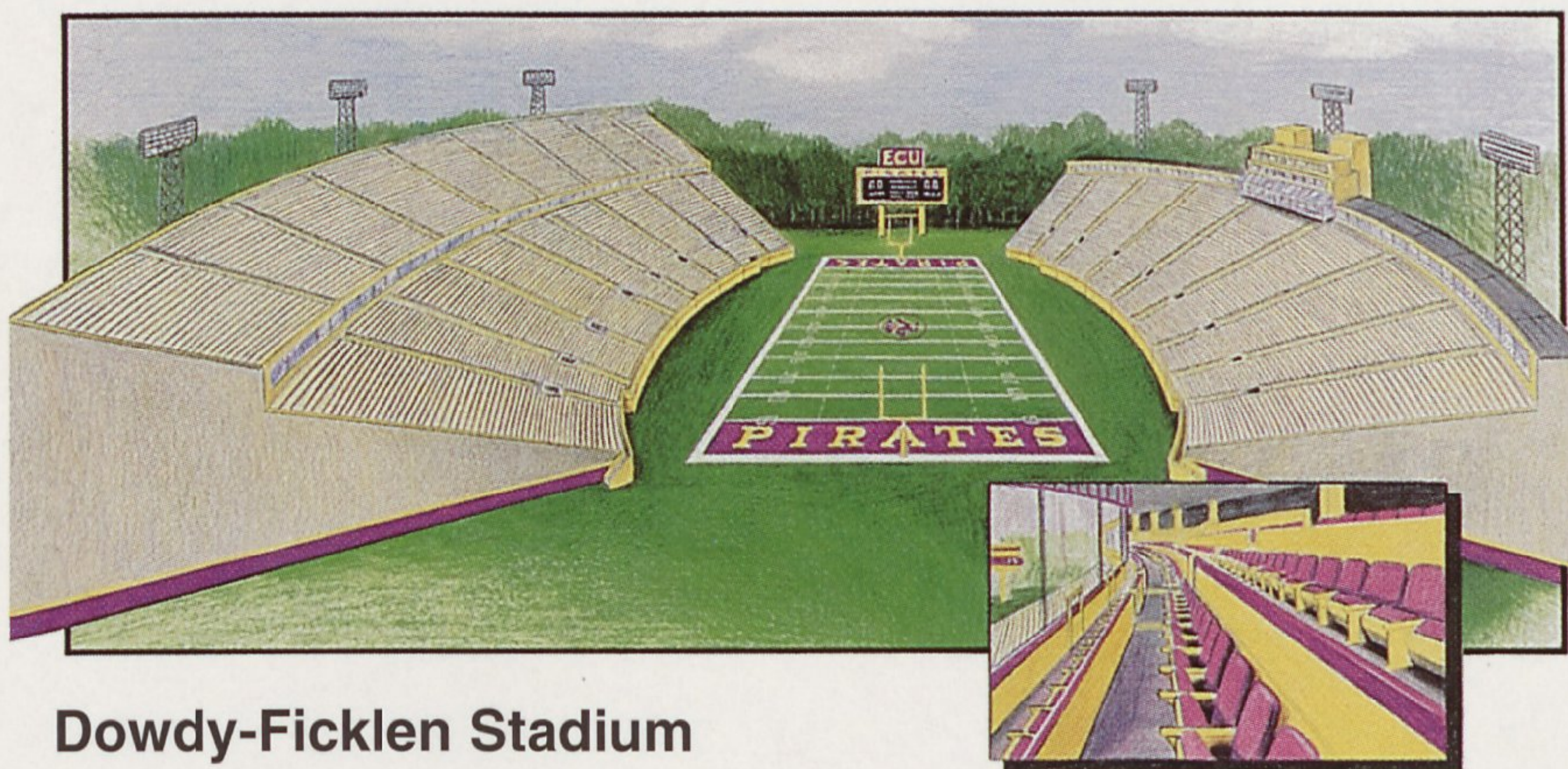

