V. Questions discussed by the Committee during the year:

- (1) The University Self-Study and Evaluation by the Visiting Committee.
- (2) The new North Carolina Guidelines for Competency based Teacher Education.
- (3) Standards of supervision of student teachers.
- (4) In-service education of supervising teachers.
- (5) Teacher supply and demand.
- (6) Screening for admission to teacher education.
- (7) Revisions of several major programs in teacher education.
- (8) Approval of the proposed driver and traffic safety education program.
- (9) Served once as an appeals committee for a student denied admission to student teaching.

VI. Policy recommendations made by the Committee:

Restatement of the requirement that all proposals for changes in teacher education programs be cleared before going to the University Curriculum Committee.

VII. Responses to the Committee's recommendations by the appropriate agencies.

The University Curriculum Committee has not approved the proposed program in Driver and Traffic Safety Education.

VIII. Committees evaluation of:

- a. Its structure: The Committee should have broader representation. The SGA should be instructed to appoint two student members who have declared a teacher education major.
- b. Its duties: Satisfactory.
- c. Its function: The Committee has been active since it last reported to the Faculty Senate. Regular meetings have been held during the academic year. The Committee has also been called into session on some occasions to act as a review board to hear the appeal of students who have been the subject of adverse decisions by the Student Teaching Office or other University officials. The Committee was also involved closely with the Self-Study and the NCATE Visiting Committee.
