Agenda Item 5E: Instructional Survey Committee

1. A brief oral report of the preliminary response report of the recent outstanding instructor survey.

2. RESOLUTION:

Be it hereby resolved that the Instructional Survey Committee shall arrange for the release and publication of the names of those faculty who appear one standard deviation above the mean, and who do not violate the bounds of any two of the biasing agents

Be it also resolved that an asterisk be placed beside names of those faculty who receive at least 15% peer group nomination, and whose student evaluation exceed the average by at least one standard deviation, and are judged comparable.

Be it also resolved that the responses from the faculty to the administration section of the survey be summarized, typed according to academic unit, and sent to each specific administration unit head.

Be it also resolved that responses be summarized in general (not by academic unit), typed, and forwarded to the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs.

Be it further resolved that the Instructional Survey Committee statistically summarize the faculty responses regarding administration needs and provide the data to the Faculty Senate.

Agenda Item 5F: Student Recruitment Committee

As part of our responsibility in the recruiting of quality students, we have reviewed the brochures used by departmental and professional schools. In essence we have found many of them lacking in quality of design and content.

The Student Recruitment Committee recommends that an administrative office of the university be charged with the responsibility of establishing guide lines and giving help and supervision to the departments and professional schools in designing and writing their brochures. It further recommends that such an office should make use of the many resources already existing on the campus wherever possible.

The Student Recruitment Committee requests the Senate to take whatever action it may deem necessary and effective to bring about the establishment of such an office by the University Administration.
