ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF 1981/82 ACADEMIC YEAR

22 April 1981

The Organizational meeting of the Faculty Senate for 1981/82 was called to order by Chair Thomas Johnson on Wednesday, April 22, 1981, at 2:10 p.m. in Room 221, Mendenhall Student Center.
