University Curriculum Committee Minutes, November 2, 1972:

Driver and Traffic Safety Education Minor, B.S. Degree

Health 125, 345G, 355G; Driver Education 220, 230, 300, 307, 310, 311, 320; CORS 200 (School of Allied Health and Social Professions); TECH 290 (School of Technology) 37 Q. H.

- TECH 290. Mechanical Analysis of Motor Vehicles for Driver Education
(2) (On demand)
Designed for prospective teachers of Driver and Traffic Safety Education. Emphasizes the mechanical analysis of the different systems of the motor vehicle with special emphasis on safety of operating systems.
- DRED 220. The Highway Transportation System (3) (Offered 2 quarters per year and on demand)
A basic study of the components and concepts involved in the highway transportation system in the United States. Traffic engineering, social, economic, and environmental aspects will also be reviewed.
- DRED 230. Traffic Law (3) (Offered 2 quarters per year and on demand)
The character of traffic law as a function of our highway transportation system. An analysis of North Carolina Motor Vehicle Laws as they apply to all motorists and pedestrians.
- DRED 320. Laboratory Programs in Driver and Traffic Safety Education
(5) (Offered 2 quarters per year and on demand)
Three lectures and four laboratory hours per week.
Prerequisites: DRED 300; valid driver's license.
The theory and practice of dealing with the multiple-car driving range, simulation, and on-street laboratory programs in driver education. Each student will have the responsibility of teaching a beginning student the laboratory phase of driver education.

Amendment to the East Carolina Code

Definition of full-time faculty: C. 1.

A full time faculty person is defined for the purpose of this code as an individual with an academic title and not less than half a normal teaching or research program as practiced in his unit. This requirement does not apply to heads of units as defined by this code, or librarians.
