

UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM COMMITTEE
MINUTES

March 22, 1982

The University Curriculum Committee met on March 22, 1982, in Brewster B-103 at 3:00 p.m. Members present: Boyce, Grossnickle, Broadhurst, Daugherty, Hancock, Holt, Leahy, Moore, O'Rear, Topper. Members absent were Cain (ex officio), and student member Harris.

The minutes of February 22, 1982, were approved.

Professor J. Robert Weber, Department of Social Work and Correctional Services, School of Allied Health requested a reduction in semester hours from 4 to 3 for CorS 3000. He asked to delete CorS 3004 and add new course, CorS 3007, Methods of Legal Investigation. On the new course proposal for CorS 3007, I.F. delete last sentence; I.H. delete pp. 278, 280. Professor Weber requested an increase in semester hours from 2 to 3 for SocW 2000 and a decrease in semester hour credit from 4 to 3 for SocW 3002. He presented the new course proposal, SocW 5009, 5010, Human Service Information Management. The new course proposal should be changed as follows:
I.E. Prerequisites: CSCI 3600 to DSCI 2223 ... The proposed changes effects the B.S. major and minor in Correctional Services (see attached), and BS major in Social Work and BA/BS minor in Social Welfare. Professor Moore moved to accept the changes as amended, Hamilton seconded, and the motion passed.

Professor R. Wendling, Department of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Safety presented new course proposal, PRC 2190, 2191, 2192, Work Experience Through Community/Commercial/Recreation Agencies. Item I. G. add p. 191. PRC 2390, 2391, 2392, Work Experience Through Resource Management Agencies was presented. Item I.G. add p. 181. PRC 4700, 4701, 4702, Independent Study in Recreation was presented. Item I.E. changed to read, Junior status and approval ... Item I.G. add page 181. PRC 4600 was deleted.

Catalogue copy of page 181 which reflects the proposed changes is attached. Professor Hancock moved to accept the changes as amended, Boyce seconded, and the motion passed.

Professor E. Hooks, Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Safety, P. Benzing, School of Allied Health and Social Professions, J. Mitchell, Department of Sociology and Anthropology, presented the new course proposal, HPRO, HOME, PSYC, SOCI 2400, Introduction to Gerontology. This course will be double-listed among the various cooperating units. Professor Hooks stated the chairman of the Gerontology Committee will be responsible for scheduling and coordinating the administration process relative to offering this course. Professor Hamilton moved to accept the course, Professor Hancock seconded, and the motion passed.

Professor R. Creech, Department of Mathematics presented MATH 2283, Statistics for Business. On the course proposal, item I.E., add or equivalent and item I.A. should include the statement (formerly ECON 2283 and DSCI 2283) On item I.H. add page 331. A proposal for a ^{new} revised B.S. minor in Mathematics was presented. Professor Daugherty moved to accept the math proposals as amended, and to substitute Math 2283 for DSCI (Econ) 2283 wherever it appears in the catalogue. This changes the BSBA majors and minors. Professor Moore seconded, and the motion passed.

Three (3) classroom hours per week.
Prerequisite: None
Fundamentals of criminal investigation including the
various types of physical evidence, collection and

scene searches, major crime investigations, investigative
reports of domestic violence, and court appearances.

SocW 2000

Introduction to Social Welfare (3) (F,S)
Three (3) classroom hours per week
Prerequisite: None
Designed to introduce the broader system of social
welfare services and institutions. Concepts of human
services and service delivery are introduced.

Social Welfare Policies and Issues (3) (F,S)
Three (3) classroom hours required per week.
Prerequisite: SocW 2000
Designed to provide knowledge of social welfare as a
social system. Foci are on social welfare concepts,
policy and organization. Attention given to program-
ming in relation to social needs, social problems and
social goals.

SocW 5009, 5010

Human Service Information Management (3,0) (F,S, On Demand)
Two (2) Classroom hours per week; two (2) Laboratory hours per week.

Prerequisites: CSCI 3600 or DSCI 2223 or equivalent or permission of instructor.

This course examines the role of information management in human service delivery. Data structure, linkage, and access structures are studied. Applications in the Human Services are used in the laboratory by the students. Problems based upon real situations are explored in the laboratory.

PARKS, RECREATION AND CONSERVATION

PRC 2190, 2191, 2192

Work Experience thru Community/Commercial, Recreation Agencies (2, 2, 2) (On Demand)

180 hours per course per semester of work experience.

Prerequisites: PRC 2000, permission of instructor and 2.0 GPA

This course is designed to expose the student to Community/Commercial Recreation Agencies through a supervised work experience.

PRC 2390, 2391, 2392

Work Experience thru Resource Management Agencies.

(2, 2, 2) (On demand)

180 hours per course per semester of work experience

Prerequisites: PRC 2000, permission of instructor and 2.0 GPA

This course is designed to expose the student to natural resource management agencies through a supervised work experience.

 Prerequisites: Junior status and approval of instructor.
 The student works directly with a recreation faculty member on a project(s) directly related to the recreation profession.

 Anthropology

HOME, HPRO, PSYC and SOCI 2400 Introduction to Gerontology (3) (F,S)
 Three classroom hours per week.
 Prerequisites: HOME, none; HPRO, none; PSYC, PSYC 1050 or by permission; SOCI, none.
 A survey of current theory and research in the Gerontology field presented from an interdisciplinary perspective. Can count toward social science requirement only if taken under PSYC, or SOCI. (Same as HOME 2400, HPRO 2400, PSYC 2400, and SOCI 2400)
