V. Specific instructions given to the Committee by the Faculty Senate other than those found in the Committee's Constitutional Charge:

We were asked by the Senate to consider removing the six-year cap on part-time employment and on noncontinuous employment. We presented a resolution to the Senate recommending removal of the cap for persons employed $75 \%$ or less of full time. The Senate rejected the resolution.

The Committee functioned as a whole to consider the issue of part time employment referred to us by the Senate, and functioned as the Faculty Grievance Committee with a subcommittee or eight members (excluding Adler and Pories, unit heads).

The Committee considered the issue of removing the six-year cap for part-time employment as mentioned in V. Above. Recommendations were made to Ralph Kinsey, Chair of the Chancellor Search Committee regarding the criteria for selecting a new chancellor. Three grievances from faculty members were heard. A set of guidelines were developed for grievances that do not involve equal opportunity issues.
