PROPOSED SUMMER CALENDAR FOR 1978
The Summer Session consists of two terms of $5 \frac{1}{2}$ weeks each. Two semester hour courses meet 60 minutes, three-hour courses 90 minutes and five-hour courses 150 minutes daily. There are no Saturday classes. In order to accommodate certain students, various Departments will wi.sh to offer some shorter courses. It is recommended that two-week courses originate on Wednesday, June 14th, in the first term. Final examinations will be given on the last day of each term.

Graduate students expecting to begin work in the summer must complete application at least two weeks before registration.

A student may not enter a course later than the third meeting of a Summer Session class and receive credit. During the first ten days, an undergraduate student may withdraw or drop a course without receiving grades for courses for which he is enrolled. After the first ten days, an undergraduate student withdrawing from school shall receive a grade of F for all classes which he is failing at that time unless, in the judgment of the Provost, Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs, or Dean of Continuing Education, as appropriate, the failures were caused by circumstances beyond the student's control. After this time, an undergraduate student may drop a course only due to unforeseeable and uncontrollable circumstances and only with the permission of the Provost, Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs or Dean of Continuing Education.

Applications for graduation in a given term must also be made within the three day entrance period.
