

XI. Suggestions for Improving the Effectiveness of the Committee

- A. The Committee continually urges that units planning changes be cognizant of the time required to obtain all approvals necessary for curriculum changes. It appears to the Committee that catalog supplements will no longer be published. The effective date for submission of proposals to the Committee, if changes are to be effective the following academic year, will probably be about December 1.
- B. *The Committee still believes that first-year membership is essentially an orientation period and written procedures are not an adequate substitute for experience. (See Dr. Ryan's report for

1976-77 for additional comments.)

C. As usual the Committee plans to meet the first and third Thursday of each month (excluding vacations and examination periods). Cooperation of unit heads in scheduling teaching and other assignments for members is appreciated.