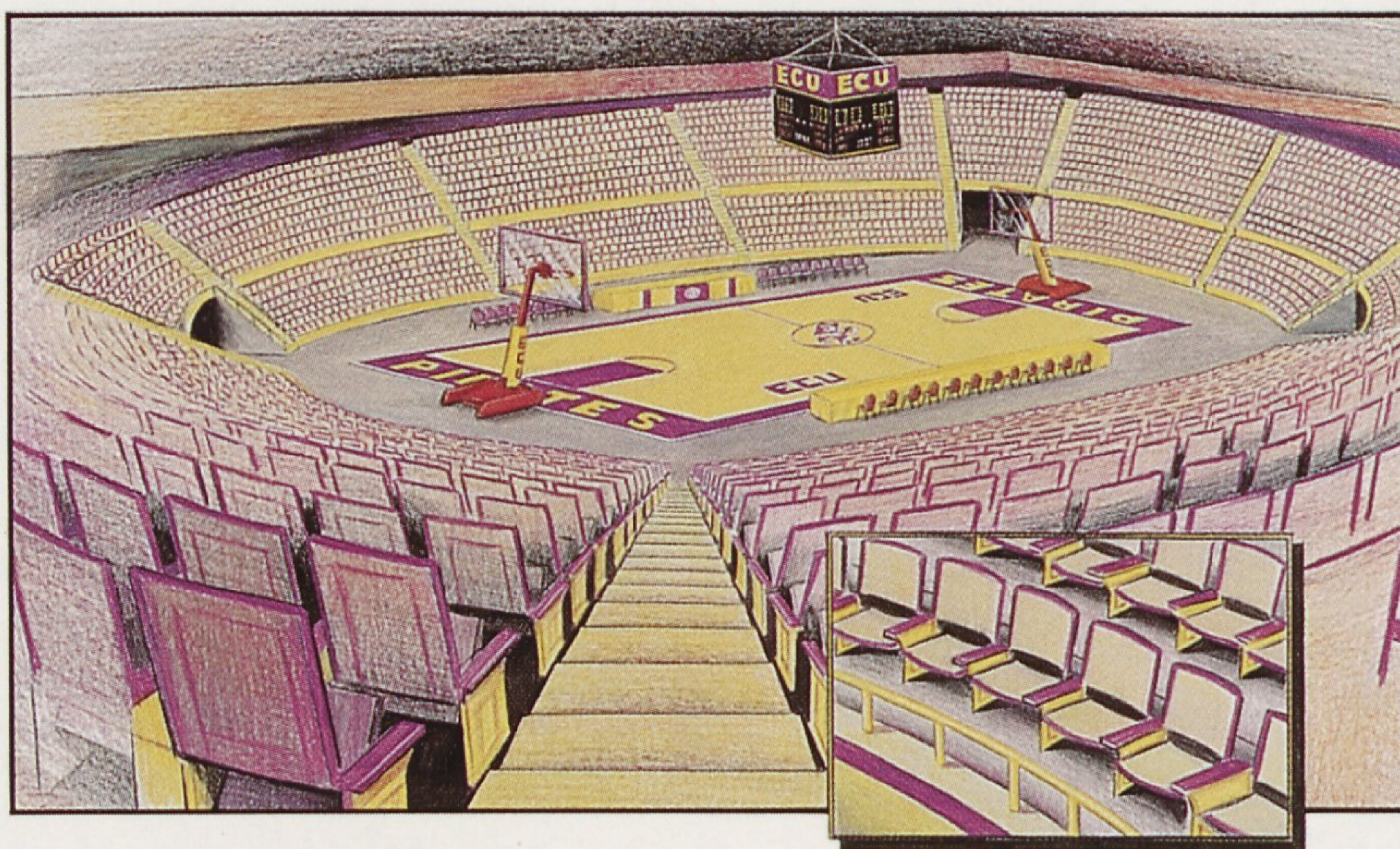
