
Dear Tom:

I have forwarded to President Friday Resolution No. 4, passed by the Faculty Senate on April 22. It arrived in this office on May 16, after I had left the office until June 6. (80-37)

In my letter of transmittal (copy attached) I have endorsed the resolution with the exception of increases based on longevity. In past conversations and communications with you and the Senate, I have stated that merit increases should be based on contributions to the University in the areas of teaching, creative activity, and service.

I also note that the Resolution did not mention the correction of salary inequities, which I am sure is of concern to us all.
