WHEREAS, that same committee recommends that steps be taken immediately to develop a university-wide program in Writing Across the Curriculum in cooperation with the office of the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Senate likewise recommend to the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs the appointment of a Task Force, as outlined in the Final Report of the Faculty Senate Ad Hoc Committee on Writing Across the Curriculum, to work with the Vice Chancellor's office in developing a program in Writing Across the Curriculum by following the Timetable recommended in the Final Report.


