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VI. Committee Organization, Sub-Committees, Research Activities, etc.

During most of the 1983-84 academic year a sub-committee was used to handle the small number of appeals that occasionally arise needing prompt attention. The sub-committee consisted of the Director of Admissions, the Committee Chairman, the Vice Chairman and the representative from Continuing Education. The main function of the committee is to serve as

- an appeals board for students who have not met admissions and/or retention requirements and who have falsified admission documents. In addition, much time has been spent by the full committee discussing committee functions, regulations, revised charge, potential policy changes, appeals procedures, pre-college admissions, Special Talent Waivers, international student admissions and TOEFL requirements for international students.


