EAST CAROLINA UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM COMMITTEE
MINUTES OF JANUARY 26, 1989

The Curriculum Committee met Thursday, January 26, 1989, at 2:15 p.m., in Brewster B-103. Members present were Buckler, Carlton, Coulter, Grossnickle, Neal, O'Rear, Shea, Topper, Wilentz, Yount, and Cain. Members absent were Lunney, Landry and Hogg.

Prerequisites for THEA 3090, which should have read THEA 1010, 1020, were changed in the minutes of January 1989. The minutes of January 12, 1989, were approved as amended.

Professors Hugh Wease, John Ellen and Kenneth Wilburn, History, presented requests to change HIST 4200 to 3200, 4440 to 3440, 4430 to 3450, 4480 to 3480, 4481 to 3481, 4487 to 3487, 4420 to 3505, 4620 to 3620, 4630 to 3630, 4670 to 3670, 4210 to 5210, 4490 to 5670; change number and title fo 3510 to 3810 (History of Africa); add HIST 5660. Imperialism in Theory and practice, 1800 to the Present. It was also requested tht corresponding course numbers be changed in the European Studies Minor, BA, BS, BS Prof in German, Asian Studies Minor, African Studies Minor, Historical preservation and Museum Administration Minor. After minor editorial chantes, Shea moved and approval as amended, Yount seconded. The motion passed.

Professor Will Ambrose, Biology, presented a request to add BIOL 5270. Marine Community Ecology. O'Rear moved acceptance as amended, Shea seconded. The motion passed.

Grossnickle moved to bank DRED 3210, 3211; remove from course bank ITAL 1002 and ENGL 5420; Shea seconded. The motion passed.

Vice Chancellor Bloodworth and Dean Bailey met with the Committee to discuss proposed "second major" requirements. As a result of these discussions Cain moved the Committee consider the concept of "second majors" including guidelines for their development; Wilentz seconded. The motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 4:10 p.m.

HIST 3200. Diplomatic History of the United States (3) (formerly HIST 4200)

American diplomatic history from 1776 to the present with emphasis on major episodes, policies, and personalities.

HIST 3440. History of Modern France (3) (formerly HIST 4440)

The development of Modern France from 1589 to the present. Emphasis will be placed on the internal History of France.

HIST 3450. History of Modern Germany (3) (formerly HIST 4430)

An examination of the political, social, economic, and cultural evolution of the German nation over the past three hundred years, with special emphasis on the rise of Nazism and the issue of the German role in the two World Wars.

HIST 3480. History of England to 1603 (3) (formerly HIST 4480)

The political, social, and economic development of England from the Roman conquest to the death of Elizabeth I.

HIST 3481. History of Modern Britain Since 1603 (3) (formerly HIST 4481)

Political, social, and economic development of the British people from 1603 to the present.

HIST 3487. Constitutional History of England (3) (formerly HIST 4487)

The evolution of the English government and its institutions from Anglo-Saxon times to the present.

HIST 3550. History of Russia to 1917 (3) (formerly HIST 4420)

The rise of the Russian state from the migration of the Slavic tribes to the formation of the Soviet Union with attention to the land and peoples as well as the government and policy.

PAGE 116, add:

HIST 3620. History of Modern Japan (3) (formerly HIST 4620)

An analysis of the transformation of Japanese culture under the influence of the West, with particular attention given to the causes and consequences of modernization.

HIST 3630. History of Modern China (3) (formerly HIST 4630)

An analysis of the factors responsible for the collapse of China's traditional Confucian culture and the triumph of Communism. Particular attention will be given to the role of the West in this revolutionary transformation.

HIST 3670. History of the Middle East (3) (formerly HIST 4670)

A comparative survey of the people, the land, and the religious groups of the Middle East. Particular emphasis will be given to Islam and imperialism.

HIST 3810. History of Africa (3) (formerly HIST 3510)

A survey of Africa, which emphasizes precolonial African societies, interactions between African societies and Europeans during the colonial era, and the African quest for independence.

HIST 5210. History of American Urban Life (3) (formerly HIST 4210)

A historical assessment of the importance of the American city in United States history.

HIST 5660. Imperialism in Theory and Practice, 1800 to the Present (3)

European expansion, primarily in Africa and Asia, will be examined from theoretical and empirical perspectives. Political, economic, social and non-European origins of imperialism will be analyzed.

HIST 5670. Diplomatic History of Europe, 1815 to the Present (3) (formerly HIST 4490)

A survey of the international relations of the Great European Powers from 1815 to the present.
