

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FACULTY SENATE 1979/80

Legislative powers of the General Faculty are delegated to the Faculty Senate which is composed of elected members from the academic units and ex-officio members. During the 1979/80 academic year, the Faculty Senate met eight times in regular session, one called session and one organizational meeting. A total of 56 resolutions were approved.

Twenty-three academic committees reported to the Senate a total of 28 times during the year. Ten of the 23 committees were able to fulfill their charge without reporting to the Senate. Thus, of those reporting, the average number of times was 2.2 per committee. The University Curriculum Committee reported at each meeting. A written annual report was submitted by each committee.

Two committees, Agenda and Committee on Committees are Faculty Senate committees, reporting only to the Senate. Each of these committees reported nine times during the year.

The success of shared governance is dependent upon the committees fulfilling their charges. Seven committee charges were revised during the year with the balance scheduled for submission by the Committee on Committees next year. This periodic revision process has been very carefully carried out and is an excellent accomplishment.

Academic committees were composed of 146 different faculty members, 21 student members, and ex-officio representation. One hundred seventy-four academic committee meetings were held. In addition, the Agenda Committee met eight times and the Committee on Committees fifteen times.

The Admissions Committee proposed revised "Scholastic Eligibility Standards" which were approved by the Faculty Senate.

The Career Education Committee recommended and the Senate approved a resolution urging increased career development, career exploration and coordination of career assistance to students enrolled at ECU.

The Committee for Teaching Effectiveness developed a student opinion survey after conducting hearings and holding extensive meetings. They also determined recipients of two outstanding teacher awards, evaluated 75\* proposals seeking funds for projects to improve teaching effectiveness, recommending 22\* for funding, in the amount of \$13,736.54, and evaluated 41 proposals seeking summer grants (in conjunction with the University Research Committee) funding 11\*\* grants for \$27,500.

The Committee on Educational Policies and Planning has established a good working relationship with the Planning Office. This committee has also reviewed the budgeting process and the budget with the Chancellor and the Vice Chancellor for Business Affairs.

The Faculty Governance Committee held hearings and tentatively reached agreement on revisions to the ECU Code to be presented to the Senate in 1980/81.

The Faculty Welfare Committee continued its in-depth study of faculty salaries and submitted updated information to the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. This information was extensively used by the Vice Chancellor in determining faculty raises for 1980/81. A new policy for obtaining keys for access by faculty to their offices was established under the direction of the Vice Chancellor for Student Life. The Chancellor supported committee efforts to improve ECU faculty salaries.

Hearings were held by the General College Committee on possible revisions to the general education requirements. Recommendations for possible changes will be made after considerable additional study.

The Library Committee has developed a Committee Handbook containing committee procedures, committee and library policies. The Library Committee continues to study the "modified" Colorado Plan for serials and monographs.

The Student Scholarships, Fellowships, and Financial Aid Committee prepared "Guidelines for Awarding Undergraduate School, College or Departmental Scholarships" which were approved by the Faculty Senate. In addition, the committee awarded numerous scholarships and heard two student appeals.

The University Computer Committee was very active in making faculty computer needs known to the Information Systems Advisory Committee (ISAC).

The University Curriculum Committee recommended for Senate approval the addition of 90 new courses, deletion of 29 courses, placement of 21 courses in the Curriculum Bank, removal of 3 from the Bank, establishment of 2 new minors, changes in degree requirements for 19 majors and 5 minors and recommended minor changes in 35 existing courses.

The University Research Committee developed criteria for evaluation of grant proposals, evaluated 174\* research grant proposals recommending 133\* for funding in the amount of approximately \$115,000. This committee also provided one-half the membership of the Summer Grants Committee.

There is considerable anticipation on the part of the faculty concerning approval of a revised Appendix C.

A constitutional amendment, Resolution 80-32, received a favorable recommendation by the Faculty Senate. The amendment deletes the position of Vice Chancellor for Administration and Planning and the Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs from ex-officio membership on the Faculty Senate and adds the Vice Chancellor for Student Life and the Dean of the Medical School.

East Carolina University delegates to the Faculty Assembly continue to hold key leadership positions. Professor Pat Daugherty was chair of the
