B. Resolutions from Faculty Assembly subuitted to Faculty Senate for endorsement (See Attachment)

1. RE: Teacher Education Conmittee. Add the following line to their charge:
"The Teacher Education Comittee shall consule with the proper representative of the units which will be affected by its recomendations."

Their charge will then read:
"Teacher Education--7 faculty members and 1 student member plus ex-officio: Director of Student Teaching. Quorum: 5 faculty members exclusive of ex-officio

The Teacher Rducation Comittee studies the present teacher education curricula of East Carolina University by department; recomends to the University Curriculur Comittee that duplication of courses be corrected and that needed curricula be added; studies the changes in the teacher education program which should be made in order to keep pace with modern trends; studies teacher education prograus of statewide organizations to analyze the type of teacher education that now exists, determines the type of teacher education needed, and recomends the steps that should be taken to obtain it; promotes various means of encouraging students to enter the teaching profession. The Teacher Education Comittee shall consult with the proper representative of the units which will be affected by its recomendations."
2. RE: Computer Comittee. In reply to Chancellor Jenkins' letter, the Comittee on Comittees submits this revised charge:
"Computer Comittee--.9 faculty members, at least siz of whom are from academic units that are bona fide users of the university computation facilities. The Director of the Computer Center vill provide the Comittee on Committees with the appropriate user data to aid the comittee in determining qualifications. Ex-officio one student, Director of Institutional Development, Director of the Computer Center. Quorum: 5 exclusive of ex-officio.

The Computer Comittee shall initiate recomendations affecting academic usage of computer facilities above the departmental and school level to the Faculty Senate or appropriate authorities. The Committee shall serve as a resource to the Chancellor and the University Computer Policy Comittee of Eaculty opinion on computer services and policies, in general; and, specifically, it shall represent faculty interest in the selection of new computing equipment above the departmental and school level. Finally the comittee shall cooperate with the Director of the Computing Center in establishing a viable Users Advisory Comittee. The Chairman of the Users Comittee shall be recruited from the elected membership of the Computer Comittee.
3. RE: Student Guidance Comittee. At the request of the Student Guidance Comittee, the Comittee on Comittees recomends that the Student Guidance Comittee be dropped.
4. RE: Instructional Survey Comittee. The Comittee on Committees recomnends that given the difficulties the present members of the Instructional Survey Comnittee have encountered in carrying out their charge, the Faculty Senate point out that those members whose preferences are incompatible with the charge preferred by the Faculty Senate, may resign their positions so that new representatives may be clected or appointed.

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Faculty Lssembly of the University of North Carolina, having studied proposals recently made for raising tuition and lowering operating budgets and reserve funds in The University, respectfully requests the General Assembly of Horth Carolina:

1. To sustain and, whe: possible, strengthen the ongoing programs of instruction, research, and service in which students and faculties are engaged;
2. To preserve unimpaired the capacity of each component institution to meet its responsibilities to the people of the State;
3. To safeguard the gains which the dedicated support of the people of Torth Carolina has enabled faculties and administrators to make for the University, so that in more prosperous years the work of improvement and enlargement can be resumed;
4. To keep tuition and Financial aid at levels such that all qualiEied students, whatever their circumstances, may study in The University;
5. To continue at present levels tuition remission for students recruited for unusual and exceptional talents, including graduate students of high competence whose assistance in teaching and research raises productivicy in a large and complex university;
6. And to limic The Jniversity's contribucion toward meeting the anticipated deficit for the coming biennium to no more than its proportionate shase of the total budget and to leave it to the Board of Covemozs to determine where the reductions should be made.

Finally, the Faculty Assembly requests the President of the University to transait copies of this resolution to all members of the General kssembly now in session.

WHEREAS: The monbers of the Faculty Assembly, elected by the sixteen faculties to represent them, have the obligation of advising the President of the Jniversity as spokesmen for their faculties; and

WHEREAS: The elected officers of the sixteen faculties, and the members of faculty councils, senates, and comittees elected by the facultios or duly appointed by faculty officers, have the obligation of advising the Chancellors as spokesmen for those they represent; and

WIEREAS: Such advice, if it is to have value, must be given freely, frankly, effectively, unequivocally, and truthfully;

THEPGFORE BE IT RESOLVSD: 1. That faculty members elected by the faculties, or appointed pursuant to their established procedures, to represent them as officers, members of assenblies and comittees, or delegates to the Faculty Assembly, are answerable for their conduct as faculty representative solely to the faculties they severally represent and for whom they speak and act; and
2. That such faculty representatives have the obligation to speak and act freely, frankly, effectively, unequivocally, and truthfully in their role as representatives and to do so with the civility and decorum that enhances the dignity of their faculties; and
3. That admonition or other action intended to correct whatever incivility or irresponsibility faculty representatives may be show to have committed should come only from the officers of their faculties; and
4. That penalties applied by chancellors or other administrative officers, as by reprimand, withholding of promotion or salary increases or tenure, or other means, in reprisal for acts or utterances of duly elected and appointed faculty representatives acting under their responsibilitfos to their several faculties, violate the freedon of expression essential to the proper government of the University, contravene its justice and integrity, demean the faculties concerned, and should, when substantiated in their character, be zevoked; and
5. That chancellors and other administrative officers vho believe themselves wronged by the acts or utterances of duly elected and appointed faculty representatives acting under their responsibilities to their several faculties should look for remedy to the officers of the faculties concerned, which remedy, when found justified, should readily be accorded; and
6. That the President and the Board of Governors are respectfully requested to recognize the articles of this present resolution as appropriate to the goverment of the University and to comunicate their concurrence to the chancellors.
