REPORT OF ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE

The Admissions Committee has proposed that the following changes be made in the 1971-72 catalog:

1. The eligibility standards, or retention requirements, on pages 78-79 of the current catalog be changed to require:
 - (a) a grade point average of 1.35 (instead of 1.25) after three quarters.
 - (b) a grade point average of 1.60 (instead of 1.50) after six quarters.
 - (c) a grade point average of 1.80 (instead of 1.75) after nine quarters.

2. The note at the bottom of page 47 of the current catalog be changed to read:

Transfer students who have attended an accredited college but have earned less than approximately 30 semester hours of acceptable credit or equivalent must meet all freshmen entrance requirements as well as have an overall "C" average and be eligible to return to the institution last attended. (Approximately 30 hours has been substituted for 15.)
