The minutes of 3/29/90 and 4/5/90 were approved. The minutes of 3/22/90 were approved as corrected (corrections are included in catalog copy).

Professor L.H. Zincone requested that the admission requirements to the School of Business be revised to require a grade of "C" or better in each of the seven courses: ACCT 2401, ECON 2113, 2133, FINA 2244, DSCI 2223, MATH 1065, 2283. The rationale for the request was that students would perform better in upper division courses and that those not qualified would make an earlier decision to major in something other than Business. Richards moved acceptance as amended. The motion passed.

Professors John Lutz and Rand Evans requested approved for PSYC 1000 (3 s.h.) (Introductory Psychology) as the preferred introductory psychology course. It is expected that PSYC 1000 will be phased in gradually and that PSYC 1050, 1051 will be phased out gradually. This request will change the Psychology major and minor. Coulter moved acceptance as amended. The motion passed.

Professor Charles Moore requested approval of MUSC 1627, 1637, 1647 (Italian, French, German Lyric Diction for Singers, respectively). A memo from Professor Schwarz indicated that Foreign Language was no longer able to offer the 1050 course on a regular basis because of a shortage of faculty. Changed 5616 (Historical Development of Solo Vocal Lit.) from 2 to 3 s.h.; changed prerequisites. These requests change the B. of Music in Voice Pedagogy and Voice Performance. Shea moved acceptance. The motion passed.

Professors Ted Gartman and Linner Griffin requested approval of SOCW 4350 (Social Work Research Methods) and a revision of the BS in Social Work. Wilentz moved acceptance as amended. The motion passed.

Grossnickle moved to place the following courses in the Curriculum Bank: PSYC 5355; BIOL 2140, 2150, 2141, 2151, 2260, 2261; MKTG 4882; AMID 5337, 5388; PHYE 1138, 1150, 1151, 1152; FINA 4584. The motion passed.

In Committee business, Martha Lapas was elected Secretary.
