Committee chair was Madge McGrath; vice chair, Kenneth Wilson; secretary, Belinda Lee. Two subcommittees were appointed. 1982-1983 was the first year the committee has functioned under a revised charge after relinquishing selection of teaching grant recipients to the new Teaching Grants Committee. The committee's main activities were in faculty development. A proposal for a Faculty Development Center was presented to University administration during the summer and early fall of '82. The concept had administrative support, but budget constraints precluded its funding on even a parttime basis. Several alternate sources of funding were investigated but no funds were available.
