Experience over the last year has seemed to indicate that the "75\%" Attendance Rule (See page 89; 1971 University Catalogue) is not being enforced. While the University may within the year discontinue all attendance requirements, it would seem that until such time, rules such as the one mentioned here should be enforced.
